On motion of Messrs. E. W. Hamber and H. H. Williams, the chair was taken by the President, Mr. A. W. Austin, and Mr. W. K. Pearce was appointed Secretary of the Meeting.

The Secretary then read the notice calling the Meeting.

The Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were taken as read.

It was moved by Mr. Arnold C. Matthews, seconded by Mr. James Scott, and resolved that Messrs. R. M. Gray and E. H. Baines be appointed Scrutineers.

At the request of the Chairman the Secretary then read the Report of the Directors to the Shareholders and the Annual Statement for the year 1925, certified by the Shareholders' Auditors, was submitted to the Meeting.

The Bank, and community generally, suffered a great loss in the death of Sir Augustus Nanton, which occurred on the 24th of April last. He was made a Director of the Bank in 1907, Vice-President in 1919, and President in August, 1924. Mr. A. W. Austin was elected to succeed him as President, Mr. C. A. Bogert was elected Vice-President, and Mr. C. S. Blackwell was appointed Chairman of the Board.

A Branch of the Bank was opened in the West end of Kitchener, Ontario, which is conducted as a sub-office of our Kitchener Branch.

The Head Office and Branches of the Bank have been inspected during the year and the cash and securities at Head Office as of date the 31st December, have been verified by a Committee of your Directors.

The Bank's affairs have been thoroughly audited by Messrs. A. B. Shepherd and Percy C. Baxter, the Shareholders' Auditors, and their report is attached to the Balance Sheet.

ADDRESS BY MR. A. W. AUSTIN, PRESIDENT

Since our last Annual Meeting we have sustained the loss of our President, Sir Augustus Meredith Nanton, who had been a Director of the Bank since 1907, a Vice-President from 1919 to 1924 and who succeeded the late Sir Edmund Osler as President in August, 1924. Living for about forty years in Winnipeg, and being associated with many impor-

tant financial affairs in the West, his advice and influence were always very valuable to the Bank. On his appointment to the Presidency he moved to Toronto. His health was then somewhat impaired; we hoped for its improvement, but fate determined otherwise.

The Board having appointed me to fill the vacancy, I can only say that I will do my best to justify their choice and, with their help, to carry on the business of the Bank successfully.

Mr. C. A. Bogert, the General Manager, was unanimously elected a Director and to the Vice-Presidency. He entered the Bank in 1881—forty-five years ago—and after filling many important positions with success, was appointed General Manager in 1906, and so is just completing his twentieth year in that position.

At the time these changes were being made your Directors created the position of "Chairman of the Board" as has been done by other leading financial institutions, and Mr. C. S. Blackwell was unanimously elected to this important office.

The general improvement in conditions throughout Canada is well known to all of you without the need of any protracted remarks from me, and what I have to say will be brief.

The country enjoyed excellent crops in 1925. In the three Prairie Provinces the production of wheat reached a total of 424,796,000 bushels as compared to 235,694,000 bushels in 1924. The yield of coarse grains also was slightly greater. The crop has returned satisfactory prices to the farmer, enabling him to liquidate, or substantially reduce, his accumulated indebtedness, as a result of which prospects are more encouraging than for years past.

I remember that twenty-seven years ago the Western wheat crop was but little over 30,000,000 bushels, or less than one-fourteenth of this year's fine yield. The population, which was then only 400,000, is now about 2,000,000, reminding us that in spite of periodical set-backs, excellent progress has been made in that time.

The result last year would have been even better but for the damage to unthreshed grain in some districts through early frost. The menace of frost is a contingency which the West must always take into account, and commendation should be given our Dominion Cerealists for their fine work in developing a new wheat called the "Garnet" which it is stated ripens from seven to ten days earlier than any other variety now generally grown, and is to that extent more immune.

Live stock receipts at the three principal stockyards, Winnipeg, Calgary and Edmonton, totalled for 1925, 1,628,518 head, as against 1,427,934 for 1924, and with improved prices which have prevailed the values realized from this industry were much greater in 1925 than in the preceding year. The export of cattle from Canada to the United Kingdom shows a substantial increase over shipments for the past few years, and the aggregate is estimated to have exceeded 100,000 head—the largest number since 1911. This is cause for general satisfaction, and with continued development of this business it should not be long before the record shipment of upwards of 163,000 head in 1906 is equalled. Owing to the large surplus of feed corn in the United States, it is probable also that export business in cattle to that country may revive.

