## Third Annual Report, to March 31, 1947

The Right Honourable C. D. Howe, P.C., M.P., Minister of Reconstruction and Supply.

In accordance with Section 18 of The Surplus Crown Assets Act, the directors of War Assets Corporation submit herewith the third annual report of the operations of the Corporation,

together with balance sheet and statement of accounts as audited by the Auditor-General of Canada covering the fiscal year ended March, 31, 1947.

### PART I - REVIEW OF THE YEAR

#### Accelerating Disposal

The flow of surplus into the hands of War Assets Corporation during the past fiscal year has continued at a high rate, and only towards the end of the year was there any real sign of slackening. As the officers of the Corporation could perceive a gradual easing up of the seller's market, every effort was made to have surplus reported by the custodians as quickly as possible to the Crown Assets Allocation Committee, and that committee in turn streamlined its procedure so that there should be a minimum of delay in turning the surplus, as reported, over to the Corporation. This lessening of demand for surplus is now very apparent, and the policy adopted and maintained by the Corporation of "consistent with orderliness, speed is the essence" has undoubtedly been correct and has paid dividends.

#### Aiding Reconversion

The extent to which the speed of disposal has assisted in reconversion from war to peace cannot be measured either in terms of dollars and cents or in hours and minutes, but taking as examples the shortage of industrial floor space and the long-time delivery position on machine tools, significant facts indicating such assistance are revealed by the following figures :

While the foregoing indicates direct assistance in reconversion, indirect help has been afforded by the sale of surplus equipment and materials in short supply such as motor trucks, steel, scrap, textiles, and so forth.

The revival of industry was also assisted by the camp demolition programme which freed large quantities of materials salvaged from demolished buildings. Arrangements were made between this Corporation and Central Mortgage & Housing Corporation whereby these materials could be readily obtained from the site by Wartime Housing Limited; by the Veterans Land Act Section of the Department of Veterans Affairs; by Housing Enterprises Limited; by Emergency Shelter Projects; by Integrated Contractors (operating under the government housing scheme) and by approved dealers, who buy materials in bulk from the Corporation for subsequent resale to individual veterans building under the Housing Scheme. Over 7-million board feet of lumber were released under this scheme to the priorities mentioned above in the first five months of the plan's operation, and comparable figures on other much needed items were also achieved.

A further contribution which the Corporation made to reconversion was in remodelling surplus buildings in the Montreal and Toronto areas so that they could be operated as multiple tenancy projects. In this way approximately 1,000,000 sq. ft. of badly needed space was made available in which some 7,000 people are now employed.

#### Disposal of "Non-Sealeable" Material

In the middle of 1946, it became clear that there was a vast quantity of material and equipment that could not be sold in its existing form, and in order to ensure that no merchandise was sold as scrap unnecessarily, and to review possible avenues of usefulness before goods were recategorized as scrap, a recategorizing committee, consisting of senior officials of the Corporation, was formed. This committee considers samples and data submitted to it and hands down its decisions to the various divisions of the department concerned.

#### Cost of Sales

It was abundantly clear in the latter part of



1946 that disposals of the larger Crown-owned surplus items were proceeding at such a pace that the gross sales rate achieved during the fiscal year 1946/47 of \$219,205,531.91 could not be expected to carry into 1947/48. Most of the big individual sales were completed by the end of 1946. It therefore seems that the period covered by this report represents the major phase of the expected financial return and that the Corporation is now entering into the period of comparatively small single sales. This is well indicated by the following table of sales invoices issued per month as compared to the gross sales per month:—

As can well be seen, the effort, paperwork and resultant expense of making sales of \$1,000,000 is increasing. The cost of issuing necessary and minimum paperwork to complete a sale of \$100 is essentially the same as that involved in a sale of \$1,000; so the greater the number of invoices for \$1,000,000 of sales the higher will be the expense expressed as a percentage of sales.

In this connection, it is apparent that industry is reaching the end of the period of reconversion. This means also that surplus property will have

to compete more actively with the products of private industry and that disposal of surplus from now on will present more difficulty and yield a lower return.

With the establishment of the accounting manuals as mentioned under the caption "Comptroller's Department" in the Corporation's second annual report, it became possible to set up comparable expense figures, and, using these figures, establish the basis for budgetary standards which will effectively control our expense as our sales volume diminishes. In view of the previous remarks this control is essential, otherwise expenses might easily absorb total revenue.

