Dear Dr. Martin,

I am enclosing a very tentative estimate of the cost of equipping a neuro-surgical laboratory; of adding certain necessary things to the operating room equipment and certain clinical operations - for the Royal Victoria Hospital.

I am quite sure that some of the estimates are too high and that in certain instances such as desks, typewriter and so on, something may be saved by getting second hand apparatus. Mowever, I am equally sure that many items are not included and that some of the estimates are too low. Three years ago, I equipped this laboratory here, and have a pretty clear general idea of what the equipment cost.

Dr. Russell bas offered to have his Zeiss microphotographic apparatus put in the laboratory so that it would be only necessary to install a microscope in it and to get the special photographic lense and eyepieces for high magnification in microphotography.

The laboratory must run as an independent unit. It would certainly be necessary to have a first class full time secretary as well as technician. The volume of work should at least, be as great as that in this laboratory and there has never been a time from the day when the laboratory was founded when both secretary and technician had nothing to do.

I have today had a letter from Naffziger of San Francisco, saying that he would like to send on a Dr. Jones, who has evidently been his resident, to study neuropathology. Dr. Frazier of Philadelphia, is also expecting to send Dr. Gardner towwork in the same field. At the moment I do not know of any other voluntary workers but it seems quite possible to me that it will be necessary before long, to add additional equipment for additional workers. I am expecting that there will be three or four regular workers from the neurosurgical service in the laboratory. The addition of Dr. McKay and one assistant who expect to work up interesting material from the Montreal General and of Dr. Russell if he dicides to work in the

laboratory, will bring up the number quite considerably. I want to thank you for your sympathetic help in these various arrangements.
