FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1946

The Directors of the company submit the Balance Sheet as at 31st December 1946 together with a comparative statement of Protit and Loss Account and the report of the company's auditors.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The company's operations for the year 1946 resulted in a net profit of \$93,452 after payment of all expenses and fixed charges, as compared with a net profit of \$85,229 for the year 1945, and for comparative purpases the following figures are submitted for the years 1943 to 1946 inclusive.

The total revenue for the year 1946 showed an increase of \$118,008 over 1945, an increase of 19.4%.

Power sales amounted to \$543,318 as compared with \$471,613 in the preceding year.

The sales to residential and commercial customers have increased steadily for many years. This trend was continued in 1946 and the increase in revenue from these sources amounted to \$28,032,00, or 8.9% over 1945. Sales to such clients accounted for 62.8% of the total power sales.

During the latter part of the year, some difficulties were experienced by the company as a result of an extremely low rain fall in the summer and fall, but in spite of this the company's earnings, both gross and net, were at an all-time high. The situation has now been rectified by the installation of two 1,600 h.p. Diesel Generators at Rimouski and will further be improved by the completion of the new 6.000 h.p. hydro-electric plant. The two plants will almost double the company's generating capacity and give a flexibility of operation not formerly possessed so that, it is estimated, a further demand about twice the present demand could be met even in low water periods.

In the report of the Directors for the year 1945, reference was made to the fact that the company had the matter of standard profits under review with the Department of National Revenue and a satisfactory award has now been obtained. As a result of this, an amount of \$112,267.97 has been returned to surplus account from the reserve for excess profits taxes, and the estimated refundable portion of excess profits tax, which was calculated on the maximum tax liability, has been reduced substantially. The statement of profit and loss submitted with this report includes the results for the year 1945 for comparative purposes, and as indicated therein the tax provision for 1945 is stated at the corrected amount.

The attached balance sheet reflects the fact that the company is in the process of building a new hydro-electric plant, which is referred to later in this report, and for that purpose the company has resorted to temporary loans. Since the end of the year the company has sold an additional \$1,000,000 par value of its first mortgage bonds to reimburse it for expenditures already made and to provide funds to complete the projects now underway.

EXPANSION PROGRAMME

The company presently supplies electric service to 12,169 customers representing an increase of 1,446 over the previous year.

During the year, electric service was extended to four municipalities making a total of seventy-one communities now served, having a population in excess of 118,000.

The programme for the year included the construction of 117 miles of rural distribution lines and the continuation of the new 6,000 h.p. hydroelectric power development, undertaken in the previous year, on the Metis River at a site located approximately one and one quarter miles downstream from the Metis Falls plant. However, due to difficulties in procuring materials and equipment, only 76 miles of lines were put in service, and it is estimated that the Lower Metis River power plant will be completed in June 1947.

Capital expenditures, during the year, for the construction of the new hydro-electric plant and for the additions and extensions to existing facilities amounted to \$1,300,832.

GENERAL

The Directors are pleased to report that an employee pension plan was established during the year. Pensions at normal retirement age to a maximum of \$1,200 per year are to be purchased from the Annuity Branch of the Federal Department of Labour. The company is contributing the full amount of the cost of past service annuities and will contribute an amount equal to the contribution of an employee for future service.

The Group Assurance Plan was extended during the year to cover hospitalization and surgeons' fees for our employees and their dependents.

The Directors wish to record their appreciation of the loyal and efficient support of the personnel of the organization which has made possible the satisfactory results of the year's operations.

A map of the territory served by the company, together with charts showing the growth of power sales and investments in utility plant, are appended to this report.

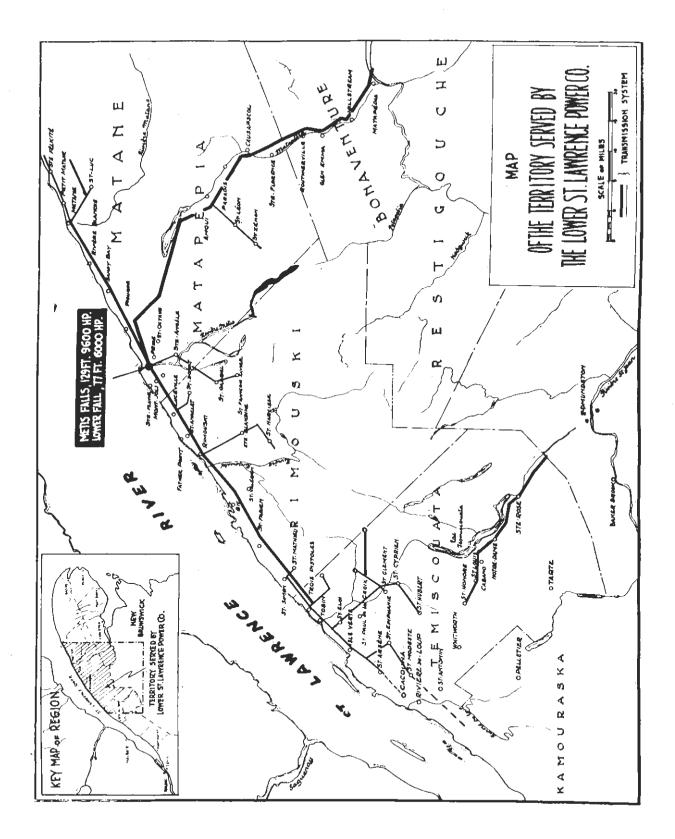

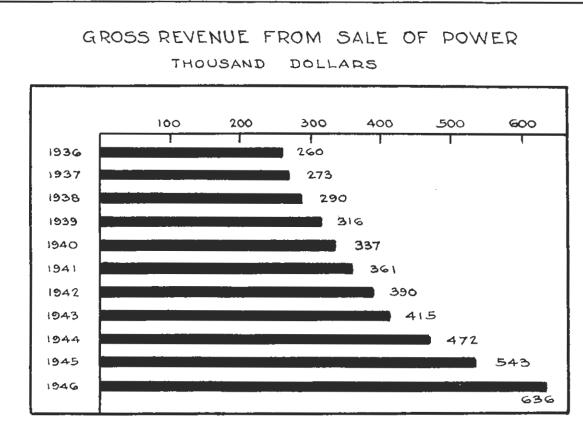