In Eastern Canada also all branches of agriculture are prosperous. Fine crops were the rule everywhere, and good prices prevailed for grain, dairy produce, cattle and hogs. Our butter shipments have been greater than ever before. More care has been given to packing, and Canadian butter now ranks among the very best in the British market.

Agriculture is followed by nearly fifty per cent of our people, and is Canada's greatest industry. It is indeed true to say that her destiny lies in the cultivation of the land, and a successful and contented farming community is her finest asset.

It is much to be regretted that a greater proportion of our products is not shipped out of our Eastern Canadian ports of St. John and Halifax, which are well equipped to handle grain particularly, and desire a more substantial share of the winter export traffic, most of which now moves by way of Buffalo and New York. The aspirations of our Maritime friends deserve the sympathetic consideration of the rest

of the country and should not be dismissed as an economic impossibility without the fullest examination, particularly in view of the need of our railways for traffic.

Conditions in the lumber trade were not generally satisfactory, owing to over-production, but more recently improved export business to Japan has developed, while the activity in Florida has also created a demand. Good business is expected this year from the Prairie Provinces. Pulp and paper—a leading industry in this country—enjoyed great activity. Fishing also experienced a satisfactory year, particularly in British Columbia, where the pack of salmon has only once been exceeded. Prices were exceptionally good.

The development in the mining districts of Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia, is one of the features of the year; gold production reached a new high record, while the output of non-ferrous metals—notably nickel, copper, lead and zinc—also showed substantial increase.

From the manufacturing centres improved business is reported in some lines, and this is true also of wholesale and retail trading.

Commercial agencies report a slightly reduced number of failures, and the reduction in the total liabilities involved (\$41,000,000 as compared to \$63,000,000 in 1924) is most striking.

Building construction for the year totalled \$314,000,000, an increase of nearly \$40,000,000 over 1924.

Our foreign trade shows a substantially increased balance in favour of this country. Agricultural and animal products, pulp and paper, and minerals are the chief items among our exports to show an increase over the previous year.

An important item on the credit side not to be found among official trade figures, is the expenditure in Canada by foreign visitors, particularly motorists from the United States. Our northern lakes and wilderness regions have been favourably known to some of our southern neighbours as a recreation ground for many years past, but the almost universal use of the motor car and the building of modern roads have in more recent times stimulated travel into

virtually every Province. It is reliably stated that nearly 2,000,000 American automobiles entered Canada during 1925, leaving behind them a combined outlay estimated at about \$200,000,000, and while there was, of course, an offsetting volume of travel in the other direction, the balance in favour of Canada is very substantial. Great efforts have been made of late to attract Canadians to certain of the Southern States, and considerable sums of their money are invested there, mostly in real estate; also many of our unemployed have gone there during the winter months, as work has been plentiful. We should not, however, neglect to make known as widely as possible the great counter-attractions of Canada, also the wonderful exploitation of our mineral regions now being carried on. Motor traffic is capable of development to an indefinite extent and every legitimate inducement, including a judicious extension of our highways system, should be offered the tourist to visit Canada. Aside from the immediate gain is the advantage we must ultimately reap from their more intimate knowledge of our resources gathered at first hand.

A summary of the favourable features in present-day conditions affecting Canada includes good crops, with excellent demand for our raw products at remunerative prices; a great improvement in the situation of the farmer, and general liquidation of indebtedness, a growth in savings deposits, and the strong liquid position of the Banks, but as against these we still have the inter-related and unsolved problems of our Railways, taxation and immigration.

With respect to the last mentioned, more comprehensive programmes are now being arranged for the bringing of new settlers to the country suited for work on the farm, and it is expected that 1926 will see a substantial influx of agricultural people. The Canadian and British Governments and our two Canadian Railways are combining to bring about an extensive movement of British homeseekers of a desirable class this spring, while a migration of farmers from the United States greater than has taken place since the War is also predicted for the present year. Parties of Nebraska farmers came over last fall, a large number of whom purchased Saskatchewan land, and they have been acclaiming Canada ever since their return to their own State, the

splendid crop of 1925 having had the effect of focusing attention on our West to a greater extent than for many years. All this, however, is as yet only a prospect—let us hope it may become a reality.

