The Assistant General Manager, at the request of the Chairman, read the Report of the Directors and the Statement of Affairs.

### THE REPORT.

The Directors have pleasure in submitting to the Shareholders their Thirty-third Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Affairs of the Bank as on 30th April, 1908, together with the result of the operations of the Bank for the year which ended on that day.

The net profits of the year, after making full provision for all bad and doubtful debts, for interest on unmatured bills under discount, for the usual contributions to the Pension and Guarantee Funds, and also for the Special contribution to the Pension Fund of \$25,000 authorized under By-law No. 28, and for the payment of all Provincial and other Taxes, amounted to ~~\$724,175.07~~, which has been applied as follows:

THE PRESIDENT.—Gentlemen, you have heard the formal Report. Now, the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account should also be read, if you care to have them read, or—you have the figures before you—would any gentleman suggest we dispense with reading the figures?

(Assent was given that the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account should be taken as read).

THE PRESIDENT.—Gentlemen, in rising to move the adoption of this Report I want first to explain that the large number of Branches that were opened in Ontario during the year are the result of the liquidation of the Sovereign Bank. We took over from them a number of their Branches, six or seven of them, necessitating of course, a considerable outlay on our part by way of fixing up these offices, supplying them with stationery and modern safes and so on, altogether it has entailed upon us considerable expense, all of which has been met out of the profits of the year.

### BANK NOTE CIRCULATION.

The bank note circulation of the Dominion as on the 30th of April, 1908, was \$66,713,000, as compared with \$72,841,000 on the same day in 1907. This is the direct result of the crop failure throughout the Northwest Provinces and is not to be wondered at, the grain output of the three Northwestern Provinces in the year 1907 being nearly fifty millions of bushels less than the yield of 1906. Our very latest reports from the Northwest indicate the existence of the best weather conditions and the probability of a very large yield for 1908, which will, we believe, compensate for the disappointments of 1907.

The acreage under crop in the three Northwest Provinces in 1906 was 7,900,000 acres, in 1907 it was 8,300,000, in 1908 the acreage is estimated at 9,500,000, but the yield in 1907 was only 165,000,000 bushels, as compared with

212,300,000 bushels in 1906. Fortunately, the price of grain was much higher in 1907 than in 1906, but, notwithstanding this, there was a falling off in the net cash receipts from the crop of about \$20,000,000. These figures refer only to grain and do not provide for the reduction in the value of cattle exported during the year, which, I am informed, amounted to nearly two millions of dollars.

The reduction in the value of the Western grain crops has been in some measure compensated for by the increase in the output of minerals throughout the Dominion, which has grown in value from \$79,000,000 in 1906 to \$86,000,000 in 1907. The shipments from the Cobalt district alone have increased in value from \$136,000 in 1904 to over \$6,300,000 in 1907.

### DEPOSITS OF THE BANKS.

There has been a falling away in the total deposits of all the banks in Canada during the year equal to about 4 per cent. of the amount on deposit in 1907. The reduction in our deposits did not reach that proportion, and, moreover, was occasioned mainly by the liquidation of deposits at the credit of Provincial Governments required for development purposes. On the other hand, there has been an actual increase of several thousands in the number of our deposit customers. There has been a reduction in the average balance at the credit of each individual depositor traceable to the disappointing harvest in the Northwest (with which we are so closely identified), to strikes, lockouts and other labor troubles, and to the cheapness of securities, which induced depositors to increase their fixed investments. The increase of over 7,000, the bulk of whom were savings depositors, in the total number of depositors is, on the other hand, very promising, and will bear fruit under normal conditions.

### RESERVES WERE MAINTAINED.

We have throughout the year maintained large cash reserves. We have held ourselves prepared for every contingency. We have kept strong beyond criticism, and in a position to take advantage of any improvement in trade conditions. We have maintained an average actual cash reserve in gold, Government notes and cash balances with other banks at home and abroad of nearly 26 per cent. of our liabilities, or \$1,000,000 more than during any previous year, in addition to which our other liquid assets by way of call loans, Government, municipal and railway securities equalled another 22½ per cent.

### PENSION AND GUARANTEE FUNDS.

You will have noted that, in addition to the ordinary annual appropriations to guarantee and pension accounts amounting to \$7,500, we have charged to the profits of the year the special contribution to the pension fund of \$25,000, which under by-law 28 you were good enough to grant at the last annual meeting.

The pension fund has now a substantial existence and we are in hopes that before long the accumulations from the annual grants from the bank and from contributions from the staff will enable us to put into operation the policy, which you have approved of, of providing for aged and other members of the staff deserving of consideration.

