Dear Dr. Penfield,

In response to a question put by you during your visit to Montreal, viz., that in the case of some Chief Surgeon being appointed to the Royal Victoria Hospital, would your position as Neurological Surgeon, with all the privileges and monopolies attaching thereto, be in any sense imperilled,-I want to state here definitely that neither the Medical Board nor the Governors of the Hospital would tolerate any breach of an arrangement which hadbeen made with you, viz., to the effect that all neurological surgical work in the Hospital is to be under your direction and care.

I may add, too, that the University would stand by you on this proposition, and that you need have no fear whatsoever that you will have any infringement upon your rights and privileges.