Regarding taxation—economy is not a popular doctrine, but never was the need more urgent than now for the Canadian people to follow it. We are entering upon the eighth year of peace, and while it is true that successive refunding operations have reduced carrying charges somewhat, no appreciable reduction in the war debt has yet been effected. The magnitude of this problem is staggering, but sooner or later it will have to be faced, and the first step towards dealing with it should be drastic curtailment of public expenditure. Association with wealthy neighbours tends to breed extravagance, and for this reason it is sometimes said that our proximity to the United States is not altogether a good thing. In all essentials our habits and scale of living are identical with theirs, but we should recognize that what may be legitimate expenditure for one is unjustified extravagance in another, and we should postpone our desire for luxurious new improvements until we can afford them, bending all our efforts towards the reduction of our debts, lightening our load of taxation, keeping our own people at home, and attracting immigration. Along this route, all are agreed, lies the solution of the Railway problem.

Under the provisions of the Bank Act, as revised in 1923, it is necessary that one of your Auditors be changed every two years. Mr. P. C. Baxter, of Macintosh, Cole & Robertson, is retiring this year, and you will be asked to pass a resolution appointing Mr. D. McK. McClelland, of Price, Waterhouse & Co., in his stead. The name of Mr. A. B. Shepherd, of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co., who acted as a Shareholders' Auditor in 1925, is submitted for re-election.

It is with much pleasure that I again record sincere appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the staff, to whose loyalty to, and co-operation with, the chief officials of the Bank, is largely due the measure of success attained during the past year.

I now beg to move the adoption of the Report.

ADDRESS BY MR. C. A. BOGERT,
VICE-PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER

As a result of the changes in your Directorate which have been mentioned by the President, it has become one of my responsibilities to second the adoption of the Report, but before doing so, I wish to make personal reference to the death, on April 24th last, of your late President, Sir Augustus Nanton. Although he occupied the chair for only a few months, he maintained the closest contact with the Bank's affairs, particularly in the Western department, for many years, and, with outstanding ability and great diligence, served your interests for eighteen years. His death, following so soon after the removal of his distinguished predecessor, Sir Edmund Osler, is especially tragic. He was a national figure, and all Canada has suffered a great loss.

The Shareholders will, I am sure, consider it a particular privilege and pleasure to welcome Mr. Albert W. Austin to the Presidency in succession to Sir Augustus. In assuming this office your new President, as is well known, fills the place held for many years by his father, the late Mr. James Austin, the founder of the Bank. Mr. Albert Austin, it is interesting to recall, served an apprenticeship as junior clerk in the earliest days of the institution, and has been in close touch with it practically all his business life. He has been a Director since 1897, and Vice-President for the past seven years.

The Directors have created the position of "Chairman of the Board," to which office they have elected Mr. C. S. Blackwell, who has been one of their members since 1921. The officials of the Bank welcome his co-operation and will benefit through his ability and experience.

The Directors and Officials of the Bank present to you to-day, with some satisfaction, the results of the Bank's business for the year 1925.

After making the usual re-valuation of all the Bank's loans, securities and other assets, and providing for all losses and shrinkages, there is a moderate increase in earnings, an expansion of \$4,850,000 in deposits and an increase in the total assets of \$5,400,000. Adding the amount brought forward in Profit and Loss Account last year—\$900,125—to the earnings in 1925—\$1,156,840—there is a

total to be dealt with of \$2,056,965 which has been disposed of as just described by the Secretary of the meeting and needs no special comment except that \$100,000 has been written off Bank Premises Account as against \$75,000 the two previous years, and a balance carried forward in Profit and Loss Account of \$964,298, an increase of \$64,173 over the figures brought forward on the 1st of January, 1925. The Profit and Loss Account is now close to the \$1,000,000 mark.

Respecting the liabilities, Notes in Circulation have increased \$432,000. The total deposits have expanded \$4,850,000, of which \$427,000 is non-interest bearing and \$4,423,000 interest bearing. This increase is in keeping with the general expansion in Canadian Bank deposits, and, in our case, there is an improvement at nearly all branches.

The average deposits per branch, in Canada, of all Canadian Banks, is \$509,000—the average deposits per branch, in Canada, of this Bank, is \$747,000, and even after allowing for amalgamations and other circumstances, The Dominion Bank still stands second on the list in this respect, a position that has been maintained for many years past. Taking the average increase per branch of all Canadian Banks during 1925, The Dominion Bank also occupies second place. I am making these comparisons because deposits provide the chief source of earning power of a Bank and they also involve great responsibilities which we must never lose sight of.

