





This is the second Annual Report submitted by the Anti-dumping Tribunal since coming into force of the Anti-dumping Act on January 1, 1969.

In the past year the Tribunal, pursuant to Section 16 of the Anti-dumping Act, carried out inquiries respecting the following goods:

- (1) Transparent sheet glass from Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Poland, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and Romania;
- (2) Glacé cherries from France;
- (3) Transformers and reactors rated over 500 KVA or KVAR from the United Kingdom, France, Japan, Sweden, Switzerland and the Federal Republic of Germany, and reactors rated over 500 KVAR from Belgium;
- (4) Liquid chlorine from the United States;
- (5) Ethylene glycol based anti-freeze in bulk from the United Kingdom;
- (6) Electric can openers from Japan.

In all cases these inquiries included public hearings where all interested parties had opportunity to make representations.

The findings in these cases are available on request from the Secretary of the Tribunal.
