The Statement presented shows a further growth in the business of the Bank, accompanied by a satisfactory increase in earnings. Your Directors have continued the policy adopted at the outbreak of the war, namely—to conduct the Bank's affairs with as little interruption as possible, at the same time bearing a full portion of the responsibilities attendant on war conditions.

In view of the gradual extension of the interests of the Bank, the Board consider it advisable to recommend to the Shareholders an increase in the number of Directors from eleven to thirteen, and the relative necessary By-laws will be submitted at this Meeting for your approval.

Your Directors with great regret make reference to the death of the Hon. J. J. Foy, K.C., who was for fifteen years a member of the Board and always keenly interested in the Bank's welfare. His place was filled by the appointment of Mr. A. T. Reid, a gentleman who possesses wide experience in commercial matters.

No new Branches were opened in 1916; the following were closed :

Substantial reductions in Bank Premises Account were made during the past 12 months through an appropriation from Profit and Loss Account and the sale of certain property unnecessary for the Bank's purposes—expenditures during the same period were unimportant.

The usual Inspections of the Head Office and Branches have been made, and the Auditors appointed by the Shareholders—Messrs. G. T. Clarkson and R. J. Dilworth—whose certificate is appended to the Balance Sheet, have completed their annual investigation of the affairs of the Bank.

COMMENTS OF THE GENERAL MANAGER, MR.  
C. A. BOGERT.

"A scrutiny of the Annual Statement of the Bank which is to-day presented to the Shareholders reveals some notable changes, all of which are of a favorable character. The net earnings, after the usual ample provisions have been made for expenditures and appropriations of every description, including allowances for advances of a doubtful nature as far as it is possible to ascertain them, and a substantial sum generously voted by your Board of Directors to provide a General Bonus to the Staff, amount to \$893,502—\$88,379 more than in the year 1915. This increase in earnings is almost wholly attributable to two causes: primarily—owing to the unprecedented crop in 1915 and the difficulties in obtaining ocean transportation our loans to dealers in products, ordinarily liquidated early in the year, were carried for a much longer period in 1916 than usual; secondly—the Dominion Bank participated from time to time, as its liquid resources permitted, in the various Government Issues that were made for the purpose of carrying on the war—the earning power was therefore exceptionally well employed throughout the whole of the period under review.

The Profit and Loss Account, you will observe, shows in detail the disbursements which were made, including a deduction for Dominion and Provincial Government taxation, the usual dividend at 12% per annum, contributions to various patriotic funds, to the Officers' Pension Fund, and an important appropriation of \$100,000 written off the Bank Premises Account—after which we were able to carry forward \$19,000, more than the total standing at credit of the account on the 2nd January, 1916.

Turning to the Bank's Liabilities, there is no change in the Capital and Reserve Accounts. The balance in Profit and Loss Account—\$363,442—is, as already mentioned, \$19,000 greater.

Notes in circulation at the close of the year amounted to \$7,118,232—\$2,123,000 more than at the end of 1915—a very large expansion; in fact, at one time during the Autumn, at the height of the grain moving period, the circulation reached \$7,645,841, which necessitated our augmenting our deposits in the Central Gold Reserves to \$1,500,000 for the protection of these additional liabilities to the public. This course, under the provision of the revised Banking Act

of 1913, we are able to take without any additional charge except a nominal, proportionate assessment for the maintenance of the machinery of that fund.

The deposits—\$70,473,614—show a gratifying growth of \$4,508,000, and this increase is contributed to by practically every branch of the Bank; \$13,282,791 are non-interest bearing and \$57,190,822 deposits bearing interest.

The other Liabilities of the Bank, as the figures indicate, are made up chiefly of the usual balances due to other Banks and Correspondents at home and abroad, and obligations incurred in connection with the business of customers, acceptances under letters of credit, bills payable and the like.