On the 31st of December, 1924, the Bank had loans from the Dominion Government under the Finance Act of 1914 amounting to \$4,300,000. On the 31st of December last, there was no liability under this heading. Since 1914 we have at times availed ourselves of the very useful privileges of this legislation (which was enacted at the outbreak of the War) when seasonable movements of products were being made during the autumn and winter, but as a result of the unprecedented volume and rapid shipments of grain to the world's markets during the past few months and the very large returns therefrom, our customers engaged in this business required much smaller loans than usual and the disappearance of the Bank's liability under this heading was a natural result.

You will notice that Letters of Credit Outstanding increased during the year by nearly \$4,000,000, occasioned

by a substantial growth in foreign business. It means that the Bank's customers who deal in exports and imports are extending their activities and apparently appreciate the facilities we offer through our New York and London, Eng., Offices.

The Bank's Cash Assets on the 31st of December were over \$26,000,000, 22.96% of public liabilities.

Investments in Dominion and Provincial Government Securities, Canadian Municipal Securities, British, Foreign and Colonial Securities and other Bonds, Debentures and Stocks on the 31st of December totalled \$25,284,000, \$3,600,000 more than on the same date in 1924. All these securities are of the highest classes, carefully selected and entered on our books on a very conservative basis.

Call and Short Loans in Canada—\$15,558,000—are practically the same as a year ago, but Call Loans Abroad—\$4,630,707—have increased \$1,900,000 during the twelve months. Immediately Available Assets—\$71,600,000—are \$5,000,000 more than a year ago, and constitute practically sixty-three per cent of the Bank's total liabilities to the public.

Current Loans and Discounts in Canada are \$2,540,000 less—a natural shrinkage common to all Banks, although the decrease in our case was somewhat less than the average. We were, however, able to employ our funds remuneratively in other channels, chiefly by acquiring additional investments and by increasing our Call Loans Abroad, to which I have just referred.

Bank Premises Account figures are approximately \$100,000 less than a year ago. Bank amalgamations have resulted in leaving a number of buildings idle at duplicating points, which emphasizes the wisdom of conservatism in the acquiring of property and buildings except where established business warrants it. Although we have practically no land or buildings on our hands which are not required, your Directors considered it prudent to continue a reasonable writing off from this Account, and, as stated before, \$100,000 has been applied in this way as against \$75,000 the two previous years. Expenditures were very moderate during 1925; the only outlays of moment totalled \$46,229.51, and were occasioned through the completion of buildings at

Huntsville, Ont., and Dundas St. and Runnymede Road, Toronto, which were commenced in 1924 and were necessitated through increasing business at these points.

The total Assets of the Bank on the 31st of December were approximately \$128,000,000, an expansion of \$5,500,000 in 1925.

As I took occasion to remark a year ago, but desire to repeat now, the cost of operating a Bank has risen greatly during recent years, while the compensation for banking service has not proportionately increased. In some departments of our business it has even declined, while the public has grown to expect and, in fact receives, practically gratuitous service in many directions. Twenty-five years or so ago this was not the case. The value of a Bank's facilities was more generally recognized, the cost of maintaining them admitted, and adequate payment cheerfully rendered by the customer, but certain institutions created in the early years of this century, commenced their very brief careers by offering unwarranted concessions in terms, hoping thereby to attract a clientele more rapidly than through the sounder methods of their longer established competitors, with the result that the latter, for the protection of their business, often felt obliged to meet the new competition, costly though it was. Such a condition could not exist indefinitely, and the institutions referred to, long ago met the fate their methods invited, but much of the effect of their example still survives and our present Banks continue to give service and perform functions in excess of value received.

It is sometimes claimed that the terms offered by United States Bankers to their customers are more favourable than those prevailing here, but considering the difference in conditions under which operations are conducted, we believe the opposite to be the case. It is timely to remark, however, that the question of operating costs is just now receiving the attention of American Bankers also. They recognize, as we do, that many accounts are conducted on terms that mean an absolute loss to the institutions carrying them, and, like us, they are seeking a corrective. Nobody, I think, really expects something for nothing, and the efforts now under way among Canadian Banks to reform this condition will, I am sure, be received in a proper spirit.

