Operational costs, consisting of both direct operating costs and administration expenses for each of the four fiscal years, 1944-45 to 1947-48, expressed as a percentage of gross


III—Special Projects:

In accordance with Section 18 of The Surplus Crown Assets Act, the directors of War Assets Corporation submit herewith the Fourth Annual Report of the operations of the Corpor-

ation, together with balance sheet and statement of accounts, as audited by the Auditor-General of Canada covering the fiscal year ended March 31, 1948.

PART I - REVIEW OF THE YEAR

Consistent with the reduced number of declarations received, the Corporation, during the fiscal year, progressively adjusted the scope and nature of its operations and its organizational set-up to meet the changing conditions.

In all the previous years of its existence the tonnage of materials received in the Corporation's warehouses exceeded the tonnage shipped, but during the last fiscal year the trend was reversed, and outward shipments exceeded the receipts.

Declarations of surplus are still being received from Government departments, but in greatly reduced numbers and values.

War Assets Corporation has maintained its policy of selling by equitable distribution, and all sections of the wholesale buying public have had opportunities to purchase available surpluses. Now, in order to allow speedy liquidation of remaining stocks, consistent with costs of maintaining establishments to house the surpluses, it is considered advisable and necessary to revise previous distribution policies, and dispose of larger quantities in lot sales to single purchasers.

Aid to Reconversion

In generally following the policies and procedures which had been in force during previous fiscal years, the Corporation continued to contribute materially to the national reconversion from wartime to peacetime economy. Although the total value of sales was lower than in 1946-47, the classes and kinds of surplus available were of types in great demand to enable manufacturers to proceed with normal commercial programmes. It is considered advisable in this report to bring up to date the particulars published in previous reports showing the principal aids to reconversion resulting from the Corporation's surplus disposal:

- (a) Approximate number of establishments sold for industrial purposes by War Assets Corporation to March 31, 1948 (not including buildings specifically sold for removal). 117

- (b) Approximate total floor space included in these 117 establishments, sq. ft. 12,000,000
- (c) Gross sales made by War Assets Corporation of machine tools and production equipment to March 31, 1948. \$35,760,220

Numerous materials in short supply were also disposed of, such as ferrous and non-ferrous metals, textiles and motor trucks. Metal scrap also was sold in considerable quantities, materially aiding the steel and other metal producers and processors.

Through co-operation with the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, this Corporation's demolition programme at former military camps, started in the previous year, was continued, but with increased activity. Camps were selected strategically so as to assist the areas in which housing needs were most acute and supplies of building materials were shortest. This programme, now completed, contributed greatly to progress in housing construction by alleviating the shortage of new materials.

Cost of Sales

With the diminishing returns to the Corporation as dollar volume disposals decreased, it was necessary to keep a strict watch on the cost of sales. This is more fully dealt with under the various operating headings.

Few big individual sales remained to be completed, the main problem being to sell the miscellaneous surpluses accruing from smaller operations. As much, and sometimes more, effort is needed to sell a small piece of production equipment than to sell a ship or an industrial plant, and practically the same documentation is needed in both instances. Thus the cost of sales increases, and this point has had much consideration by officers of the Corporation.

It is essential that cost of sales be kept within reasonable limits, and this has been accomplished largely by simplifications, reductions in staff, and by changing selling methods.

These matters are constantly under review as a means of anticipating the lessening volume of surplus for disposal and of keeping the cost of sales in proper ratio with that volume.

During the 1946-47 fiscal year, the average value per invoice was \$1,763.04, but in the 1947-48 fiscal year the average invoice value dropped to \$647.14.

Comparable expense figures serve as a basis for regulating the size of our staff and the scope of our operations to keep expenses in line with sales receipts and to prepare for the volume of future disposals.

Informing the Public

As in previous years, the policy has been to keep the public as fully informed as possible of the operations of the Corporation. All sales of major interest have been made public, and advertising in newspapers and commercial journals has been intensified. Such advertising is the only method by which prospective buyers may obtain details of material available, as the publication of lists of specific surpluses is not feasible.

Organization

For most of the fiscal year the Corporation continued the methods and organization previously used. At the beginning of the 1948 calendar year, however, a general review was made of existing conditions, and because of the reduced volume of business the Corporation was expected to do in the coming year, the necessity for a further general reduction in staff and operating activities was indicated.