### SHAREHOLDERS OF THE BANK.

The number of shareholders has increased steadily. In 1906 there were 956 shareholders. In 1907 there were 1,113 shareholders. In 1908 there are 1,278 shareholders. The increase during the past year has been, I think, greater than in any previous year.

### IMMIGRATION AND CRIME.

In the year 1901 the native-born of Canada represented about 86 per cent. of the total population of the country; those born in the Empire outside of Canada represented 8 per cent. of the total; the proportion of foreign-born, including United States Americans, was about 6 per cent. The number of those born outside of the British Empire has increased very largely during the past few years, but we have the satisfaction of knowing that the proportion of British and Canadian born to the whole has held its own. It is estimated by the census office at Ottawa that on March 31, 1908, the total population of Canada was then 6,863,500, as compared with 5,371,000 in 1901.

An analysis of the number of persons convicted of offences and crimes throughout the country indicates that a very large proportion of the crimes have been committed by those born outside of the Dominion. This may be the result of enforced or encouraged emigration of undesirables to Canada at the instigation of foreign Governments, and perhaps even of British Justices, but even allowing for this the frequency of crime amongst the immigrants is out of all reasonable proportion to their numbers. Greater care and supervision should be, and, I understand, is being exercised in excluding from the Dominion the undesirables of other countries.

During the year 1906 there were 8,092 persons convicted of crime in the Dominion, of whom fully 28 per cent., if not 35 per cent. (the birthplace of 15 per cent. is not given, but a large proportion of these were probably outsiders) were born outside of Canada, as compared with a percentage of "outside" born in the whole Dominion of only 14 per cent.

It may be interesting to state that the population of the Northwest Provinces increased from 419,512 in 1901

to 808,863 in 1906; of the latter 70.21 were British (including Canadian) born, 11.22 were born in the United States, and 18.57 were born elsewhere.

### U.S. FISCAL CRISIS.

During the year we have had to contend with a great fiscal crisis in the United States which resulted in an almost universal suspension of payments by the banks of that country, accompanied by extreme stringency in the money markets of London and other European financial centres and by depression in the value of Government, municipal and railway securities, necessitating, moreover, the maintenance of larger and comparatively unproductive cash reserves.

The decline in the value of the bonds of fifteen leading railways of the United States during the last two years has amounted to an average of nearly sixteen points, a greater decline than occurred during the depression of either 1893 or 1896, and 1893 witnessed the most severe crisis and industrial depression the United States has ever suffered.

The depression of 15% in the value of United States securities is not unparalleled. I have here a memorandum showing that the depression in British Consols between 1896 and 1906 amounted to 28 $\frac{1}{8}$ %.

British Consols fell 28 $\frac{1}{8}$ % inside of a period of eight years.

We have throughout the year pursued a conservative policy, placing more value upon a permanent reputation as a strong, vigorous institution in readiness to meet normal and abnormal conditions than upon one more brilliant for the moment, but acquired by the realization of large profits upon underwritings, speculations and other "thin ice" performances which sooner or later have their day of reckoning.

Our banking system has had a severe test; weak institutions have been wiped out none too soon. We may, I think, look upon the stringency and depression as a blessing in disguise. If so-called prosperity and expansion had continued much longer the destructive, if not ruinous, effects of the failures which have occurred would have been still more disastrous and more widespread.

### SPECIAL APPROPRIATION.

In setting aside \$100,000 out of the profits of the year as a fund to provide for actual and possible reductions in the market valuation of our investments, as distinguished from ordinary loans and discounts, we have followed the example of the great English banks and we think we have done a wise thing. During the past year the sum of £1,300,000 was set aside by eleven English banks and applied in writing down the valuation at which consols and other reserve securities were held on their books. The shrinkage in values is not likely to last and with improving conditions we look for a reaction and a recovery which we hope will later on place the fund at our disposal.

I take this opportunity of stating that, notwithstanding the condition of the money market and the terrible shrinkage in values of almost all Government, railway and industrial securities which form the collateral upon which call and time loans are made to brokers, we have not lost nor have we had occasion to provide one dollar even in anticipation of loss through our loans and advances on the security of stocks and bonds to brokers and others.

### CONCLUSION.

There is every indication of a magnificent harvest throughout the Northwest; nothing could be of greater service to us and to every Canadian banking institution and we hope when we meet you next year to demonstrate

that we have not only been able, but also willing, through our own resources, to avail ourselves of the opportunities to take on a full share of the increased trade which must follow upon agricultural prosperity. Our most recent information is from Winnipeg, dated only yesterday, and to the following effect:

“69,500,000 acres under crop this year. Crop prospects are most favorable.”

I beg, gentlemen, to move the adoption of the Report. (Applause.)