The successful administration of a Canadian Bank, with widely distributed branches, calls for constant and careful supervision by its Head Office. In this Bank we keep in the closest touch with all the branches—not only are we in correspondence with them nearly every day, but there is not a branch of the Bank that is not visited by Head Office representatives at least once during the year, and the more important ones much oftener.

Events of the past five years in the banking world, with which you are all very familiar, have, through mergers and otherwise, resulted in the elimination of six institutions and it is very noteworthy that this has been accomplished, except in one case, without any loss to depositors and the payment of comparatively substantial amounts to the Shareholders of the Banks concerned. Twenty-five years ago there were 36 Chartered Banks in Canada and 750 branches, as compared with 11 to-day and 3,841 branches. At the last revision of the Bank Act legislation was enacted providing additional safeguards for depositors and shareholders, and from the Bank statements submitted recently, there is every evidence of strength and liquidity. I have no hesitation in saying that the banking situation is at this time stronger than at any period in Canadian history. The Banks are amply provided with resources and it is particularly opportune that this position has been reached at a time when through improved conditions, we may reasonably expect a gradual expansion in business. It appears appropriate in this connection to say that it is a mistaken idea, somewhat widely held, that large Banks necessarily can render better public service than smaller institutions. Large totals in balance sheets are impressive, it is true, but have not the significance sometimes attributed to them. The moderate sized Bank can offer just as efficient banking facilities in all directions as its larger competitors.

Forecasts for 1926 are generally encouraging, but in making plans for the future we should profit by the lessons learned during the inflation period of 1916-1920. It is true that there is much less danger of a serious drop in the value of merchandise because of the disinclination of people to purchase from day to day more than they require. This is becoming a national characteristic. The advent of "Cash and Carry," chain store systems, etc., has brought about a different method of living—people order frequently and in

lesser quantities. This situation has been helped by a vast improvement in distributive facilities, better transportation by railways, boats and motor vehicles. This results in many favourable features—the element of risk and speculation is greatly reduced; a large volume of funds usually locked up in inventories is released and a much larger amount of money is available for development purposes.

In this relation, it has become almost wearisome at meetings of this kind to refer to heavy taxation in Canada, but no other present question has so grave a bearing upon our prosperity. We should remember that no business will be progressive unless it is given a fair chance to earn a reasonable return on capital investment. The owners of business are, naturally, disinclined to take all the many risks if the benefits go largely to the State through burdensome taxation.

It is significant that at this time when all Canadians are anxious to see a development of natural resources, more of the people's savings is employed out of the country than ever before. We find that private Canadian investors have purchased, during the past year, foreign securities to a very large total—estimated as high as \$100,000,000, and in addition, Canadian Banks in 1925 increased by many millions their average loans of surplus funds in New York and London. It is quite true that banking prudence compels the keeping of a certain proportion of liquid assets in the form of demand loans at these points, but the totals were far in excess of normal amounts. It is surely regrettable that profitable employment can not at the present time be found in our own country for our own surplus capital.

An outstanding feature of the year 1925 was the return of Great Britain to the gold standard. Although opinion was not unanimous as to the timeliness of this step, the moral effect was world-wide, and under this leadership Continental Europe has made further progress on the road to economic recovery. One by one the debtor nations have come forward to arrange the funding of their war obligations; currencies are being stabilized, and with one or two exceptions, the wide and erratic fluctuations in the foreign exchanges that have hampered foreign trade since the War, have disappeared. Confidence is further restored by the completion of the Locarno Treaties.

The growth of the instalment plan of merchandising has been very marked in the United States of recent years, and has been widely adopted to stimulate the sale of all manner of articles, not only of utility, but of luxury as well, and, in some cases, even of clothing. Many observers think that the practice has gone too far in that direction. In Canada the question has not become an important one as yet, but we should like to record the opinion that if confined to the sale of necessary labour-saving equipment for domestic use, furniture, and similar goods, there is a legitimate field for the instalment plan, but that the indiscriminate extension of credit for unnecessary articles of luxury is strongly to be deprecated. Not only does it create a mortgage on future earning power, but tends to undermine the virtue of thrift.

The many recent business mergers—with more, doubtless, to come—are a natural corrective for excessive competition and top-heavy overhead, and serve to emphasize the extent to which Canada's industrial and distributing facilities were developed—partly as a War necessity—beyond the needs of our present population.