PART II - OPERATIONS - SUPPLY DEPARTMENT

The work of the Supply Department was reduced substantially each month throughout the year and staff was reduced progressively as work was completed. From January 1, 1948, the Supply Department has operated under the direction of the Supply Manager.

Operations continued to be decentralized under five Regional Offices but there has been an amalgamation of Divisions both at Head Office and in the Regions.

On April 1, 1947, personnel employed by the Supply Department numbered 6,198, plus 1,116 security guards, making a total of 7,314 employees. These employees were reduced each month until at March 31, 1948, the total personnel amounted to 1,873, plus 310 security

The positions of Vice-President in Charge of Merchandising and Vice-President in Charge of Supply were discontinued, and these two departments placed in the hands respectively of the Director of Merchandising and the Supply Manager.

Regional sales territories were abolished, allowing for the discontinuance of Regional Sales Managers and their establishments, and sales activities in the field became the complete responsibility of the Branch Sales Managers.

Pricing and distribution were decentralized to a large extent into Branch Sales Offices, and availability reports (the inventory documents from which all sales are made) were localized in the particular areas in which the surpluses originated. Details and this and other changes will be found in Part III of this report.

From a maximum of 51 warehouses operated during the 1946-47 fiscal year, by sales action the number of warehouses was reduced to 19 by January, 1948, and by the end of the fiscal year under review 12 warehouses were in operation. Continuing operations after March 31, 1948, will require nine warehouses strategically placed, so that all provinces may benefit from the stocks remaining to be sold. These nine warehouses represent approximately 1,500,000 square feet of floor space.

Clearances by locations other than warehouses are well advanced, more than 80 per cent of all such locations having been cleared to date. This is subject to some variation, however, as declarations involving new locations are still being received from various government departments and agencies.

The Supply Department, the Department responsible for clearing, screening and making surpluses ready for sales action, has materially reduced its activities and personnel, showing a staff reduction of 72% from the peak in January, 1947. More details of this development are given in Part II.

guards, making a total of 2,183 employees. This represents a reduction of 5,131 employees during the year.

At Head Office the staff is organized in six Divisions, namely: Procurement, Plant Clearance, Traffic, Security, Expense Control and Surplus Property.

Procurement Division

The Procurement Division is under the direction of a supervisor and receives all declarations of surplus from Government departments and private contractors holding Crown-owned surpluses. There has been a substantial reduction in the number of declarations received by the Corporation as evidenced by the following:

Plant Clearance Division

This Division operates under the direction of a supervisor and is responsible for checking all declarations physically before giving receipts to custodians and reporting surpluses to the Merchandising Department as being available for disposal. Surpluses are either sold from the custodian's location and shipped by Plant Clearance against sales orders or are shipped by Plant Clearance Division to our warehouses,

As of April 1, 1947, there were 2,550 locations where surpluses had been reported and were awaiting clearance action. During the year declarations of surplus were received from an additional 594 locations and as of March 31,

1948, there are only 723 locations remaining to be cleared.

Of a total number of 44,399 declarations sent to the appropriate field officers for clearance action, 41,285 have been completed and 3,114 remain in the field for further clearance action. This means that 93% of the declarations passed to Plant Clearance Division have been completed.

Warehousing Division

There has been a substantial reduction in our warehousing operations during the year. As of April 1, 1947, the Corporation operated 51 warehouses with a total area of 6,251,565 square feet, requiring 2,511 employees.

On March 31, 1948, the number of operating warehouses was reduced to 12, having a total occupied area of 2,378,928 square feet and requiring 548 employees.

Traffic Division

This Division issues all directions for packing and shipping on both incoming and outgoing shipments, receives and distributes custodian copies of sales orders and, where necessary, expedites shipments. It is responsible for checking and approving all freight bills.

Security Division

The Corporation obtains security guards from the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires. These guards are responsible for security of properties, fire prevention and first aid in case of minor accidents.

With the reduction in the number of locations requiring security it has been possible to eliminate regional security inspectors in all regions, and their duties have been assumed by the Regional supply managers with field inspection being carried out by the Royal

and does not include outside space in which warehouses are situated, nor does it include motor vehicle compounds where vehicles are stored outside.