HON. ROBERT JAFFRAY.—Mr. President and gentlemen: in seconding the adoption of the Report it is unnecessary after the able, lucid, comprehensive and instructive remarks made by our President for me to say much to you. In fact, I will just say that the statement before you is the best speech that can be made by any of us; and I think that, considering the year we have had and the depression and the difficulties we have had to contend with in banking, we may congratulate ourselves in having such a statement to present to you. I take the opportunity of saying that we owe to our President and General Manager a debt of gratitude for the insight and far-reaching view he took at an early day of the financial depression of 1907-8 and against which he so vigorously provided. Some of us thought he was almost too careful, but he is able to say to us now, “I told you so.” His action has been fully justified by the results. You can all understand that in keeping large cash reserves there is not the same immediate profit as in pursuing a different policy, but I think that the results to the shareholders ultimately will be even better than anything that could have been made by straining a point. There were so many contingencies that possibly might arise that the great point we had to consider was the safety of your investment; and I am sure that all the

shareholders will feel under great obligation to the President and Board for having taken as our motto, "Safety First;" and in following that policy it must be remembered that indirectly it is of the greatest benefit to the community generally, because had it not been for the care that the older and better experienced banks took of the situation, we might have had a financial disaster such as occurred in the States. It is owing to the care and prudence with which our national institutions have been managed that Canada has come through the recent crisis very satisfactorily.

We, as shareholders, have a right to feel gratified that the amount of bad debts that we have had to provide for has been so small and that we as a Board are able to present to you a clean sheet and assure you that there is nothing hidden, there is nothing behind, there is no skeleton in the closet. I give our President credit for taking very good care that if there is anything wrong in connection with an account it is immediately loaded upon the Board. You cannot catch him having a personal responsibility that belongs to us any longer than he can help. I think he is wise in his generation.

I would also say that you may have any Board of Directors you like, but if your officials are not true to the interests of your institution your Board is very helpless and can do but little; and I can say with the utmost confidence that there is no bank or public institution better served by its officials than the Imperial Bank of Canada. They are faithful to it, they are able, they are intelligent; and that is a great comfort to the Board, and must be to you as shareholders. I have much pleasure in seconding the adoption of the Report. (Applause.)

THE PRESIDENT.—Gentlemen, you have heard the motion. Has any gentleman anything to say before the motion is put?

It is moved by myself, and seconded by the Hon. Mr. Jaffray that the Report which has been read be adopted, printed, and circulated among the shareholders.

MR. JOHN T. SMALL.—Mr. President. At the last meeting I ventured to make a suggestion on the subject of the distribution of the profits of the Bank. I thought something might be said about it to-day in the Report, or by yourself, Mr. President, but nothing has been said. The suggestion was this, that a dividend might be fixed—not a high dividend—as the regular annual dividend to be paid by the Bank; and that when the profits of the year and the position of the Bank in regard to all its obligations justify it, as is done in the case of stable banks in England, so here the net profits should be divided; the full Rest having been already provided for, the profits should be divided among those who are perhaps best entitled to them. We find in England, with the low rates of interest which money earns, that the banks divide large dividends. Since last year I have taken the trouble to make some enquiries lest I should have misled you last year. I have here the report of one of the large banks in London. Last year they divided  $17\frac{1}{2}\%$ . I have here also the report of another bank where they divided  $18\%$ . And I know of cases where even larger percentages have been declared.

I don't pretend to be an expert banker but I have consulted many who are. I do not see on what principle our Bank should not adopt the policy that when the reserve is equal to the capital, or even less than that, and where the Bank is in a perfectly stable position, the net profits should not be divided. Those net profits are the property of the shareholders, and I think should be divided among them.

MR. SMALL also suggested that the Annual Statement presented to shareholders of banks should indicate the gross profits of the Bank, showing all deductions therefrom,

including those for bad and doubtful debts, cost of management, investment in bank premises, etc.

THE PRESIDENT.—We are much obliged for the suggestions. As to the one regarding an increased rate of dividend, I do not think that it would have been wise on our part to have advanced our dividend during the year.

MR. SMALL.—I did not ask for that. I spoke of the principle.

THE PRESIDENT.—The principle has been, I think, practically adopted. In increasing our dividends from time to time we have gone as near as we thought was prudent in the division of the profits. As I said last year, in this country investments are not of as stable a character as they are in England and a division of all profits would not be advisable. Even in England an old substantial bank had during the past year to take away £100,000 from its Rest, irrespective of taking all its surplus profits, to make good the depreciation in its investments. That is the case even where there are consols and government securities of all nations of the world to invest in and lend on at profitable rates.