Another interesting sign of the times is the development of various co-operative plans for buying and selling. Merchandise, particularly food products, is seeking the shortest and most economical route between producer and consumer, and the modern tendency is towards the elimination of the middleman.

The co-operative movement continues to gain strength among the grain producers of the Western Provinces and an important proportion of the crop is again being marketed through the selling pool this year. What the ultimate outcome will be it is difficult to predict, but if the pool's functions should become more widely extended, the effect upon those who have for many years been engaged in the marketing of the country's products may be very far-reaching.

Doubtless you have observed during the year a gradual increase in the value of your shares, which were selling in January, 1925, at approximately \$190, and at present about \$218, an increase of \$28 per share, and of \$1,680,000 in the total market value of your capital.

There are now 2,222 shareholders on our Register, an increase of seventy-eight since the last meeting. The stock

is widely distributed and the number of shares available, and market prices, are—as they should be—regulated wholly by supply and demand.

In the President's remarks a generally improved condition is indicated during the year 1925—largely as a result of the exceptional crops that we have harvested in all districts and the benefit of this new purchasing power has provided a stimulus to trade from Coast to Coast. It would be going too far to say that general prosperity has returned, but we know that merchants and manufacturers, through gradually increasing turn-over and reductions in overhead, are in many cases putting a stop to the losses so characteristic of annual balance sheets during recent years. Profits, though often small, are more generally in evidence, and the new year has begun under more favourable auspices.

Undue optimism is not justified, but there is certainly a better feeling in the air—people are more cheerful and this in itself is an incentive to energy and renewed efforts in all spheres of life. Insofar as The Dominion Bank is concerned, as I have endeavoured to point out, the institution was never in a better position to take care of expected increased business and to provide funds for legitimate propositions that come our way. I think the members of the Board, and the Executive Staff, are justified in assuming, and assuring the Shareholders, that satisfactory progress will continue during 1926.

I have pleasure in seconding the adoption of the Report.

The motion was presented to the Meeting and adopted.

Mr. R. L. Defries—Mr. President, I would move—“That Mr. A. B. Shepherd, C.A., of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell & Co., and Mr. D. McK. McClelland, F.C.A., of Price, Waterhouse & Co., be appointed Auditors to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting, and that their remuneration be fixed at a sum not to exceed \$10,000, also that the thanks of the Shareholders be recorded to Mr. Percy C. Baxter, the retiring Auditor, for his efficient services during the past two years.”

Mr. C. P. Stuart seconded the motion, which was carried.

Hon. Thomas Crawford—Mr. President and Gentlemen: I have a motion in my hand which I desire to present to the

Meeting—one which I think will meet with the approval of every Shareholder present—“That the thanks of this Meeting be given to the President, Vice-President and Directors for their services during the year.”

It occurred to me when sitting here that the minds of many of us who have had the pleasure of meeting the Directors of The Dominion Bank annually and receiving the reports of their good work, may sometimes revert to some of the distinguished gentlemen who served on the Board in the past, and have since “crossed the river” and the truth of the old saying strikes us—“The workman dies but the work goes on.” For, notwithstanding the success of The Dominion Bank and the achievements of the able men associated with its administration in its earlier history, we find when we meet to-day to review the year's work of the later men that it is not second to that of their predecessors.

The Shareholders have reason to congratulate themselves on having such a report presented to them to-day, as it is well known to all, Sir, that the year through which we have just passed was anything but bright and prosperous.

May I be permitted to say that the Shareholders assembled are prepared to “renew the lease” to the Board for the year on which we have entered, and I have no doubt that their services will be of even greater benefit to the Bank in the future than in the past.

I know, Sir, that a great deal depends upon the capable and faithful service and co-operation of the General Manager and his staff. May I say that I know something of some of the Managers in charge of your branches in Toronto and throughout Ontario—a splendid lot of men who are doing their part in conjunction with, and under the wise guidance of, the General Manager.

I move the resolution which I have already read to you.