Reverting to the Assets, you will observe that the Bank's actual immediately available resources, which include gold and silver coin, Dominion Government notes, deposit in the Central Gold Reserve, Notes of and Cheques on other Banks, balances due from Banks and Correspondents in Canada and abroad (which are, of course, payable on demand and the equivalent of gold), amount to nearly \$20,000,000—about 25% of the Bank's total liabilities to the public. This means, briefly, that one-quarter of the Bank's debts to the public, which are almost all to note-holders and depositors, could, if necessary, be paid in cash within 24 hours.

Dominion and Provincial Government Securities—\$612,000—are \$143,000 less than a year ago, occasioned by the disposal of the balance of the first Canadian War Loan Issue participated in by this Bank.

Canadian Municipal and British, Foreign and Colonial Public Securities show a large increase—about \$6,300,000—the expansion being almost wholly made up of the proportionate amount of advances made in conjunction with the other Canadian Banks to the British Government to carry on the manufacturing of munitions in the Dominion of Canada. The relative Securities are obligations of the Imperial Government, maturing at short intervals, with renewal privileges until April, 1918, when the last of these advances will fall due.

Railroad and other Bonds, Debentures and Stocks—\$4,184,382—have decreased by \$462,000 during the year, occasioned by advantageous sales of certain of these securities as favorable opportunities arose.

Call and Short Loans in Canada have been reduced by \$1,620,000, the relative funds being diverted into other remunerative channels.

Call and Short Loans elsewhere than in Canada have increased about \$1,000,000, and this is practically all represented by short-dated advances in the London (England) market against Government and other high-class securities. Such loans fluctuate from day to day according to the amount of funds that we have available in that centre.

Summarizing the individual amounts just commented on, the quickly available assets total \$37,625,896—an increase of \$5,000,000 during the 12 months covered—and these assets are wholly composed of cash or the equivalent, marketable securities and call loans which, in emergency, could be liquidated at very short notice. These liquid assets are nearly 50% of the Bank's liabilities to the public.

This strong position should, I think, be a source of satisfaction not only to the shareholders of the Bank but also to the depositors who are so largely interested in the standing of the Institution.

Current Loans and Discounts, all of which have undergone the usual careful scrutiny not only by the various Officers of the Bank but by the Auditors and Board of Directors, amount to \$49,030,365—\$1,564,105 more than a year ago. Included in these are \$15,000,000 advances to those engaged in the handling of products of the country, and these are, of course, of a liquid character, secured by standard commodities readily marketable.

Overdue debts—\$115,000—are \$113,000 less than a year ago, and are amply secured and provided for.

As mentioned in the Directors' Report, Bank Premises Account has been reduced by \$133,658, \$100,000 of which is applied from Profit and Loss Account and the balance received from the sale of the property at South Edmonton when the Branch at that point was closed. Expenditures in Bank Premises Account during the year are quite unimportant.

Relating to the present Canadian Banking situation, the outstanding and gratifying feature is the generally extraordinary position of liquidity, the result of which is that the Banks should be able to successfully cope with any emergency that may arise through war conditions. It will be interesting to briefly consider the part that has been played by the Canadian Banks since the outbreak of hostilities, in

the way of participation in War Issues of the British and Canadian Governments, War taxations, and contributions for patriotic purposes. The Canadian banks have made special advances, in one form or another, to the British and Canadian Governments since August, 1914, of no less a sum than \$270,000,000 that we know of, outside of individual participations in various issues of securities in the London market; the Dominion Bank has directly taken part in War advances to the extent of \$15,000,000 which does not include purchases of short-dated British Treasury Bills.

Since the close of 1914, when a special taxation measure was introduced by the Dominion Government, the Canadian banks have paid nearly \$2,000,000 taxes on circulation—a heavy inroad on their earnings; this Bank's proportion during that period was about \$100,000. The banks have also contributed to patriotic and relief funds since August, 1914, nearly \$1,000,000 up to the end of 1916, irrespective of subscriptions since the 1st January of the present year.