There appears below a table showing the number of warehouses operated in each region, the total number of square feet occupied as of March 31, 1948, and the total number of personnel employed as of March 31, 1948. The figures given for tonnage received, tonnage shipped and sales orders handled are for all Warehouse operations during the fiscal year.:

Canadian Mounted Police who submit regular reports to the Director of Security at Ottawa.

Expense Control Division

This Division reviews all expense claims for which the Supply Department is responsible. Accounts requiring Head Office approval are carefully investigated and this division recommends their payment when satisfied that the charges are valid.

Surplus Property Division

This Division is responsible for assuming custody of surplus properties declared to the Corporation and reporting their condition to the Lands and Buildings Department for sale. Substantial progress has been made in the disposition of surplus land and buildings and, as at March 31, 1948, the number of locations where land and buildings were held by the Corporations was as follows:

During the year the Corporation continued to demolish certain buildings in order to make available to the building trades building materials such as lumber, plumbing and electrical supplies and other building fixtures.

Demolition was completed at 25 sites across Canada and substantial quantities of building materials were made available, particularly to Central Mortgage & Housing Corporation, its subsidiaries and its integrated contractors.

Reclamation Division

The work of repairing and reclaiming surplus clothing at the Reclamation Depot at Valleyfield, P.Q., was discontinued in July, 1947.

Surplus clothing continued to be carefully sorted, inspected and reported in various categories, but clothing requiring to be repaired was reported in that condition, segregated into those items which required minor repairs and those items which required major repairs.

In February, 1948, it was decided to discontinue shipping any further quantities of clothing into Valleyfield. All items already at Valleyfield were reported to Merchandising Department for sale and a small residue was held awaiting sale. It is intended that this property will not be used by the Corporation as soon as its present contents have been sold and delivered.

Maritime Region

As of February 1, 1948, this region was administered by a Regional Supply Supervisor with two assistants. All declaring Government departments were advised that as of March 31, 1948, we would discontinue field inspection and they would be required to deliver their moveable surpluses either to Warehouse No. 41 at Debert, N.S., or to Warehouse No. 51 at Scoudouc, N.B.

Quebec Region

As of March 1, 1948, the Assistant Supply Manager assumed responsibility for the direction of Quebec Regional Supply Department in addition to his other duties. He is assisted by a Regional Supply Supervisor and three assistants. Substantial progress has been made in all Supply Department operations in this region and staff is now being reduced rapidly.

Ontario Region

This region continues to be administered by a Regional Supply Manager with four assistants. Very substantial progress has been made in dealing with surpluses but as yet no change has been made in our method of operating.

Prairie Region

This region is administered by a Regional Supply Supervisor with one assistant. November 1, 1947, we discontinued field inspection of any surpluses declared to us after that date. Government departments have been required to deliver their surpluses either to Warehouse No. 33 at Winnipeg, Man., or to Warehouse No. 46 at Moose Jaw, Sask. The warehouses have been reduced in size substantially and all Supply Department staff has been reduced progressively as work diminished.

Western Region

This region continues to be administered by a Regional Supply Manager with two assistants. Government departments have been advised that declarations received after March 31, 1948, must be delivered to our warehouses at Warehouse No. 31, Shepard, Alta.; Warehouse No. 36, Sea Island, Vancouver, B.C., or Warehouse No. 54, Colwood, B.C.

Supply Department operations on the Alaska Highway were discontinued for the months of November to March inclusive. Before discontinuing operations all surpluses had been disposed of with the exception of surpluses delivered to our MacRae Warehouse at White Horse, Y.T., and a few accumulations of drums at oil dumps, etc.

PART III - OPERATIONS - MERCHANDISING DEPARTMENT

GENERAL

During the fiscal year under review, of the Corporation's total sales of \$74,046,219, this department was responsible for \$63,426,339.

By careful observance of policies and procedures, in force since the beginning of operations or adopted during the previous fiscal

year, it is felt that we have continued to contribute substantially to the national economy without apparent disturbance to business or industry. Every effort is being continued to expedite the disposal of outstanding or new surpluses so that advantage may be taken of the prevailing market.