This question of costs and expenses is dealt with more fully in Part VI of this report.

### Agency & Liaison Arrangements

In order that disposal of particular surplus might be effected with the greatest degree of efficiency in the shortest possible time, the Corporation has entered into or continued agency arrangements with various Crown companies or other authorities. This procedure enables disposals to be effected by those thoroughly experienced in the technical properties and trade values of the goods handled. In this connection, special mention must be made of the service rendered by Park Steamships Limited in the disposal of ships.

In addition, the Corporation has kept contact with many other bodies concerned with disposal activities. Special arrangements have been made to keep in touch particularly with the three services and the various departments of government who are reporting surplus. Liaison is also maintained with the Canadian Federation of Agriculture, trade associations and other bodies interested in the purchasing side of the disposal programme. In this way, relations with trade and industry in all fields have been uniformly harmonious.

## OVERSEAS ACTIVITIES

### Sales of Surplus Located Overseas

Operations in the United Kingdom were concluded in accordance with planning shown in the Corporation's second annual report and the London, England, office was closed as of the end of September, 1946.

The Canadian owned material in Northwest Europe, not required for use by the armed forces in Canada, was not passed to the Corporation for sale as the Department of National Defence was able to negotiate a settlement with the Dutch government, delivering this material to that government as an offset to costs incurred by the army while on Dutch soil. This settlement obviated the necessity for providing guards and a selling organization overseas. Such guards and organization would have been very expensive and difficult to control as can readily

be envisaged, and, as a large proportion of the material was of a warlike character with very little comparative peacetime value, it is considered this method of "settlement-disposal" was eminently satisfactory.

At the end of the year all Canadian owned surplus overseas had been disposed of with the exception of certain stores and buildings in Newfoundland. It is now apparent that this surplus can be sold by mid-1947 and the Newfoundland operation discontinued. As an indication of the expense incurred by the Corporation in handling surplus overseas, approximately \$15,000 per month is currently being spent guarding, sorting and checking surplus material in Newfoundland.

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**INFORMING THE PUBLIC**

The work of the Corporation has been of considerable interest to the country at large, and great importance has been attached to keeping the public informed as fully as possible regarding the objectives and methods of the disposals programme. Officers of the Corporation appeared on numerous occasions between April and August, 1946, before the Special Committee on War Expenditures and Economies of the House of Commons and testified at great length on the affairs of the Corporation.

Insofar as public relations generally are concerned, the policy of the Corporation is to supply information on all aspects of its activities freely and willingly.

The Corporation has broadened its advertising procedure as outlined in the second annual report and has publicized, in the widest possible way, specific surplus available for disposal. The methods used will be referred to more fully in Part IV of this report.

**ORGANIZATION**

The general methods and organization brought into being after August, 1945, have been found to be fundamentally sound, and only minor changes to the organization chart included in our second annual report have been found necessary during the year's operations. An up-to-date chart is included as Appendix "C" to this report.

From a management point of view, the Corporation has been fortunate in the calibre of men it has been able to secure. Unfortunately for the Corporation, however, some of our

senior officers have been offered permanent positions with industry, and the Corporation, having no real possibility of continuing employment has no option but to accept their resignations. Our policy has dictated, however, that in the circumstances of the Corporation, every senior man must have, if humanly possible, at least one understudy and if possible, two. This policy has been fully justified over the year and we have been able to achieve a reasonable continuity of management as a result.

**PLANS AHEAD**

Basic planning for the second and third stages of our operations was completed early in the fall of 1946, the end of the first stage of "large individual sales" being then in sight. The second stage envisages a greater number of warehouse sales, details of which are dealt with

under Part IV of this report. Such sales can be made at a lower cost per dollar return than by following the general policy of the Corporation, and they also afford the public as well as the trade an opportunity to inspect and buy. At the same time there will be an extension of sales



on a bid or offer basis rather than on a fixed price basis. This development becomes essential as our stock of standard and near standard items is exhausted. Establishment of prices on an equitable and reasonable basis is not feasible when dealing with non-standard used goods. The third stage or ultimate disposal arrangements

will probably be effected by collapsing our regional and branch organizations into one warehouse in each region, at which time all supply and sales work will be conducted from that point. Head office will then become a co-ordinating and recording body with limited functions confined to finance and policy decisions.