It is thus evident that the banks are with liberality, but quite properly, undertaking a full share of the unusual obligations attendant on the European struggle.

The Banks will undoubtedly be asked by the Governments to supply further amounts for the manufacturing of munitions in Canada and for other war purposes, but in this connection it would be well for the Imperial and Federal authorities to bear in mind that no matter what calls may be made it is essential that a general condition of liquidity in Canada be maintained, particularly in view of the extraordinary growth in deposits by the public that has taken place during the past two years, but which may not continue. A notable feature of all Balance Sheets of Canadian financial Institutions, recently issued, and which should not be overlooked, is the steadily increasing amount of Government securities held.

The authorities at Ottawa have undertaken to consult with the Banks every few months to generally review the financial situation and furnish estimated requirements before new commitments are requested.

Precautionary arrangements, however, have been made by both Governments under which the Canadian banks can at any time, under certain minor restrictions, convert their holdings of Government securities into cash should it be necessary to take such a step.

An important and satisfactory occurrence in 1916 was the Conference held at Winnipeg in June last between the representatives of the farming community, commercial interests and the Canadian Banks, at which time many matters of mutual interest were discussed and suggestions made for the extension by the Banks of more liberal credits to farmers and breeders of live stock—particularly essential if increased production and the necessary development of the country are to continue.

Advocates of thrift and preparedness have so far met with little support from the public. The Dominion Government, with the co-operation of the Banks, has inaugurated a campaign of thrift by the issuing of War Savings Certificates, but this action is only one step in the right direction. It is a fact that, outside of personal afflictions that have unfortunately befallen so many, the war up to this time has not in a material sense adversely affected the majority of the Canadian people in the slightest degree; on the contrary they are generally in a more prosperous position and spending more money than at any other period in the history of this country. It is evident, therefore, that the necessity for individual saving and economy should be brought home as far as possible to every member of the community and in every district if the sinews of war are to be supplied and provision made for the period of depression that will very probably occur after the war.

In so far as preparedness is concerned, forecasts of conditions after the war and suggestions of precautionary measures that should be taken are freely made, with a wide diversity of views. It seems probable, however, that when peace is declared the merchant whose shelves are comparatively bare, the manufacturer whose factory stock has been greatly reduced, the dealer in products who is carrying a minimum amount of produce, will be in the best position to deal with new situations."

#### ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT.

In moving the adoption of the Report, the President, Sir Edmund B. Osler, M.P., made the following remarks:

"The past year has been a very prosperous one generally and this Bank has shared in the prosperity and has experienced a substantial increase in business and profits. Naturally a great deal of work devolves upon the Executive of such a large Institution as this, and great caution is essential in its management. The Bank has done, and will continue to do, its full share with the other Banks in aiding the financial interests to raise the great sums of money necessary for Canadian industries during the war period. Commercial business and manufacturing have enjoyed remarkable progress, chiefly as the result of the vast expenditure on war material. The margin of profit on war contracts is steadily decreasing because of the high prices and scarcity of raw material, high wages and shortage of labour, and the point will some day be reached when the margin of profit will be very narrow or disappear entirely. We will face a time when there must be a reduction in cost or reconstruction cannot take place. There will be millions of men out of work and this must mean lower wages, and moreover many of the women who have taken the men's places to a large extent will by that time be permanently employed. The high cost of living cannot be very materially reduced until there are more men on the land producing, but this process is sure to be slow. The tendency of the past years has been from the farm to the city, and it will take time and organization and energy to reverse this state of affairs.