PRICING & DISTRIBUTION DIVISION

The Merchandising Department continues to function in two main groups: (a) Pricing and Distribution, and (b) Sales, with the addition of a Manufacturers' Sales Division, formed September, 1947, to supervise sales to manufacturers with whom we have agreements to purchase material of their own manufacture. This action was deemed preferable to previous procedure under which dealings with manufacturers were conducted by Branch Sales Offices.

In the last Annual Report, the responsibilities of the Pricing and Distribution Division were outlined. While their functions remain basically unchanged, the scope of their activities has progressively diminished throughout the year. In view of the decline in the volume of standard types of material declared, pricing at Head Office was discontinued as of September 1, 1947, and commodities were offered to the public on a bid basis, but still in accordance with the previous practice of channeling surpluses through the trade wherever possible.

While the sales personnel in the branches

were considered to have acquired adequate experience from which to judge fair prices in this type of selling, a guide price list was prepared and distributed among all sales centres for reference.

Pricing is continued, of course, on such items as are still nationally distributed, material disposed of through Manufacturers' Sales Division and the Special Sales Division, custodian's equipment and commodities of a special nature.

The progressive decline in the volume of standard material reported surplus has considerably reduced national distribution, and only such items of staple goods as are of interest to the nation-wide public continue to be so distributed. It was found that with few exceptions, distribution of non-standard materials was uneconomical and contributed to considerable delay in disposal. Despite the necessity for such departure from extensive distribution, the accompanying chart reveals adequate achievement in this regard insofar as applicable materials were concerned. (See page 11.)

SALES DIVISION

Domestic Sales

While the sales organization still retains five major geographic regions to define areas of branch activity, the reduction in the volume of work by progressive disposal and complete clearance of certain locations enabled us to discontinue Regional sales office control as of January, 1948, and has further allowed discontinuance of certain sub-branches and relegated some branches to sub-branch status.

Despite the decrease in the number of large individual sales and the increase of work in connection with the greater volume of small sales, increased efficiency has continued to permit reduction of personnel commensurate with the volume of goods left for disposal, and at the same time, maintain dollar sales volume at the best rate the market will produce.

Concentrated efforts are now being made to complete sales clearance of smaller locations

in conformity with inter-departmental policy of effecting the utmost economy in over-all operations.

The previous Annual Report refers to warehouse lot sales, of which eight were conducted from January to July, 1947, at various points from coast to coast under the supervision of warehouse sales teams directed from Head Office. While this type of selling was effective, the experience acquired resulted in abandonment of such sales in favour of placing sales staffs in warehouses wherever they were convenient to the public, and where the public could inspect representative stocks in sample rooms. This system has proven most practical insofar as the public is concerned, and had undoubtedly added impetus to the rate of disposal.

Effective February, 1948, the procedure of routing all availability reports from the Supply Department through Pre-Edit Division at