## PART II - POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

### General

It is again considered advisable to restate that general policies and procedures are being developed, revised, refined and clarified from time to time, so that as large a percentage as possible of our operations can be classified as routine. In other words, when members of the Corporation can refer to the written word and find the answer "how to proceed" under any given circumstances, then that operation is classified as routine.

The publication and clarification of our policies and procedures has progressed at such a pace that a much reduced percentage of our day-to-day operations call for new executive decisions. As stated in our second annual report, "there may always be the individual case in which it appears that the standard policy has not been followed, but these cases are comparatively few and are caused by abnormal circumstances in relation to a specific case". This remark still applies and will continue to do so in the main as a result of varying conditions under which surplus comes into the hands of the Corporation.

### Sales Policies

The general sales policy of the Corporation remains unchanged from that stated in our second annual report. Surplus is distributed through normal commercial channels already in existence and in disposing of surplus declared to it, the Corporation continues to act in accordance with the nine cardinal points first stated in October, 1944. These points were set out in the first annual report, and are as follows:

1. To sell all saleable surpluses at going market prices, but within ceilings set by the War-time Prices and Trade Board;
2. To control the flow of surpluses so as to create the least possible disturbance to the normal economy of the nation;
3. At all times to make every effort to control the price to the user and to reach the user by the shortest feasible route;
4. To keep out of unfair competition with established business;
5. To seek expert advice from industry on price levels and marketing methods, but not to act on such advice to the expense of public interest;
6. To distribute sales uniformly across Canada;

7. To sell abroad in harmony with other governments everything that becomes available abroad and that can be sold there;
8. To keep out the speculator;
9. To recover for the taxpayers, the original investors in these goods, the largest possible cash return upon their investment without interfering with the other eight points mentioned.

### Prices and Conditions of Sale

In line with the general policy as stated, the Corporation makes every endeavour to ensure that sales are made at fair market prices in the light of current market conditions. A basic principle followed is that sales are to be on an "as is-where is" basis to the fullest extent possible. This avoids expense and reduces manpower required to handle surplus. Sales in general are made for cash but limited credit up to thirty days is allowed in approved cases. Exceptions are also made in regard to sale of particular surplus such as large ships, as outlined in the last annual report.

### Methods of Sale

The policy of distributing goods through established trade channels is followed as far as practicable. Other methods of sale are dealt with more particularly in Part IV of this report.

### Priorities

During the early part of the year under review, it became more apparent than ever that the handling of priority claims filed by government departments and other public bodies was not only expensive to administer, but also severely retarded the flow of surplus back to the user. In view of our forecasted increase of "cost of sales" and the known diminution of "volume of sales", the priority system within the Corporation was streamlined in June, 1946. Under this arrangement, the first call on surplus to meet requests was confined primarily to the region in which the surplus was required for use. If the surplus material was not available within that region, then the request was referred to head office, and a review of available stocks was conducted on a Dominion-wide basis, and if suitable material could be located it was offered to fill the request. While this system decentralized the previous procedure of screen-



ing all priority requests at head office and removed our major bottleneck in the speed of disposal, inasmuch as all priority requests did not have to pass through one central point, it still left us with local problems which cost considerable sums to administer and in themselves slowed down our operations. A survey of our decentralized priority operations made during November, 1946, showed the following:

- (i) On each availability report or inventory sheet from which sales are made, there was an average of 15 items.
- (ii) In each region there was an average of 115 different government departments, municipalities, educational institutions and public bodies which file priority requests, and each priority request averaged 20 items.
- (iii) The figures given in (i) and (ii) preceding indicate that each item on each availability report must be screened to determine whether any of the 2,300 items registered for priorities are listed on that sheet and whether, if listed, they are needed to fill a priority request.

As the daily average of availability reports processed was 1,200 per day over the three months during which the investigation was being made, some idea of the magnitude of the problem can be seen.

This sets out the administrative picture of what is involved in giving effect to priorities. So

far, we have not been able to devise any simpler system which would give reasonable results.

As regards cost, it was estimated that in salaries alone, our outlay to administer the scheme would be in the vicinity of \$360,000 per annum, not to mention the cost of rent, light, heat, paper and the probable, but considerable loss in revenue due to surplus arriving late on the market. This latter we cannot estimate, but we do know the earlier our surplus reaches the market the better the price we obtain.