The period of adjustment after the War will be an anxious one—some people think there will be a continuance of prosperity and a very great expansion of business—I cannot agree with that view at all. I believe that for two or three years there will be a period during which profits will be small and those who now prepare to tide themselves over the lean years will be well rewarded. Canada will make great and rapid progress after the readjustment period at the close of the war. Immigration will come as fast as it can be taken care of. Employment must first be given to the returned soldiers, and I am afraid that of these not any large proportion will go on to the land. It would be an extremely unwise policy to bring into this country men who will flock to the large centres, for our cities and our towns would then

be overrun—it will doubtless be a hard matter to get men to go on the farms in order to obtain the necessary increase in agricultural production. It is a difficult task but it must be faced and I believe it will be carried out; I personally cannot help feeling that for two years at least after this war has ceased we will pass through very troublesome times.

The Directors of the Bank during the last year lost one of their colleagues—I refer to the late Honourable J. J. Foy—who had for years been a very valued member of the Board. His place has been filled by the election of a merchant of high standing—Mr. A. T. Reid—who, I believe, will be of great assistance to us in directing the affairs of the Bank. There will be a resolution submitted asking you to increase the number of Directors by two. The Directors resident in Toronto are comparatively few—of the others, one resides in Montreal, two in Winnipeg and one at the coast, in Vancouver, so that we want a little more aid here.

The General Manager has referred to the policy of thrift, and I think he is correct in stating that so far as one can judge there has as yet been no earnest endeavour towards thrift on the part of our Canadian citizens. I hope they will take to heart the appeal of the Finance Minister. Most people can afford to put by something, and I trust they will begin as soon as possible to do so.

I do not think any of you will take exception to the donations which the Bank has contributed to the Patriotic Fund or to other objects in connection with the war.

The Board, after consultation with the General Manager and the chief officials, decided at Christmas time to give a bonus of 10% on salaries to all the permanent officials of the Institution. It was deserved, because the Bank Staff has been seriously depleted by the exigencies of the war, and those who remain at work have been more or less doing double duty. The Directors thoroughly agreed with the suggestion to grant this bonus, and I am sure the shareholders will most heartily approve of their action in this respect. From the General Manager down, all Officials—Managers of the Branches and the whole Staff of the Bank—worked hard and ungrudgingly during the past two years and have cheerfully performed the extra duties placed upon them.

I have much pleasure in moving the adoption of the Report.”

#### REMARKS BY THE VICE-PRESIDENT.

Mr. W. D. Matthews, the Vice-President, in seconding the adoption of the Report, said:—

“It is gratifying to know that the Bank has made steady progress during the past year, and it must be satisfactory to the shareholders when we remember the unrest and almost unprecedented conditions created at the outbreak of the war. Canada’s prosperity has been brought about largely by the rapid development of manufacturing. We have proved our ability to take care of our own Country’s needs as well as meet the extra demands for war materials of all kinds on what we may designate a gigantic scale.

Ours is essentially a country of natural products—the enterprise and energy of our own people have responded to the call and we have demonstrated an ability to provide an increased production which has surprised ourselves. Canada is rich in minerals and timber, and the high prices that have prevailed for our natural commodities have brought an amount of money into this country never before experienced. Previous to the war it was the farmer who was ever hopeful that dollar wheat would be reached—now it is entirely different and the consumer is wishing for the time when the price of wheat will react and it will not be worth more than a dollar.

It is estimated that war orders approximating \$1,000,000,000 have been placed in Canada since the outbreak of the war, and as this business has been more or less profitable it has put many of our manufacturers in such a financial position that they are independent of the banks and instead of being borrowers have become depositors of their surplus funds. At every important meeting the war and its effects are the main topics of discussion, and various opinions are advanced as to the general conditions that will be brought about when peace is established. Many people think that while we may expect radical changes in the nature of our manufactures and consequently a disturbance of industries, yet there are conditions in existing contracts which provide that deliveries are to continue for prescribed periods after peace has been declared, and that this interval will enable our manufacturers to prepare for the logical changes and get ready for future eventualities. The prosperity that has come to the Dominion in former years has always depended on the development of our natural products, and if peace

were to be declared tomorrow the demand for such would continue for a long time. We are all hoping for peace and it will probably come suddenly—I believe we ought to go forward arranging and regulating our business affairs with a positive assurance that it will radically disturb our manufacturing and commercial interests when it does come—the more conservative we are in that respect the better we will be able to meet the changes that will undoubtedly ensue.