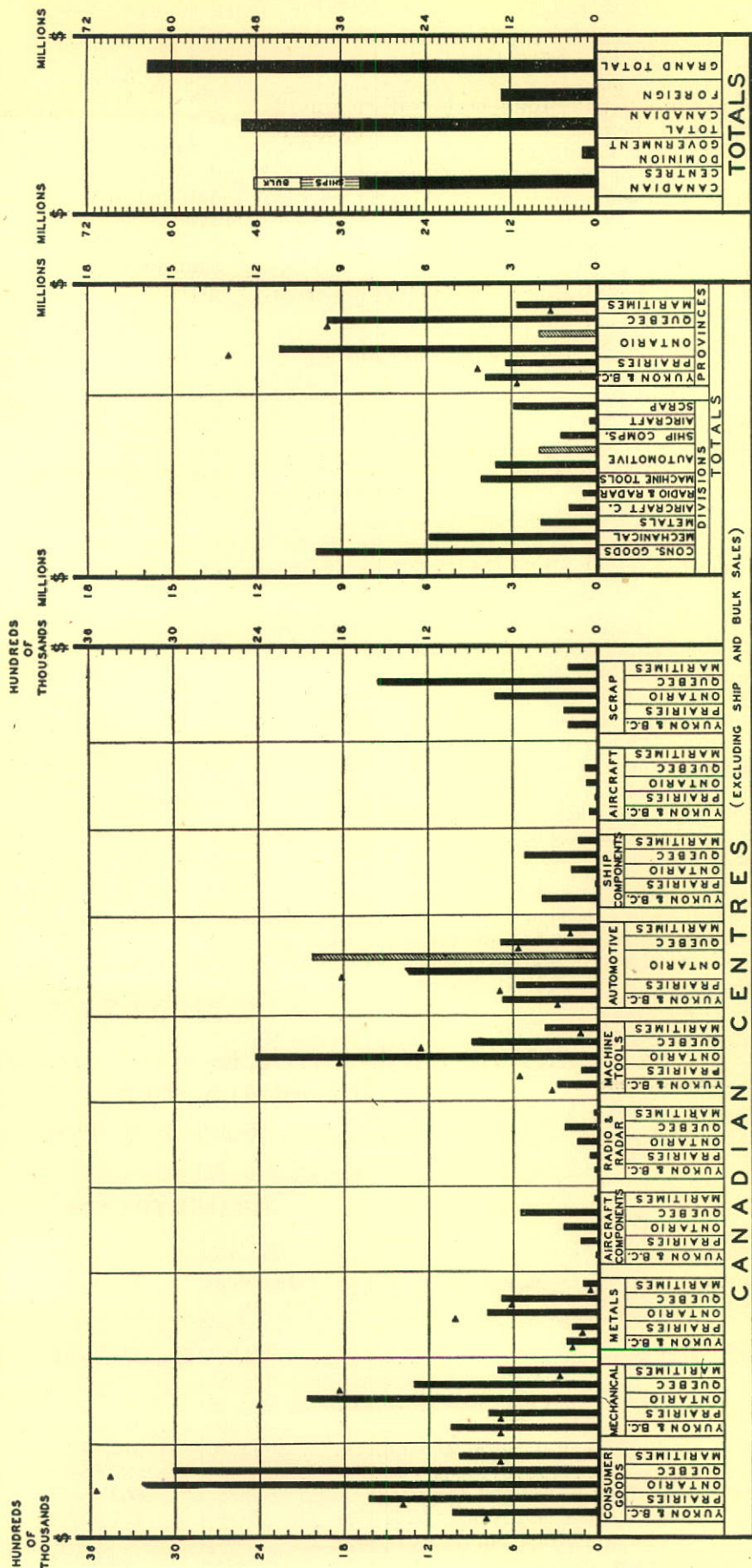
FISCAL YEAR APRIL 1, 1947 TO MARCH 31, 1948

Head Office to Sales Branches was discontinued and (with the exception of availability reports covering certain materials aforementioned in the review of Pricing and Distribution, together with whole aircraft and ships referred to Direct Sales Divisions) all availability reports are now routed direct to the Sales Branches by the Supply Department, tending further to expedite disposal after materials are reported surplus.

The volume of non-standard and single purpose surpluses handled throughout the year appeared in many cases to contain potential material for scrap use only, however, intensified and improved advertising procedure has been successful in moving a great deal of this material, and has enabled us, so far, to avoid sales as scrap to the extent anticipated.

Export Sales

The Export Sales Division continued to contribute materially to the year's total by \$13,065,342 in sales. While this is a definite drop from the previous year, it can be accounted for by the fact that last year's totals were extensively comprised of sales of surpluses overseas, which are now largely liquidated, also that most commodities now required by the foreign trade have been disposed of, and remaining surpluses not required on the domestic market are of little interest to buyers for export.

Because of this decrease in activity, the Export Sales Division has been incorporated as a section of the Special Sales Division to continue the function of export selling and comply with our over-all programme of consolidation.

Special Sections

Market Research and Statistics: The decline in the volume of materials destined for national distribution reduced to a considerable extent the necessity for market research; however, together with the Statistics Section, it continues to perform this function when required.

Procedures and Directives Division: This section still continues its work of regularizing and correlating merchandising procedures and directives necessitated by changing market conditions and the need for orderly consolidation of services, in keeping with the decreasing volume of activity.

Advertising: Continued and expanded effort has been expended by the Advertising Section on behalf of Merchandising, in an endeavour to keep lists of available surpluses before the public and to explore every possible avenue of disposal.