Therefore, in January of this year, it was recommended to the Crown Assets Allocation Committee that priorities in general should be discontinued, but that the Corporation should continue to sell direct to claimants previously having priority status only when suitable surplus was available for sale at the time a priority claimant approached the Corporation with a request to purchase. Under these circumstances the claimant would be recognised as having a prior claim to that surplus.

In making this recommendation, due weight was also given to the fact that a reasonable period had elapsed since surplus has been claimable under the priority system, and it was felt that all major and reasonable priority requests had been met as far as possible.

This recommendation was accepted by the Crown Assets Allocation Committee, and the necessary approval was given to discontinue priorities as soon as the Corporation was in a position to advise all interested parties of the change.

### PART III - OPERATIONS - SUPPLY DEPARTMENT

The Supply Department continued to operate under the direction of a vice-president with a supply manager as his chief assistant. Organized under the supply manager are seven main divisions, namely: Procurement, Plant Clearance, Warehousing, Surplus Property, Reclamation, Traffic and Security, to which was added in September, 1946 an Expense Control Division.

During the year 1946, the functions of this department had been decentralized. In the result, all details pertaining to a particular region are handled by that region with direction and co-ordination of procedures emanating from the head offices of this department, located at Ottawa.

The work of the Supply Department continued to increase until January, 1947, by which time supplies from more than 50% of the declared plants and depots had been taken over by the Corporation.

#### Procurement Division

The assistant supply manager in direct charge of this division is also the executive secretary of

the Crown Assets Allocation Committee. This arrangement enables all surplus listings to be screened promptly and passed for further action.

The table at top of page 10 gives the number of declarations of surplus received through the Crown Assets Allocation Committee by months from January, 1944 to the end of March, 1947.

It will be noted that the peak month for the receipt of declarations was March, 1946, when 2,862 reports were received, and that this declined to 749 in March, 1947.

The number of declarations received is not necessarily a direct measure of the surplus being passed to the Corporation. One report of surplus may well cover a complete plant involving buildings, land, machine tools, etc., having an original cost of \$10,000.00, while another will cover one horse valued at \$25. Nevertheless, the number of declarations received is an indication of the flow of surplus.

#### Plant Clearance Division

This division is responsible for checking all declarations physically before giving clear re-

ceipts to custodians, and the decline in declarations received has enabled it to expedite its work of reporting to the Merchandising Department surplus according to sales classifications.

When it is considered that the surplus which the Corporation is called upon to check was built up over six years and more, it will be appreciated that dealing with this accumulated mass turned over in a short space of time and in large quantities has raised many problems.

The number of declarations received during the year by this division is set out below. There is, however, no direct relation between these figures and the number of declarations received by the Crown Assets Allocation Committee because the original declarations of surplus may require to be split up by locations or, if they include buildings, to be processed in part by the Surplus Property Division of the Corporation.

As stated above, the type and nature of surplus covered by each declaration varies widely and for this reason, the figures given for declarations handled by this division do not provide a true or definite basis for forecasting work still to be done.

In the clearance of surplus the Supply Department has concentrated upon the completion of clearance by location. Any one plant or depot may have a number of declarations and to ensure the clearance of all Crown property a check is made to be sure that all such property has been both declared and cleared.

## Warehousing Division

Warehousing operations have increased during the year. As clearance operations increased, more space for warehousing was required. Although sales action took place in locations where surplus was declared, it was necessary in a great many instances to remove unsold surplus from these locations to warehouses to make the space available for peace-time pursuits.

On March 31, 1946, the number of operating warehouses stood at 35.

The "total occupied area" is inside area only and does not include outside space in which the warehouses are situated nor does it include the motor vehicle compounds used to store motor vehicles when turned over to the Corporation by the services.

This division continued to discharge its functions of providing the Lands and Buildings

On March 31, 1947, the number of operating warehouses stood at 51.

The number of warehouses shows an increase of 16 during the year, and the space occupied increased by 1,256,219 square feet. During the 1946-47 fiscal year 7 warehouses were closed.

Toward the orderly clearance of warehouses a total of 18 have been selected for specially rapid clearance and in which no additional surplus will be stored. These warehouses have been chosen as being the least desirable in respect to location and suitability. The Merchandising Department is concentrating on the liquidation of their stocks.