Mr. Sigmund Samuel—Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen: It is a great pleasure to me to second this motion so ably proposed by my friend, the Hon. Thomas Crawford, and I wish to do so in no perfunctory manner. I must express my appreciation of the appointment of you, Sir, as President of this Bank. You have attained a position in the community which we all might envy, and I hope you may live

for many years to occupy it. As for Mr. Blackwell, my acquaintance with him is not of such long standing as it is with you, Sir, but I wish him success and long life. As for the remaining Directors, as an old resident of this city, I have been able to watch their careers with great satisfaction—I doubt if any men could be found in their own spheres who have attained greater success. I have much pleasure in seconding this resolution. (Carried.)

Chairman—I will ask Mr. Blackwell to respond.

Mr. C. S. Blackwell—On behalf of the President, Vice-President and Directors of the Bank, I wish to thank you for the very kind resolution which has just been moved. It is a great satisfaction indeed, after our twelve months' efforts to meet the Shareholders to-day and feel that they are satisfied with what we have accomplished.

After all that has been stated so ably by the President and the General Manager, there is very little that I can say that will be of interest to you. Owing to the many annual meetings held during the last few weeks, the trade conditions of the country and the future possibilities and prospects are known to you all so well that nothing more need be added in that respect, but I think that I might say a word or two regarding our Balance Sheet. During my long experience with various business organizations, I have never known an institution that is so conservative in its methods in bringing out a balance sheet as The Dominion Bank is—there is no question that when the balance sheet is brought on the table it is a true one. Whenever a borrower gets into difficulties its Bank is faced with the possibility of loss—bad debts are inseparable from business and, as you all know, the past four or five years have been trying ones. The Dominion Bank always makes ample appropriations, and last year after making all necessary provisions, the usual dividend and bonus were paid and a greater balance than ever carried forward in Profit and Loss Account.

The outlook for 1926 is very promising—the only cloud that I can see on the horizon at the moment is our unfortunate political situation. We must have a strong Government, a courageous Government, a Government that is prepared to do things, and it is to be hoped that a way will soon be found to bring the present deadlock to an end.

Before sitting down I would like to express my very deep appreciation of the great honour the Board saw fit to do me in appointing me Chairman of the Board. It is not necessary for me to detail the functions of the Chairman, but it was felt that through such a medium the Directors might cooperate even more closely than in the past with the General Manager and the organization. I am trying, in my humble way, to be of some service in that respect and I hope that it will prove worth while. I am not a Banker—I only bring some business knowledge to the Board, and whatever that is worth I give it with a great deal of pleasure to The Dominion Bank.

Chairman—Gentlemen: We have with us to-day one of our number who lives at a great distance—Mr. Hamber, who has come all the way from Vancouver to attend this Meeting. I am sure that you would like to hear a few words from him regarding the Western Provinces and the future there.

Mr. E. W. Hamber—Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen: It is a very great pleasure to be here at the Annual Meeting again—the last Meeting I was able to attend was in 1923. Owing to the distance it is, of course, entirely impossible to attend meetings during the year, but as far as I am able, I do what I can in the interests of The Dominion Bank in the West, and especially in British Columbia.

The Chairman has asked me to say a word or two on conditions in those territories. As you all know, and as the reports have shown, the conditions in the middle West are vastly improved owing to the exceptional crop that has been harvested and the general liquidation of debt, all of which makes for better business. In British Columbia in the last two years we have had nothing whatever to complain of, and I doubt very much if there has been any better feeling or better business in any other part of Canada than there has been in British Columbia during that time. In 1923 when I last had the pleasure of addressing the Annual Meeting I pointed out that the opening of the Panama Canal and the resulting extension of trade with various countries from the Pacific Coast were going to have a very material effect on the prosperity of the West, and our realizations in that regard have far exceeded our expectations. This year the exports from British Columbia have

materially increased, the markets in the Orient are gradually growing and conditions in the Province to-day are such that we look forward to 1926, and the future years, with unbounded confidence.

I wish to make mention of another fact—that in recent years in British Columbia there has been a great influx of capital; that capital is being invested in the very best businesses that we have there. Most of it is coming from our friends to the south—they are continually coming in, and to-day have many millions of dollars invested in British Columbia. I make special mention of this because we would like to see some of the interest on new capital going to Canadian and English interests also; there are many opportunities worthy of your investigation in our part of the country.

I wish, on behalf of the Board, to thank you very much for your resolution, and I can assure you that your Directors give every attention to the interests of The Dominion Bank.