Personnel: The number of employees on the strength of the Merchandising Department as of March 31, 1948, shows a decrease of 774 from the figure at the end of the previous fiscal year. While this reduction has been effected in keeping with the over-all decrease in the value of surplus being handled, it must be borne in mind that although there was a decrease in the dollar value of the average sale, the number of sales effected in 1947-48 remained almost as high as in the previous year.

The Merchandising Department's percentage of total personnel employed by the Corporation now stands at 22 per cent.

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PART IV - OPERATIONS - LANDS & BUILDINGS DEP'T

Organization

For the fiscal year ended March 31, 1948, the organization of the Lands and Buildings Department has continued to operate under the same general pattern as was outlined in the second annual report of the Corporation for the year ending March 31, 1946, and which was continued during the year preceding the one under review. Due to the fact that the policies and procedures then established have functioned successfully in our disposal operations, it has not been felt necessary to call any regular meetings of the Real Estate Advisory Committee, although this group remains operative and is at our disposal if required.

Policies

The policies and procedures previously adopted, and above referred to, remain in operation without substantial change and are considered to have enabled us to preserve a consistency in disposal operations, which has provided for the sale of our surplus lands and buildings to the best financial advantage, while at the same time putting them to good use in the interests of employment, housing, education, institutional purposes and industry.

Volume of Sales

Sales for the broken period July 12, 1944, to March 31, 1945, and for fiscal year ended March 31, 1946, 1947 and 1948, respectively, are given below:

It will be observed that the dollar volume of sales is considerably less than in the previous fiscal year. The volume of individual transactions, however, has been maintained at a high level and there has been no appreciable diminution of the work in certain of the divisions of the department in this respect. For example, the work has actually increased in regard to the negotiation of lease settlements and site restorations.

Multiple Tenancies

During the year no new multiple tenancy projects were initiated, but at 9500 St. Lawrence Boulevard space formerly occupied by War Assets Corporation and the Vocational

Training Branch of the Department of Labour was vacated and added to multiple tenancy operations. As a result of this added area there is now under lease at the three properties (two in Montreal and one in Toronto) a net floor area of about 1,074,147 square feet, having 84 tenancies and giving employment to approximately 3,650 people.

Recently negotiations have been under way for the sale of these properties and it is hoped that disposal of one or more will be completed shortly.

Progress of Disposal Operations

Reference was made in last year's report to demolition operations being carried on by the Corporation of certain camp buildings on behalf of Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation. This work has been completed and normal routing of surplus declarations has again been instituted. The same methods which have prevailed since the latter part of 1945 have been followed, and these have been found adequate in the maintenance of a steady flow of normal disposal operations.

Industrial Buildings

Generally speaking, the number of industrial buildings unsold at the close of the year consisted of the three multiple tenancy buildings, warehouses or manufacturing buildings still used by the Corporation for storage or the Vocational Training Branch of the Department of Labour, one plant at Dartmouth, N.S., and one at New Westminster, B.C. The Dartmouth plant was under lease to the Province of Nova Scotia and negotiations were proceeding with the Municipality for the sale of the New Westminster property. It can, therefore, be assumed that the liquidation of this part of the Department's activities is rapidly drawing to a close.

Camps and Aerodromes

Although in lesser volume, the receipt by the Corporation of surplus declarations of this type have been maintained in considerable volume throughout the year.

Provincial governments and municipalities have continued to absorb a fair percentage of these surpluses, particularly in the Prairie Provinces.

Hangars and drill halls continued to be in good demand and short supply, the former being still used in many cases for necessary storage of unsold aircraft or aircraft supplies. Drill halls were particularly in demand for community halls, recreation centres or curling rinks.

The director of the Veterans Land Act has purchased a few aerodromes for resale to veteran farmers, but this has lessened during the year as similar work in Alberta and Saskatchewan was undertaken by other authorities.

In one instance of the sale of a large camp, the municipality formed a citizens committee which in turn undertook the distribution of the camp buildings to veterans for home building at the same figure as that paid to the Corporation by the municipality under the special rate set for Provinces or Municipalities where the use was for housing, educational or institutional purposes.

The bulk of undisposed surplus buildings now lies in the extreme easterly and westerly provinces, where absorption is limited in relation to the extent of the surpluses available. For this reason we are now endeavouring to interest parties in other parts of the country as purchasers of a number of complete locations where no acceptable offers so far have been submitted. This is in line with the method of disposal used in Newfoundland where the usual formulas had failed to produce sales and which are further referred to below.