Owing to the shortage of building materials, plumbing and electric supplies and housing requirements generally, the Corporation has been called upon to arrange for the demolition of certain surplus buildings for the purpose of providing such material for the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, its subsidiaries and its integrated contractors.

This division has direct charge of the physical demolition of such buildings including the ar-

range for demolition by contract, the stock piling of materials and the clearance of such materials to the Merchandising Department. A considerable and experienced staff is required to provide maximum salvage of useable material.

The above figures cover reclaimed materials from demolition operations only and do not include similar materials shipped from ordinary surplus operations.

### Reclamation Division

This division, located at Valleyfield, Quebec, continued in operation although for a period work was confined to one shift. This was during a period of re-organization due to our surplus being diverted in a large degree from U.N.R.R.A. to domestic requirements.

The work calls for the reconditioning of all types of Army, Navy and Air Force clothing and footwear. The table below summarizes production by this plant:

### Traffic Division

This division performs important functions in the distribution and clearing of sales orders through the warehouses and clearance operations, advising in regard to freight classifications and checking all freight bills through representatives in all regions.

## Security Division

The Corporation continues to obtain all security guards from the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires. These guards are all ex-servicemen and the contract with the Corps has been satisfactory. This division also has charge of fire prevention, the Corps supplying men who are experienced in this work.

## Expense Control Division

This Division was set up in September, 1946, to supervise all Head Office and Regional accounts for which the Supply Department is responsible. The Division reports on all expense claims and after full investigation of accounts, certifies the validity of the charges.

## Special Branches

The operations at Prince Rupert and in the North West Territories were sufficiently advanced to permit these branches being included in the operations of the Western Region.

## Newfoundland

Considerable progress was made in the disposal of surplus in this region, which is being cleared in accordance with procedures pertaining to Canadian Regions. Surplus, in considerable quantities, was received from all three branches of the armed forces and by far the greater portion of this surplus has been sold or disposed of locally.

The Supply Department maintained a Plant Clearance Section in St. John's to screen the surplus when declared to the Corporation, the local Sales Division disposing of the material as screened. Special mention should be made of the co-operation received from the Government of Newfoundland, as their assistance aided the Corporation very materially in its disposal action.

It is anticipated that the Corporation will have completed its operations in Newfoundland by the summer of 1947.

## Personnel

On April 1, 1946, personnel employed by this department numbered 3,863 and in addition, there were 661 security guards, making a total of 4,524. On March 31, 1947, the total personnel of the department amounted to 6,198, plus 1,116 security guards, making a total of 7,314 employees. The peak employment was in January, 1947, when a total of 7,828 of all classes were employed by the Supply Department. A reduction of 514 is, therefore, shown by the March 31, 1947, figures.



## PART IV - OPERATIONS - MERCHANDISING DEPARTMENT

### GENERAL

The immense volume of business handled in 1946 taxed the resources of the Merchandising Department, but the organization outlined in the second annual report proved equal to the task and only minor adaptations were necessary. During the fiscal year under review the Corporation disposed of \$219,205,531.91 worth of merchandise, of which this department was directly responsible for \$181,185,438.24. This was done with careful observance of the basic points of policy, enumerated earlier in the report, and with little or no disturbance to industry and employment. In fact, it may be presumed that the Corporation, in using established channels of trade to effect retail sales, actually created *permanent* employment in the distributive trades, as during the shortage of newly manufactured items the surplus flow filled the gap to a degree. This was in addition to other employment created by sales of surplus buildings, machine tools and other like facilities mentioned earlier in this report. Having regard to the

population of the country, the figure attained represents a per capita sale of \$18, and many members of the public are undoubtedly using government surplus without realizing that they are doing so.

To assist in the reconversion of industry, a great deal of attention was given to the prompt and appropriate marketing of machine tools.

Another important item in short supply was scrap metal, and to meet this situation a policy of issuing blanket sales orders to approved scrap dealers in the various areas was instituted. These dealers, having deposited an appropriate sum of money with the Corporation, take delivery of scrap declared in the area, until a certain maximum tonnage has been reached, when they give way to another approved scrap dealer. This arrangement has greatly reduced the number of individual transactions and sales orders previously necessary, and at the same time gives all authorized scrap dealers a fair share of the surplus scrap in their region.

