

The Forty-Second Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders of The Royal Bank of Canada was held in the Banking House in Montreal, on Thursday, 19th January, 1911, at eleven o'clock.

The chair was taken by the President, Mr. H. S. Holt, and Mr. C. E. Neill, Assistant General Manager, was appointed Secretary.

Messrs. C. R. Hosmer and A. Haig Sims were requested to act as Scrutineers.

FIFTH CENSUS OF THE DOMINION  
OF CANADA, 1st JUNE, 1911

Extract from the "Census and Statistics Act" (Part II, Census), Chap. 68, Revised Statutes, 1906:—

*Section 11.* A census of Canada shall be taken by the Office, under the direction of the Minister, on a date in the month of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, to be fixed by the Governor-in-Council, and every tenth year hereafter. *4-5 Edw. VII., c. 5, s. 8.*

*Section 14.* Each general census commencing with the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, shall be so taken as to ascertain with the utmost possible accuracy for the various territorial divisions of Canada,—

(a) their population and the classification thereof, as regards name, age, sex, colour, social condition, nationality, race, education, religion, occupation and otherwise, together with a record of all persons deceased within the census year;

(b) the houses for habitation, stores, warehouses, factories and other buildings therein, and their classification as occupied or vacant, under construction and otherwise;

(c) the occupied land therein, and its value, and the condition thereof as improved for cultivation, in fallow, in forest, unbroken prairie, marsh or waste land and otherwise;

(d) the products of factories, farms, fisheries, forests and mines therein, and other industries, with the values of all the said products and of the plant and real estate employed in the said industries, within the census year;

(e) the wage-earnings of the people thereof within the census year;

(f) the municipal, educational, charitable, penal and other institutions thereof;

and,

(g) whatsoever other matters are specified in the forms and instructions to be issued, as this Act provides. *4-5 E. VII., c. 5, s. 10.*

SCHEDULES TO BE USED IN TAKING CENSUS.

**1. Population by Name, etc. (41 Headings).** Name; address; sex; whether single, married, widow, etc.; date and country of birth; year of immigration; year of naturalization; nationality; religion; chief occupation; any other employment or occupation; whether employer, employee, or on own account; where employed, whether "on farm," "in mill," "store," etc.; number of weeks employed in 1910, and hours per week; total earnings in 1910; life, accident and health insurance and cost in 1911; if at school, number of months in 1910; whether can read and write; language commonly spoken; if over sixteen years old, cost of education in 1910; whether blind, deaf, lunatic, etc.

**2. Mortality, Disability, etc. (28 Headings).** (a) Mortality—Name; sex; single, married, etc.; date and country of birth; religion; occupation; month of death in census year; cause of death; place and name of physician. (b) Disability—Nature of injury; cause of accident; weeks of disability due to sickness or accident; loss of salary; voluntary allowance by employer; compensation by employer under Statute; compensation by insurance in census year.

**3. Houses, Buildings, Farm and Fruit Lands (51 Headings).** Owner, tenant or occupant; address; houses inhabited, vacant, in construction; barns, stables, business buildings, etc.; farm land occupied, owned, leased, improved, unimproved; acreage in marsh land; in pasture; orchard and nursery, vegetables, etc.; fruit trees (detailed), bearing or non-bearing; yield in 1910; grapes and small fruits; maple sugar and syrup in 1911; natural ice stored in winter 1910-11.

**4. Agriculture—Grain and other Field Crops (47 Headings).** Acreage, yield and value of fall wheat, spring wheat, barley, oats, rye, corn for husking, buckwheat, beans, peas, flax and mixed grains; also of hay and clover, alfalfa, corn for forage, other forage crops.

**5. Agriculture—Hoed Crops, Tobacco, Hops, etc.; Field Crop Areas, 1911 (51 Headings).** Acreage, yield and value of potatoes, turnips, beets, etc., also of tobacco, hops, grass and clover seeds; areas of grain and other field crops for the harvest year 1911.

