I am settling up my account for the trip  
abroad. You will remember that I took out a letter of  
credit for five thousand dollars which I have just sent this  
letter of credit, which shows a balance of \$3486.00, to  
Mr. Bentley and enclose a copy of the statement I am  
sending him. You will see that I am also enclosing my  
I personal cheque for \$451.35. This, together with the ex-  
penditure, \$1470.67 balanced the five thousand dollars ori-  
ginally placed in the letter of credit. \$00.00 for  
travel to Montreal, Paris.

It should little to explain to you further  
the items of expenditure which appear in this statement.

\$1396.00 was deposited in the Bank of Montreal to the ac-  
count of Welles Bosworth, Esquire, Special. This money

to be deposited into the account of Mr.  
Bosworth will be expended by him to defray the cost of  
copying the statue by Barrias. We enclose an extra copy  
of the agreement entered into between Bosworth, who is a well-  
known American architect, and myself. The sculptor  
who was secured by Mr. Bosworth to copy the statue is Mr.  
Adolphe Galli. We enclose a copy of the agreement entered  
into by Galli and myself for the payment of fifty thousand  
francs when the copy of the statue is finished. The depo-  
sit of 39,012 francs (\$1396.00) which was deposited to the  
account of Mr. Bosworth on November 30th 1932, is to be paid  
over by him to Galli as the work proceeds.

Letter to Dr. Martin continued.

As you will see from the copy before the letter I am sending Mr. Bentley, I am asking him to send to Mr. Bosworth \$125.00 in American dollars. This is in accordance with the agreement which I entered into with Mr. Bosworth, by which he is to supervise the reproduction and attend to the shipment of the statue for a fee of \$250.00, of which one half was due at the beginning, and the final \$125.00 will be due upon the arrival of the statue here.

To receive a sum now I find it necessary to say that Mr. Bosworth has secured the permission of the French government to have the statue copied and he has attended to the removal of the statue from the Louvre to the studio of Mr. Galli. I find a well-known American architect who was recommended to me by Mr. Abraham Flechner. I have further instructed Mr. Bentley to forward a money order for 20,500 francs to be deposited to the Wm. Bosworth, Esquire, Special Account in the Bank of Montreal, Paris.

This will be paid over by Mr. Bosworth to Mr. Galli when necessary and will cover, I presume, the incidental expenses of shipping from to finish it in bronze as \$0.250.

With regard to the bust of Hughlings Jackson which is now placed in the National Hospital, Queen Square, London; this is being done under the direction of Michael Hampton, son of the original sculptor. He is supervising this without charge but it was necessary to buy from the widow of the sculptor the copyright of the statue. An agreement was made to pay \$300.00 for this copyright and \$10.00, as mentioned above, was paid on this account to Mrs. Hampton. On the completion of the statue there will be \$20.00 (not to pay) Mr. Hampton has secured the services of A. B. Burton, Bronze Statue Founder, who has undertaken to make a cast of the marble bust for \$36.10.00. This will be payable upon completion of the copy. The cost of the reproduction of the bust of Jackson and the reproduction of the statue by Barrias is to be defrayed from the departmental budget, according to our previous discussion.

Letter to Dr. Martin continued.

We need anticipate in the future only the following payments in connection with the copying of the two statutes:

(1) The balance of \$125.00 American money, to Mr. Bosworth.

(2) The sum of £20.0.0 for balance of copyright, to Mrs. Hampton.

(3) The sum of £36.10.0 for copying the Jackson bust, to Mr. A.B. Burton.

I hope that this meets with your approval. I hold receipts which cover the above expenditure.