U.S. Properties in Canada

So far as is presently indicated, all former surplus United States properties in Canada have been acquired by the Dominion. In the more accessible areas these have in the main been resold. A sale of the remaining large buildings at Prince Rupert had been arranged but was not completed. Further negotiations are pending.

Steady selling of surplus buildings along the Alaska Highway has been continuing, but is

necessarily slow as the season is short, distances long, and buyers limited in number.

Newfoundland Disposal

Disposal of lands and buildings in Newfoundland has been practically completed, the only properties left consisting of one parcel of Dominion-owned land with building reserved by the Department of National Defence, and one or two small buildings of minor value.

General

Since commencement of the operations of the Corporation, this Department has dealt in whole or in part with about 2,500 declarations of property in which the Crown had an interest. In the past year disposals have effected about 1,124 of these declarations.

In addition to actual selling, operations cover lease settlements, lease terminations, new leasing, restoration of sites, easements and servitudes and a host of other detail. The paper work involved in all these operations is considerable, and meticulous care is necessary, as otherwise confusion and possible litigation may result.

During the last few months a division of this Department has been formed which is reviewing all files in rotation since the beginning of operations to ensure complete and accurate documentation. When this work is completed each file will have incorporated in it a comprehensive case history, providing thereby a complete synopsis of disposal of each surplus referred to the Lands and Buildings Department.

PART V-ORGANIZATION AND PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

Staff Figures

A peak staff of 10,371 was reached in January, 1947, and a steady decline had set in by the beginning of the fiscal year under review. The rate of decline was fairly steady all through the year, averaging about 500 a month. The quarterly figures are as follows:

The staff reductions were generally uniform throughout the departments and areas of operation.

At the beginning of the year 64% of the staff on direct payroll (that is, excluding guards) were in the monthly-rated occupational classification, and 36% were hourly-rated tradesmen and semi-skilled and unskilled labour. At the end of the year 83% were monthly-rated and 17% were hourly-rated.

Of the male staff, 65% are veterans of one or both of the wars and if the guards are included (all of whom are ex-service men) the percentage is raised to 70.

Personnel Services Division

No major changes were necessary in the framework of job levels and standard occupational classifications, nor was it necessary to make more than a few minor alterations in the salary and wage schedules. Numerous organizational surveys were made.

Because of the high rate of turnover inherent in a temporary organization, and despite the over-all reduction in staff and emphasis on filling vacancies from within wherever possible, some 2,400 new employees were recruited. The number of separations reviewed was about 8,000.

The policy governing separation required frequent consideration and amplification to cover the many complications which developed with the lay-off of large numbers of employees.

The welfare programme was maintained and included the administration of Workmen's Compensation, the provision of full-time qualified nursing service at Montreal and Valleyfield and personal counselling.

Administrative Services Division

The Division co-ordinated the efforts of all departments to consolidate office space, and during the year the number of locations rented for this purpose was reduced from 30 to 8. All regional offices are now housed in Crown-owned buildings.

By the end of the year the cost of purchases of printing and stationery was reduced to a small fraction of the monthly average in the previous year, partly because a greater proportion of the Corporation's requirements of printed forms are met by production in the printing section. Every possible effort is being made to minimize the inventories of printing and stationery.

Attention is also being given to economies in the use of communications.

Field Offices Division

Regional personnel representatives at Halifax, Toronto, Winnipeg and Vancouver and the manager of the Ottawa Division perform all functions of the department except approval of rates of pay and purchasing of printing and stationery. The personnel office at the Reclamation Depot in Valleyfield was closed in August.

The staff in these field offices totalled 160 at the beginning of the year and 50 at the end of the year.

Staff of Organization and Personnel Department

In keeping with the over-all programme of reducing the costs of operation, the services provided by the department have been vigorously curtailed, which has permitted of consolidation of staff as follows:

PART VI - COMPTROLLER'S DEPARTMENT

The fiscal year of the Corporation ended March 31, 1948, witnessed a diminishing volume of operations which permitted the Comptroller's Department to effect consolidation and reorganization of divisions with a view to economy of operation in its sphere.