### PRICING & DISTRIBUTION DIVISION

The division of the Merchandising Department into two main groups, (a) Pricing & Distribution and (b) Sales, proved invaluable, as the Pricing & Distribution group by their preparatory investigation of the market, pricing and distribution to the appropriate areas, freed the Sales personnel from the necessity of disentangling such data and permitted them to concentrate on selling. As a result a much higher rate of disposal than would otherwise have been possible was attained. A uniform price structure was also created by this means for all parts of the Dominion.

As indicated in the previous report, the Pricing & Distribution Division is sub-divided into sections, handling grouped or related commodities, and serving these sections is the Pre-Edit Section which arranges the routing of surplus to the appropriate groups and, after pricing has been completed, is responsible for the despatch and record of the various documents to the appropriate region.

An important factor that has received a good deal of attention from the Pricing & Distribution Division during 1946 was the distribution of merchandise across the country in accordance with population, with allowance for distribution from wholesale outlets to the various areas. A study of the accompanying chart shows that a remarkably fair distribution was achieved.

A classification index was published during the summer of 1946, and when surplus is first passed by the Supply Department to the Merchandising Department the type of surplus is segregated into its appropriate classification and listed accordingly. This facilitates handling, and enables a proper control to be exercised over the

merchandise through the various stages of processing, pricing and sale, and also provides a basis from which accurate statistical records can be compiled. There are altogether 61 classifications and approximately 3,000 sub-classifications.

No changes were found necessary in the policy outlined in the second annual report regarding the pricing of material or the terms of sale under which it was disposed of. With few exceptions, no difference in price is set as between manufacturers and dealer organizations, as it was found that when manufacturers were given their applicable overriding discounts on prices, a number of them tended to pick the "cream" from the available list which put the Corporation in the position of endeavouring to obtain higher prices from dealer organizations for merchandise that was in a less satisfactory condition. Hence merchandise refused by manufacturers is now sold to dealers at the manufacturer's figure.

A change was made during the year in regard to the procedure followed when merchandise could not be satisfactorily priced and was offered for sale by sealed tender. Although sealed tenders are occasionally called for, it was found more advantageous to advertise, inviting offers to purchase.

To eliminate delay and to obviate the great difficulty experienced in pricing increasing quantities of non-standard material, arrangements were made to forward the covering documents unpriced to the regions, who disposed of the material in job lots on a bid basis.

A number of agreements have been made with manufacturers' associations on the understanding that the manufacturer re-purchases all