The one thing more than another that makes me a little anxious as to the readjustment which must take place after peace has been declared is the changed policy of the Governments throughout the world. We read of the nationalization of many of the industries such as shipping, the railways, mining, manufacturing and the consequent control of prices. Now, when peace is declared the question of Government control of all these important industries throughout the world will probably be the greatest problem that has to be faced—the solving of this problem may upset the manufacturing and commercial interests more than anything else.

The outstanding features of our prosperity in Canada may be gathered from the reports of our Government. The financial position of the Dominion today exhibits a very large surplus in receipts over expenditures, the figures for the past nine months in the statement issued by the Finance Minister a few days ago showing that Canada has exported during that period \$250,000,000 more than the amount of her imports. That in itself is a remarkable indication of prosperity and places us in a position to stand some of the setbacks that will probably come later on. Bank deposits have been increased during the year to the extent of about \$200,000,000. Much of the increase in the deposits has come from the rural districts—the farmers in the Dominion being undoubtedly in a splendid position. Our Government has been compelled to revise its estimate of the extent of the crop in the North West by about 60,000,000 bushels and this at the high prices that are prevailing represents an enormous sum of money. There is every evidence that it was underestimated and the latest revised figures will probably be more or less correct. In this connection I may say that there is now in store at the head of the Lakes, at Fort William and Port Arthur, and in the interior elevators west of Winnipeg a volume of grain to the extent of 85,000,000 bushels awaiting shipment and the financing of which the Banks must provide for.

I am satisfied that your Bank has done its full share in looking after the business of its customers and doing what has been necessary towards the success of the public calls that have been made on the Banks generally. The General Manager in his remarks has referred to the necessity for thrift and economy and this has been emphasized by many of our public men and financiers who have been addressing annual meetings during the past month.

We have not really felt the effects of the war. Our Banks are showing good profits, our manufacturers are showing good profits, our farmers have been getting rich, and although the fact that we are building up a strong position cannot be denied, as the President says, we must get ready for the change when the war is over. It is a peculiar situation and has to be met, and experience does not afford much assistance in figuring out what is likely to happen.

The finances of the Dominion Bank, as the General Manager has told you, are in excellent shape and he has fully explained the statement so that there is no need for comment on the figures by me. I will content myself with seconding the Resolution for the adoption of the Report.”—Carried.

Mr. W. R. Brock: “One of the matters referred to in the President’s address was an increase in the number of Directors. You are all aware that their number has not been added to anything like commensurately with the expansion which has taken place in the Bank’s business from Montreal to Vancouver. When we had comparatively few Branches the Board was as large as it is at the present time, and we must now increase the number of Directors in Toronto in order to properly look after the Bank’s affairs. I, therefore, beg to move the following resolution:

THAT WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to increase the number of Directors from eleven to thirteen,

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Shareholders of the Dominion Bank assembled in annual general meeting, that By-law No. 3 of the Shareholders’ By-laws be and the same is hereby amended by striking out the word eleven where it occurs in the said By-law and by substituting therefor the word thirteen, and that as amended the said By-law shall read as follows:

The number of the Directors of the Bank shall be thirteen, of whom three shall form a quorum.”

The Resolution was seconded by Mr. A. M. Nanton and carried.

Mr. E. Galley: "I beg to move that the remuneration of the Directors of this Bank be and the same is hereby fixed at the total amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) per annum, dating from the 1st day of February, 1917."

Mr. A. H. Allin seconded the motion, which was carried.

Mr. William Crocker: "I have much pleasure in moving that Mr. Geoffrey T. Clarkson and Mr. Robert J. Dilworth, the retiring Auditors, be and they are hereby appointed Auditors to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting, and that their remuneration be fixed at a sum not to exceed \$5,000."

