Our first 2 days we messed with an artillery group near us - both seen officers + men. It is a Canadian unit too.

At Present Humphreys is in London on leave with Dr^c Cormick. 2 padres + our dental attachee also. They are about the last with leave here.

The people of this country are admirable in their resolute patience and in complaining assistance in carrying on as usual, - content to dodge bombs - in their shelters but to

at once resume ordinary life
processes. The weather is mostly
beautiful here - but occasional
regional showers of short duration
act like punctuations to the rhythm
of Sunshine, beautiful cloud + Sunset
~~effect~~ rhythms with a wonderfully
beautiful countryside for theme.

I ardently echo your terse sentence
"I wish I were with you". We all do.
No one is down-hearted, but
your aura of restfulness and
basic reassurance would be
most welcomed.