**6. Agriculture—Animals and Animal Products (35 Headings).** Live Stock in 1911—horses, cows, sheep, swine, turkeys, geese, ducks, hens, hives of bees. Live stock sold in 1910—horses, cows, sheep, swine, poultry. Animal products in 1910—wool, milk, butter, cheese, cream, eggs, honey. Pure-bred animals registered, or eligible, in 1911—horses, cattle, sheep, swine.

**7. Farm and Urban Values, etc. (39 Headings).** Values in 1911 of lands, buildings, farm implements and machinery, and live stock. Live stock, nursery stock and dairy products sold in 1910; animals slaughtered on farm in 1910; other products of the farm; hired labor on farm in 1910.

**8. Forest Products in 1910 (53 Headings).** Measurement and value of timber,—ash, birch, elm, maple, oak, pine, etc.; logs for lumber,—elm, oak, pine, spruce, etc.; firewood, fence-posts, piling, railroad ties, telegraph poles, etc.; wood for pulp; furs and skins of forest animals, undressed.

9. **Manufactures, Ship and House Building** (*13 Headings*). (1) Capital employed in 1910 (2 questions). (2) Employees in 1910 (19 questions). (3) Power employed in Works—steam, gas, water, electric, etc. (9 questions). (4) Coal and other fuel used (7 questions). (5) Custom work and repairs in 1910, also raw materials (3 questions). (6) Class and value of articles made, or built, in 1910.

10. **Churches, Schools, Colleges, etc.** (*32 Headings*). Location of Church, School, etc. (*Place of Worship*) Denomination; seating capacity; number of communicants; value of edifice and land. (*Sunday School or Catechism*) Denomination; number of officers and teachers; of scholars; value of building and land. (*High, Public, Separate or Private School*) Kind of school; number of rooms; number of teachers; of pupils; value of buildings and land. (*College, University, etc.*) Kind or class; number of professors, lecturers, etc.; of students; value of buildings and land. (*Charitable, Penal and Other Institutions*) Kind or class; number of officers in charge; of other employees; of inmates; value of buildings and land. (*Wherever "officers," "pupils," "inmates," etc., are mentioned, whether male or female is to be stated.*)

11. **Fisheries** (*11 Headings*). Name of person, partnership, etc.; address; value of plant employed in 1910; number of persons employed; days service in 1910; wages in 1910; value of catch in 1910—fresh fish, fresh lobsters, shell fish, fur seals, hair seals.

12. **Butter and Cheese Factories** (*23 Headings*). Name of factory, owner, address; value of buildings, machinery and plant; number of patrons in 1910; days operated; number of pounds of cheese made in 1910; butter; condensed milk; selling value of cheese and butter at factory; amount of money distributed to patrons in 1910; number of persons employed; days of service in 1910; wages and salaries.

13. **Mining and Mineral Products** (*103 Headings*). (1) Particulars of Mines and Mining Works. (2) Employees—salaries and wages, 1910. (3) Capital and plant employed at mines, quarries, etc., 1910. (4) Products of mines and works, 1910. (5) Metallic ores and products. (6) Abrasive products. (7) Fuel and Light Materials. (8) Pigments. (9) Structural materials of stone and clay. F R E E L I S T

Among the more important articles on the FREE LIST are the following:—

1. ANIMALS, AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS, FISH AND PROVISIONS

Horses, cattle, sheep, etc., also domestic fowls, pigeons and pheasants for the improvement of stock; bees; tea and green coffee (imported from country of growth, or purchased in the U. K.); salt; Indian corn, not for distillation; rice, uncleaned; linseed oil cake; certain seeds, as annatto, beet, carrot, and aromatic seeds, not edible and in crude state; seed peas and seed beans, from the U. K.; certain plants for florist stock, also seedling stock; certain fruits, as bananas, pineapples, oranges and lemons; oyster seed and breeding for Canadian waters; live fish and fish eggs.

2. SUGAR, MOLASSES, AND MANUFACTURES THEREOF

Molasses, of not more than 56° by polariscope test.