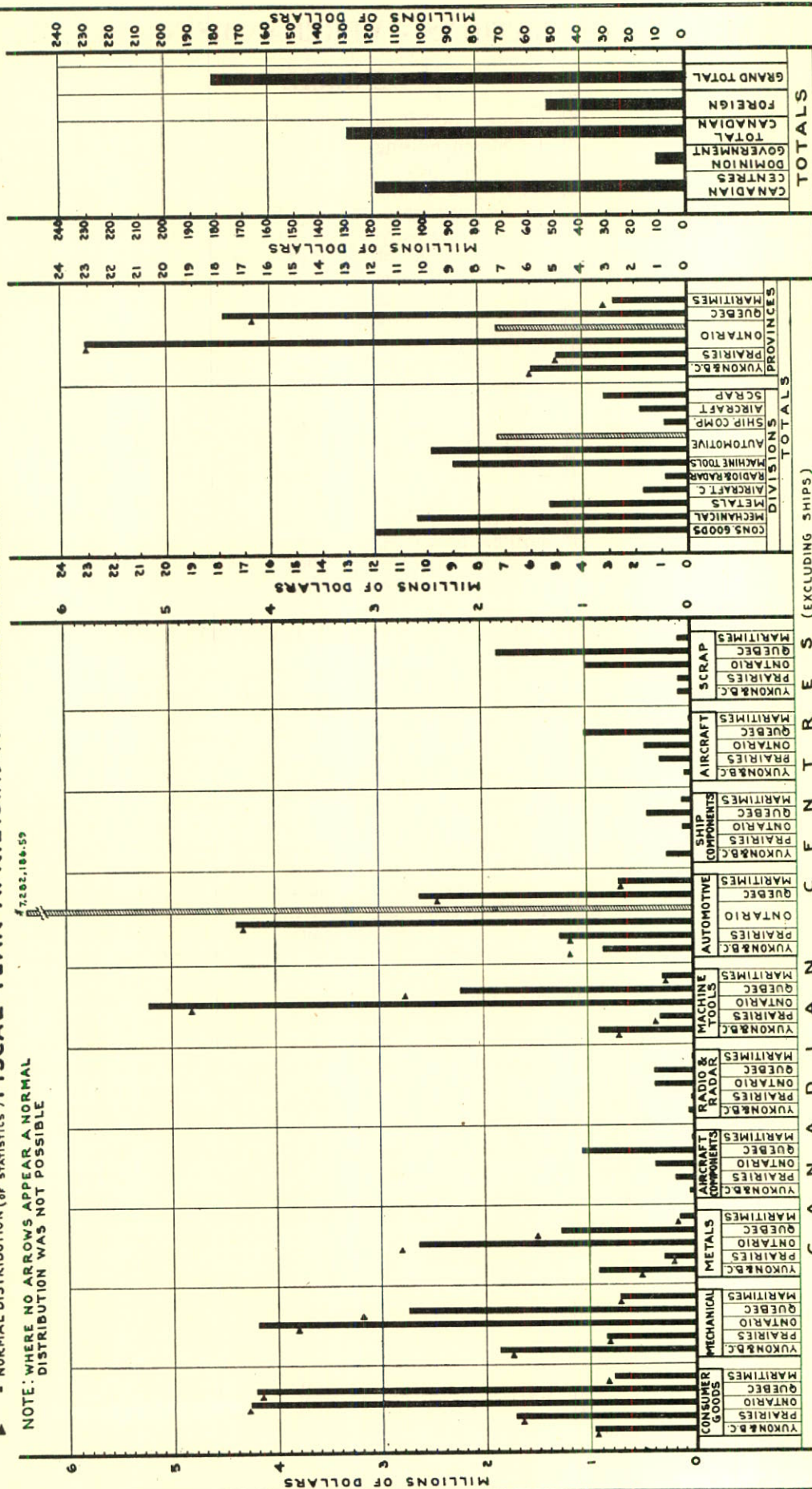
## MERCHANDISING DEPARTMENT DISTRIBUTION OF SALES

material of his manufacture offered to him by the Corporation. This greatly reduces the time factor, the sales expense, and at the same time provides protection for the end user, as the manu-

facturer has a decided interest in servicing his product, he being in the same position as he would have been if the products had been newly produced.

## SALES DIVISION

### Domestic Sales

No change was made in the organization of the Sales Division during 1946 which remains decentralized into five major regions, these in turn being sub-divided into two or more branches.

As the branches became better organized and more familiar with routine procedure, a major reduction in the work in regional offices became possible. This reduction in work enabled the Regional Sales Managers to spend more time supervising the branches and paved the way for the various changes and adaptations necessary as the operations of the Corporation move from one phase to another.

During the year periodic meetings of Regional and Branch and Branch Sales Managers were held to discuss difficulties and to keep field personnel in touch with main policy. It is felt that these were of importance in improving the required sales direction to branch staffs which, in view of a fairly heavy turnover of personnel, presented a problem of some difficulty. This is still a matter requiring a good deal of attention, and is the reason for the recent additions to the staff of the Director of Regional Sales.

The drop in the monthly dollar volume of sales in the fall of 1946 was accompanied by an actual increase of work in the various divisions of this Department, attempts being made to sustain the previous dollar volume by putting through a larger number of smaller sales. As the number of large individual sales steadily decreased each month, it was realized that even the best efforts of all concerned could not maintain the dollar volume at its previous high level. On the other hand it was essential to devise a sales programme that would both speed up the disposal of surplus before the market deteriorated still further and at the same time reduce the expenses involved in achieving such sales. This led to the organization of warehouse clearance "lot" sales.

Another factor in promoting the organization of such sales was the increasing accumulation of non-standard material in warehouses which could be most satisfactorily disposed of in job lots. These sales have been well supported by the public and are effective in clearing locations quickly.

To organize these warehouse sales without disrupting the work of the local Branch Sales Offices, "travelling warehouse sales teams" were organized. These teams are schooled in the necessary routine, are self-contained and are moved from one warehouse to another, as directed by the Regional Sales Manager. What in the first instance proved a complicated operation is gradually becoming a routine one and each

successive sale has disclosed ways and means of simplifying the procedure, reducing the amount of work and time required in preparation, with a consequent reduction in the cost.

