Enclosed you will find a comparison of the operations carried out in 1930 with those of 1927. The mortality for the more dangerous operations, including those for brain tumors, tic douloureux, epilepsy and laminectomy, is shown by twenty-seven deaths in one hundred and thiry-one operations. I have not listed the deaths for the less dangerous procedures such as ventriculograms.

The activity of the department is described in the Royal Victoria Hospital Annual Report for 1930, page 88. In addition to those mentioned there, there are at present three technicians, one nurse and two secretaries.