3. TOBACCO, AND MANUFACTURES THEREOF

Tobacco, unmanufactured.

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**4. SPIRITS, WINES, AND OTHER BEVERAGES**

Lime juice, crude only; mineral waters, natural, not bottled; ice; ethyl alcohol for industrial use.

**5. PULP, PAPER AND BOOKS**

Books, scientific and religious, or for the blind; educational text books; any Government publications; newspapers and magazines, unbound; hemp paper for manufacture of shot, shells, and felt board for gun wads; plain basic photographic paper; matrix paper for use in printing (not being tissue paper).

**6. CHEMICALS, DRUGS, OILS AND PAINTS**

Non-edible seeds, beans, plants, barks, and woods in a crude state, and preparations thereof; chemical compounds for dyeing and tanning; indigo, aniline and coal tar dyes; certain drugs as roots, herbs, balsams, etc., in a crude state; medicinal roots; yaccine and vaccinia points; serum; various acids, salts and sulphates; cream of tartar, chloride of lime, nitrate of soda, phosphorus, etc.; potash and saltpetre; caustic soda; crude bromides; whale oil soap; lamp black, etc.; ultramarine blue and whitening; various gums; turpentine, raw or crude, also spirits of turpentine; gasoline under 725 specific gravity; various oils for use in manufacture; tungstic acid for manufacture of filaments for electric lamps; antimony salts for dyeing; hyposulphite of soda for leather tanning.

**7. EARTHS, EARTHENWARE AND STONWARE**

Gypsum, crude; sundry flint, and stones, rough; gravels, clays and sands; glass cut to size for photographic purposes; firebrick (not made in Canada); carbons over 6 ins. in circumference.

**8. METALS, AND MANUFACTURES THEREOF**

Ores of metals of all kinds; cobalt, quicksilver, radium; manganese, oxide of; tea lead; tin and zinc, in pigs, bars, plates, etc.; brass and copper, aluminum, gold and silver, all unmanufactured; platinum wire, and in bars, strips, etc.; chronometers and compasses for ships; copper rollers for calico printing; kilns and furnaces for ore smelting (not made in Canada); anchors for vessels; newspaper printing presses; car wheel tires of steel, in the rough; cream separators; certain mining machinery, also blast furnaces, retorts, etc.; surgical and dental instruments of metal; well drilling apparatus, (not made in Canada); brass cups, in rough, for cartridges; iron or steel masts, plates, cable chains, etc., for vessels; church bells, boiler plates; steel wire for manufacture of rope, or for ship's rigging; iron or steel rods for manufacture of chain; nickle, nickle silver and German silver; steel, or galvanized iron, wire; iron tubing, lacquered or brass covered, for manufacture of window extension rods; metallic elements for manufacture of metallic filaments for electric lamps; rolled iron and steel rods for manufacture of horse shoe nails; steel imported by rifle manufacturers for construction of rifles for the Dominion Government; gun barrels, in single tubes, forged and roughbored.

**9. WOOD, AND MANUFACTURES THEREOF**

Corkwood, unmanufactured; cane and rattans, not manufactured; saw dust of wood; shingles, logs and round timber, unmanufactured; firewood, fence posts and railway ties; Mexican saddle trees; barrel staves of oak, wheel spokes, planks and boards, in the rough.

**10. COTTON, FLAX, HEMP, JUTE AND OTHER FIBRES, AND SILK, WOOL, AND MANUFACTURES THEREOF**

Cloth for bookbinders; coir yarn; fibre Mexican, natural; hemp, oakum; jute or hemp yarn; linen yarn; binder twine; camel's hair; alpaca; certain jutes and wools; silk, raw or as reeled from the cocoon.