Mr. D'Arcy Martin, K.C.—Mr. Chairman: I beg to move "That the thanks of this meeting be given to the General Manager, and other officers of the Bank, for the efficient performance of their respective duties."

We all know that we have a hard-working and able General Manager, and his example permeates all the way through the staff. It is interesting to recall that this is the twentieth year that Mr. Bogert has held his present position, and I think I may, on behalf of the Shareholders, extend to him our congratulations on the success of his labours and the high standing the Bank enjoys in the community. The last few years have been extremely arduous for the Banks, and I think the fact that this Bank has successfully weathered all the storms that have blown is due to the character and ability of the chief executive officers. I am glad to be able to bear personal testimony to the General Manager. I have known Mr. Bogert for over forty years, the Assistant General Manager for a great many years and likewise, many of the other chief officers of the Bank.

Our thanks are also due to the Branch Managers—the men on the firing line—and the rank and file of the staff generally, for their loyal co-operation, without which it

would be quite impossible for the Bank to be in the position which it is. I want them to know that they are greatly appreciated by the Shareholders.

Mr. C. W. Band—I have pleasure in seconding that motion. (Carried.)

Mr. C. A. Bogert—Mr. Martin, Mr. Band and the Shareholders present: I wish, on behalf of all the staff of all ranks, to express our sincere gratitude for the very kind way in which this resolution has been moved, seconded and received. It must be obvious to the Shareholders that whatever has been achieved in producing the Balance Sheet presented to you to-day, could not have been accomplished without the co-operation of all members of our organization. During 1925 the staff of The Dominion Bank performed their duties with that zeal and that loyalty that has been characteristic of them ever since the Bank started.

Mr. Martin has made kindly reference to my occupying my present position for the last twenty years. It is interesting to recall that while The Dominion Bank has at the present time a staff of 1,100, twenty years ago, when this same resolution was passed, it numbered only 330.

I am going to ask two members of our organization from different parts of the country to respond: Mr. Boughner, who very capably looks after your interests at Kitchener, Ont., and Mr. Sheffield, who is in charge of one of our "outposts" and is your representative at Edmonton, Alta.

Mr. R. D. Boughner—Mr. Chairman: I have only a word in response to this resolution. Annually you vote us your thanks, and to you it may seem a matter of form, but to us it is a very important matter. As has been stated, the past year was not an easy one; however, that does not discourage us—I cannot in twenty years' experience recall an easy year. I remember being thrilled twenty years ago by that vote of thanks; it seemed to me that it assured my future in The Dominion Bank. In later years I came to the conclusion that this resolution was something more than a resolution of thanks—it was possibly a motion of confidence, and taking it in that way, I want to express the appreciation of the 1,100 employees of the Bank. I think I am safe in saying that one hundred per cent. of us have a hobby, and that hobby is The Dominion Bank—and, as

you know, there is no length to which a man will not go for his hobby. With that in mind, I speak for the whole staff and say that you have our grateful thanks, and the future, so far as we can make it for you, is assured. I thank you very much on behalf of the staff.

Mr. W. N. Sheffield—Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen: It gives me a great deal of pleasure to be associated with my Eastern colleague, Mr. Boughner, in expressing the appreciation of the staff for the resolution just passed. I would like to take this opportunity of assuring the Shareholders of the loyalty of the officers who serve them in the West, and I am glad to be able to bring you a message from Western Canada of much improved conditions. We look forward to the future with a great deal of confidence. I thank you for the resolution.

Dr. F. LeM. Grasett—I beg to move “That the poll be now opened for the election of twelve Directors, and that the same be closed at two o’clock in the afternoon, or so soon before that hour as five minutes shall elapse without any vote being polled, and that the Scrutineers, on the close of the poll, do hand to the Chairman a certificate of the result of the poll.”

Mr. P. A. Keeler—I have much pleasure in seconding that resolution. (Carried.)

After the Ballot was taken the Scrutineers reported that the following had been elected Directors: Messrs. A. W. Austin, C. S. Blackwell, C. A. Bogert, R. J. Christie, R. Y. Eaton, E. W. Hamber, Wilmot L. Matthews, R. S. McLaughlin, W. W. Near, F. Gordon Osler, A. T. Reid and H. H. Williams.

The meeting then adjourned.

At a subsequent meeting of the Directors, Mr. Austin was elected President, Mr. Bogert, Vice-President and Mr. Blackwell, Chairman of the Board.
