Jan 7. Operation Lt. Osteoplastic Craniotomy

Jan 14. W.P. to R.Q. William clearing up amazingly after the series of attacks. Aphasia now only anarthria. Rt. hand still clumsy. "It is obvious that it was that it was the return of the nerves toward normal that brought them into an irritable stage Sunday and gave us the fireworks which we witnessed during the day. He was conscious during these convulsions and remembers it all now. ... recovering from the anaemia caused by shutting of the blood vessels.

March 18, 1930.

"It seems clear that the area in which we did most of the stimulating with galvanic current before the attack is not that in which the anaemia appeared."