## 11. MISCELLANEOUS

Asphalt; asphaltum oil for paving; tar and pitch; anthracite coal and coke; hides and furs not dressed in any manner; rubber, unmanufactured; quills, natural; whalebone, unmanufactured; buckrum for hat shapes; hatter's furs, not on the skin; broom corn and bristles; fertilizers, unmanufactured; glycerine, for explosives; emery in bulk; meerschau, crude or raw; mother-of-pearl and other shells, unmanufactured; old junk; certain fish hooks and deep-sea fishing nets; artificial limbs, finished or in the rough; life saving apparatus; collections of coins, medals and stamps; lenses and shutters imported by manufacturers of cameras; prize trophies, bona fide; scientific instruments, charts, etc.; antiquities for libraries, etc.; models of inventions; botanical, mineralogical and taxidermic specimens; unset diamonds; settlers' effects; casual presents from friends abroad on which the duty, otherwise payable, does not exceed fifty cents.

## **\*PROPOSED RECIPROCAL TARIFF AGREEMENT BETWEEN CANADA AND UNITED STATES**

*Schedule A.—Principal articles to enter either country free of duty:—*

Live cattle, horses, swine, sheep, etc.; poultry, dead or alive. Wheat, rye, oats, barley, buckwheat; beans and peas. Potatoes, sweet corn, turnips, onions, cabbages, etc. Fresh fruits as apples, pears, peaches, grapes, etc. Dried apples, pears, apricots, etc. Butter; cheese; fresh milk, fresh cream; eggs; honey. Garden, field and other seeds. Hay; straw. Fish, all kinds, fresh, frozen, salted, etc.; oysters, lobsters, etc., canned or fresh; fish oils. Salt. Asbestos, crude or ground. Barbed wire fencing. Brass in bars, rods or sheets for use in Canadian manufactures. Carbon electrodes. Cream separators. Certain rolled iron rods in the coil, and certain rolled iron or steel plates; cast steel wire, and galvanized iron or steel wire. Typesetting and typesetting machines. Coke. Mineral waters, natural, not bottled. Timber, hewn or squared, not by sawing; boards, planks and other lumber, not further manufactured than sawn; railroad ties, telegraph poles, etc.; staves, pickets and palings.

*Schedule B.—Principal articles to enter either country at identical rates, the majority of such common rates being reductions on rates current:—*

Meats, fresh, salted, canned, etc.; meat extracts. Tallow, lard and compounds. Canned vegetables. Wheat flour, rye flour, oatmeal, pearly barley, corn meal; prepared cereal foods; bran. Macaroni; vermicelli. Biscuits, wafers, cakes, etc. Maple sugar, maple syrup. Certain canned fruits. Pickles, sauces, catsups. Fruit juices, non-alcoholic. Sardines. Farm wagons, ploughs, harrows, harvesters, reapers, mowers, horse rakes, threshing machines, hay loaders, potato diggers, feed cutters, grain crushers, weeders, etc.; farm and field rollers; portable engines for farm purposes; windmills. Household cutlery and pocket-knives. Bells and gongs. Plumbing fixtures of earthenware. Brass band instruments. Building or monumental stone of freestone, granite, sandstone, etc.; roofing slate; vitrified, and stone, paving blocks. Clocks, watches, etc., and parts of. Feathers in natural state. Antiseptic surgical dressings. Printing ink. Plate glass, not bevelled. Motor vehicles, not including rubber tires. Asbestos, manufactures of. Canoes and small boats of wood, not power boats. Grape vines, gooseberry and currant bushes. Mineral and aerated waters, bottled. Purses, pocketbooks, card cases, portfolios, etc., wholly or in chief of leather.

*Schedule C.—Principal articles to be admitted into the United States from Canada at special rates of duty:—*

Aluminum, crude, or in sheets, bars, etc. Laths; shingles; sawed boards, planks, deals and other lumber, whether finished on one side or both sides, tongued and grooved or not. Iron ore. Coal slack or culm, all kinds, passing through  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch screen.

*Schedule D.—Principal articles to be admitted into Canada from United States at special rates of duty:—*

Portland cement. Fruit trees. Condensed milk. Biscuits, unsweetened. Certain canned fruits. Coal, bituminous, round and run of mine, including bituminous coal passing through  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch screen.