Regarding the suggestion that a statement of gross profits instead of net profits should be put before you, I fear that in doing so we would not be helping your interests. You must trust the Board and the Management to place before you a true statement of affairs. I don't know of any bank in England or elsewhere that lays bare to the world the extent of its losses and appropriations for bad debts.

THE PRESIDENT put the motion to adopt the Report, which, on a vote having been taken, was declared carried.

MR. W. R. BROCK.—Mr. President, it is with a great deal of pleasure I make the following motion: That the thanks of the shareholders are due and are hereby tendered to the President, Vice-President and Directors of the Bank for their services during the past year.

I wish merely to say a word in connection with the remarks of the previous speaker. The stockholders of this and of all other companies have it always in their own hands to see that the business has been properly attended to; they should elect the proper Directors and if any of them are found to be incompetent they should be changed. No business in the world could be as well managed by the whole body of stockholders as it could be by a number of gentlemen selected for the purpose, if those men are men of experience. If you throw it broadcast, as the President says, and every little detail of your business is published in the papers and made use of—and we know what use is made of it at times—I think it would be most disastrous to any financial institution. You would find you would reduce the number of your shareholders if that kind of thing were to be done. I would strongly object to stockholders taking the management of a bank into their own hands. I beg to move the vote of thanks to the President and Vice-President and the Board of Directors of this Bank, which I think they certainly deserve for their services during the past year.

REV. MR. PATERSON.—I have much pleasure in seconding the motion.

THE PRESIDENT.—I suppose I should ask some other gentleman to take the chair, as the motion is a vote of thanks to myself and others; but I shall have to follow the usual routine and ask you if the motion meets with your approval. (Motion carried with applause.)

THE PRESIDENT.—Gentlemen, I am very much obliged to you for this motion. I can assure you that during the past year we have not had an idle moment. We have had frequent meetings. We have never gone a week without a meeting and very often we have had two and three meetings in one week. The attendance of the

Directors has been most exemplary; gentlemen have come here from St. Catharines, from Quebec and from elsewhere; one gentleman has come from Scotland, is with us for a month in each year and is of great assistance to us on the other side of the water during the remaining eleven months. We have a large Board, all of whom are here to-day with the exception of Mr. William Whyte, Vice-President of the Canadian Pacific Railway; he, unfortunately, has been abroad, and has just returned to Winnipeg. We feel that unless we have your thanks and appreciation of our services our work goes for nothing. The remuneration of a Director does not commence to repay him for his responsibility and for the care and time which he gives to his trust. I should be glad if one or two of the Directors who are here sitting to my right and left would express their thanks to you. I will call upon Mr. Turner and Mr. Osborne.

MR. J. K. OSBORNE.—Mr. Chairman and gentlemen, I can only join with the President in saying that it is very nice for us to have your appreciation of anything we have been able to do during the past year. As the President has said, the work of a Director is not a very light task, we have frequent meetings of long duration; and as Mr. Jaffray has said, the President and General Manager of the institution is always very ready to put everything before his Directors so that they will share responsibility with him. The policy of the Imperial Bank of Canada for a long time has been the same. It has been our effort during the past year to carry out that policy, which, as the financial world knows very well, is to keep strong and be in a position to meet any emergency, whether normal or abnormal.

I can only thank you, gentlemen, for your kindness in expressing your feelings.

HON. RICHARD TURNER.—Gentlemen, I am sure it has been a great pleasure to listen to the General Manager's Report. More or less of that Report the Directors had a knowledge of beforehand. I don't suppose that in the commercial history of Canada, or I might almost say of the United States and the world, has there been such a crisis as has taken place this past year. During that period ordeals have been severe, the crisis was sudden, and when we reflect and look back upon the position which Canada took as compared with the United States, I think it is the duty of every citizen of this Dominion, and more especially of those who hold stocks in the different banks, to look with pride at the way in which our banking system stood the test to which it was put. We have had failures in the past year. The Sovereign Bank, through its efforts to become a large institution too quickly, suddenly collapsed. The position the banks took in Canada—the chief and larger banking interests—saved the situation. There is no institution of which I am a Director that I feel prouder of than the Imperial Bank of Canada. I consider it a credit to the City of Toronto and I am quite sure that every stockholder here looks upon it in the same light as I do. Our securities are well administered and all matters are scrutinized with the closest detail.

I have very great pleasure indeed in thanking you, gentlemen, for your vote of thanks to the Board of Directors. I may state on behalf of myself and the others that we shall attend to our work and we shall endeavour to assist the General Manager all we can. (Applause).

It was moved by MR. I. J. GOULD and seconded by MR. ÆMILIUS BALDWIN that the thanks of the shareholders be given to the General Manager, Assistant General Manager, and the other officers of the Bank, for their attention to the interests of the Bank, and for the efficient performance of their respective duties.
