TO THE SHAREHOLDERS:

Your Directors present herewith the 28th Annual Report of your Company, together with a statement of Assets and Liabilities, Profit and Loss, and Surplus Account for the year ending March 31st, 1957, duly certified by the Auditors.

Net income for the year was \$256,391., equivalent to \$12.39 on the outstanding preferred shares and after allowing for the \$3.00 preferred dividend was \$2.77 on the common. This compares with \$235,111. for the previous year — \$11.36 on the preferred and \$2.47 on the common. Only dividends and interest actually earned have been considered as income. Net earnings on the common shares are now running at an estimated rate of \$2.80 per annum.

Regular dividends totalling \$3.00 were paid or declared on the 6 per cent, \$50.00 par preferred stock and dividends of \$2.50 were paid or declared on the common. Payment of these dividends required \$237,037. The balance \$19,354, was transferred to earned surplus, which now stands at \$313,232.

Individual shareholders residing in Canada were advised when computing their income tax for the year 1956 that they are entitled to:

(1) A depletion allowance equal to 10% of all preferred and common dividends received by them from this Company during the year,

and

(2) A tax credit of 20% of the net amount of such dividends.

Income on the Company's investments was higher. General and other expenses were little changed.

On the basis of prices current at the close of business March 31st, 1957, the market value of your Company's holdings showed an appreciation of \$2,828,065. over book value. After deducting the \$50.00 par value convertible preferred shares at \$57.62 (convertible share for share into common) the liquidating value of the common was \$57.62 as against \$68.20 at the end of the previous year.

We again report that with the exception of three items valued at \$54,400, which are regularly quoted by Investment Dealers, all of the Company's security holdings are listed and traded on the regular stock exchanges.

Operations over the fiscal years 1929-1957 will be of interest to our Shareholders.