*\*The above proposed agreement was introduced simultaneously in the Canadian House of Commons and the United States Congress on 28th January, 1911. It has not yet been approved by the legislature of either country.*

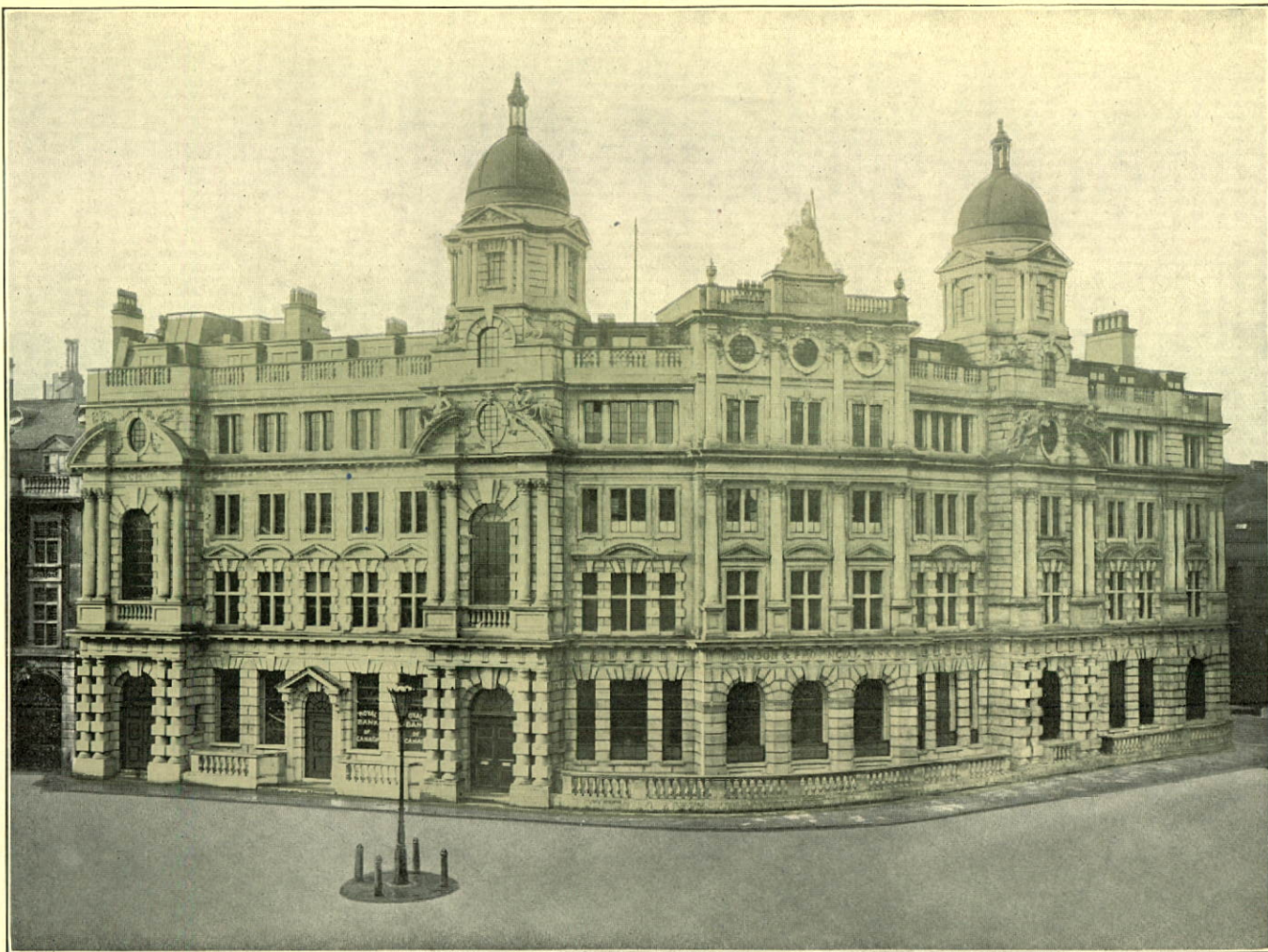

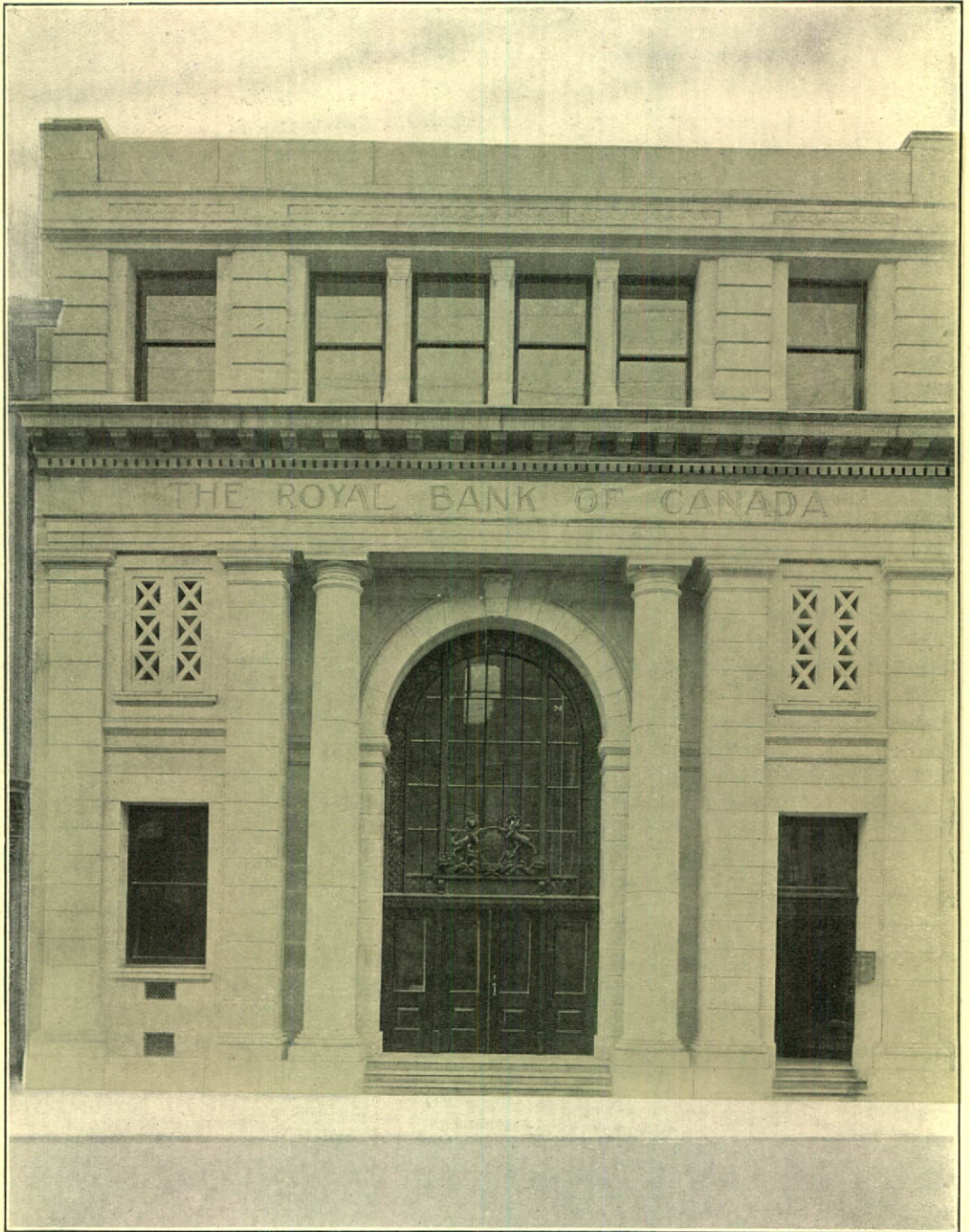
BANK BUILDINGS, PRINCES STREET, LONDON, E.C., ENGLAND