The Resolution was seconded by Mr. W. W. Near, and carried.

Mr. A. H. Campbell: "The very trying time through which we are passing and the consequent general disturbance in business affairs have placed unusually heavy responsibilities upon the members of the Board during the past twelve months, and I therefore have much pleasure in making the following motion: That the thanks of this Meeting be given to the President, Vice-President and Directors for their services during the year."

Mr. S. Samuel seconded the motion, which was carried.

Mr. H. W. Hutchinson: "On behalf of the Directors I thank you for your expression of appreciation of their services during the past year. I think the Statement submitted to you is very creditable indeed and must be very gratifying. I trust the results of the efforts of the Directors for the ensuing year will be such that they will be able to present to you a Statement equally satisfactory to that which you have received to-day."

Mr. John T. Small, K.C.: "I have much pleasure in moving that the thanks of this Meeting be given to the General Manager and other Officers of the Bank for the efficient performance of their respective duties. I am aware, and most of you who are present are probably aware, that the pressure on the Staff of this Bank and all the Banks has been extraordinary in recent times. Many of the officers of the Bank have been enabled to go to the Front where they are standing by the colors and defending our rights.

Those who remain are giving extra time and attention to the affairs of the Bank, and they deserve our special thanks this year."

The Resolution was seconded by Mr. R. S. McLaughlin and carried.

Mr. C. A. Bogert: "In replying to this Resolution I feel that my first duty and privilege is to again make reference to the loyalty and unselfishness of those of the Staff—the number is steadily increasing—who have given their services for the defence of the Empire. Since the last Annual Meeting 116 additional have volunteered and the total number now training or at the Front is 329—45% of the numerical strength at the outbreak of the war. In fact, the majority of our men who are of military age, and fit, have enlisted. Unfortunately our record of casualties is also increasing, and the number who have been wounded or who have made the greatest sacrifice of all grows larger as the days go by. Up to the 31st December last 22 of our men had lost their lives on active service, 19 had been wounded, 1 was missing, 3 were prisoners of war in Germany, and 4 had been wounded and returned to duty. I feel sure that the Shareholders of the Bank will join with us who are at home in recording not only our deep regret for the lives that have been lost but our pride in the achievements of those men and the records they have left behind them.

In addition, we learn with gratification that two ex-members of the Staff were awarded the Military Cross in 1916, and the Distinguished Service Order was conferred on a third.

I have referred particularly to those who are on active service, for theirs is far the greater part, but I wish, in conclusion, on behalf of the present Staff, to express to you our due appreciation of the Resolution which you have passed. As you will understand, our ordinary labours are beset by many unusual complications, which we are solving willingly from day to day and in the best manner possible, and we will continue to do so until the war is over—when we hope that many of those now absent will return to the Bank.

The Directors have shown their recognition of the loyalty of the Staff, their constant attention to their unusually heavy duties and the steadily increasing burden of



living expenses, by granting a substantial Bonus at the Christmas season—this generous action met with great appreciation.”

Dr. Charles O'Reilly: “I beg to move that the poll be now opened for the election of the Directors and that the same be closed at two o'clock in the afternoon or so soon before that hour as five minutes shall elapse without any vote being polled, and that the Scrutineers, on the close of the poll, do hand to the Chairman a certificate of the result of the poll.”

The Resolution was seconded by Mr. W. S. Kerman, and carried.

The Scrutineers reported that the following gentlemen were elected Directors for the ensuing year:—

Messrs. A. W. Austin, W. R. Brock, James Carruthers, R. J. Christie, Sir John C. Eaton, E. W. Hamber, H. W. Hutchinson, W. D. Matthews, A. M. Nanton, Sir Edmund B. Osler, M.P., A. T. Reid.

At a subsequent meeting of the Directors, Sir Edmund B. Osler, M.P., was elected President and Mr. W. D. Matthews Vice-President for the ensuing term.