The reduction in dollar value of the returns on sales for the year was not followed by a corresponding decrease in the number of invoices, vouchers, etc., processed, as compared with the previous year, but the trend was rather a lower dollar value per item and, because of the heavy volume of documentation which still had to be handled, this had the effect of retarding to some extent the implementing of economy policies in this department.

Existing procedures for the disposal of surplus assets were reviewed and a number of changes made with the object of facilitating the rapid movement of merchandise and the negotiation of sales "On the Spot" at warehouses.

Accounting Division

During the year, accounting offices at Charlottetown, Moncton, Quebec, London and

Regina were merged with more important offices within their respective regions, and the accounts of the Sales Branch at Ottawa were combined with those of the Ottawa Treasury Accounting Office. The recording of operations at St. John's, Newfoundland, was transferred to Head Office.

Accounting operations at the Valleyfield Reclamation Depot were discontinued at December 31, 1947, and the financial control of this office was transferred at that date to the Quebec Regional Accounting Office.

With the closing of a number of sales branches, it was found expedient to plan, as of April 1, 1948, for the elimination of the regional accounting offices, each one originally designed for the control of several branches, and return, insofar as accounting is concerned, to the system of organization which prevailed prior to April 1, 1946.

Branch accounting offices will now be in operation at Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg and Vancouver, and these offices will handle disbursement for administrative and operational expenses within the regions formerly

controlled from these points, as well as accounting for sales. A branch accounting office will continue in operation at Calgary for the recording of sales and collecting of accounts receivable only, and this office will be controlled by the Vancouver Branch Accounting Office. Operations at White Horse will be recorded at the Calgary Branch Accounting Office.

The numerous changes in the staff of the Corporation, consequent upon the rapid reduction of the personnel from the high figure of 10,371 in 1946-47 to 3,527 at March 31, 1948, necessitated the staffs in the payroll divisions to be maintained at a high level of establishment, and the complete mechanization of this section of the Department largely assisted in handling the heavy volume processed.

Audit Division

The General Audit staff has continued its operations and carried out the fullest possible review of the records of the Corporation and it has further extended the scope of its enquiries since the close of the last fiscal year.

In addition to the audit of the financial transactions of the Corporation, the records of

surplus Crown assets, and a portion of those maintained by the Merchandising Department, have been reviewed.

Formal reports of audit have been presented during the fiscal year as summarized in the following table:

In addition, 987 contracts have been analyzed and over 2,000 files of records of surplus Crown assets declared to the Corporation have been audited and certified.

Quarterly audits of financial records of Head Office, Regional Accounting Offices and Branch Accounting Offices have been conducted. All warehouses have been audited at least once and those which have been closed during the current fiscal year have been audited after closing to verify an accountability for the surplus stored therein.

The numbers of the General Audit staff have been reduced in the current fiscal year from 103 to 71, located as follows:

It will be noted that:

- (1) The total operations were conducted at a cost equal to 26.36% of the gross proceeds of sales viz., 16.92% plus 9.44%.
- (2) Because of the diminishing volume of sales during the year, the Corporation's administration expenses, although substantially lower than the previous year, were not covered by the 10% allowed as a deduction from net proceeds of sales. The expenses exceeded the allowance by 13.53%.
- (3) The net recovery, after allowing 10% of net proceeds of sales to cover the Corporation's administrative expenses, represents 74.77% of the gross price at which surplus assets were sold.

Reference should be made to part of the certificate of the Auditor General, reading as follows: "The procedures and practices of the Corporation were not of such a nature as to permit establishing by examination of records maintained that all assets received for disposal had been fully accounted for."

It is quite apparent that, unless operations of the Corporation both as regards the taking over of surplus and the sale of surplus are stopped for a considerable period (estimated to be two months), it is not possible to prepare an inventory without which inventory the Auditor General would not be in a position to delete the qualification noted above.

The Corporation feels that a stoppage of operations by the Corporation would be entirely unjustified, as the safeguards that have been instituted to protect the Crown-owned property in its custody are of such a nature that only minor losses of property are likely, and the necessity for accepting surplus so that the original custodian departments may demobilize their personnel or, alternatively, contractors may clear their plants and return to civilian production are of paramount importance.