A further development of the warehouse clearance "lot" sale is envisaged for the future. At certain key warehouses it is intended to develop these into recurring sales with laid out sample rooms available to the public, who can inspect the merchandise at any time. The size of the lots is calculated to interest the small wholesaler or the retailer though individual members of the public are also free to bid on the merchandise.

The Direct Sales Division insofar as the sections dealing with ships' sales, aircraft sales and special sales continued its operations in the manner indicated in the 1945-46 annual report, but the Machine Tools Direct Sales Section located at head office, was discontinued in the fall of 1946, and these sales are now handled by the major Branch Sales Office in each region assisted by a supervising Machine Tools travelling representative operating from head office.

### Export Sales

The Export Division, which virtually commenced operations only in the spring of 1946, has developed slowly in view of the Corporation's policy of satisfying the demands of the domestic market before permitting merchandise to be allocated for export. However, as new manufactured articles are now reaching the domestic market in larger quantities, more material is being turned over for export. Many difficulties stand in the way of the commercial export buyer, not the least of these being the difficulties of international finance and the cash terms of sale necessarily adopted by the Corporation. Furthermore, a great deal of the merchandise available is of a non-standard variety on which there can be no repeat sales, and merchants are not prepared to spend the time and money necessary for the development of markets if no subsequent supplies of similar commodities will be available to them. However, every effort is being made to open up effective channels of sale for the increasing variety of goods which will become available for export as new production balances domestic demand. The total sales of surplus located overseas and for export topped 60-million dollars for the year, and this figure represents approximately one-quarter of the merchandise sold during the period.

### Special Sections

Market Research and Statistics : Serving both the Pricing & Distribution Division and



the Sales Division is the Market Research & Statistics Section which, as its name indicates, assists Pricing & Distribution by collating data necessary to their operations and by handling the liaison work with the Wartime Prices & Trade Board. It also assists the Sales Division by classifying the data obtainable from sales invoices, thereby enabling the senior officials of the Merchandising Department to direct the efforts of the Sales Division to the best advantage.

**Procedures and Directives :** Similarly, serving both Pricing & Distribution and Sales Division is the Merchandising Procedures & Directives Section through which pass all procedures and directives affecting this department prior to publication. The publication of procedures and directives to cover the various commodities and problems arising, has been an important step in decentralizing executive work and speeding up the disposal of merchandise.

**Advertising :** Towards the end of 1946 a noticeable decrease in the demand for surplus was experienced, doubtless owing to progress in

industrial recovery, and it was realized that a closer contact between advertising and merchandising was necessary. An Advertising Section within the Merchandising Department was accordingly organized which is in daily contact with the lists of material being dispatched to the regions for sale. This section co-operates with the Publicity Department and arranges advertising and publicity in the press and appropriate trade journals as and when it will be most helpful to the various Branch Sales Offices.

### Personnel

The number of employees on the strength of this Department as of the March 31, 1947, had shown an increase of about two-thirds over the figure at the end of the previous fiscal year but the volume of work, as indicated by the number of invoices processed during March, 1947, had quadrupled, while the value of the average sale (excluding ships) in March 1947 was \$400. as against \$4,800. for March, 1946. The Merchandising Department's percentage of total personnel employed by the Corporation remained constant at about 16%.

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## PART V - OPERATIONS - LANDS AND BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT

### Organization

The organization of the Lands and Buildings Department has been maintained throughout the fiscal year ended March 31, 1947, in the form constituted during the preceding year and outlined in the second annual report of the Corporation. Towards the end of the present year, however, two of the senior officers of the department resigned and returned to private business. Unless unexpected volume of disposals should develop, it is anticipated that the present organization will be able to absorb the duties previously performed by these two officials. Additionally, as policies and procedures were crystallized, the work of the Real Estate Advisory Committee lessened, and, at its own request, the committee now meets only when specially convened.

### Policies

During the preceding year, policies and procedures for the disposal of lands and buildings were adopted. These policies and procedures have been generally adhered to having as their objective the disposal of surplus lands and buildings to the best financial advantage, consistent with the use to which they may be put in the interests of employment, housing, education, vocational training, institutional purposes and the reconstruction effort generally.

### Volume of Sales

The practical application of the policies evolved and adopted can best be shown by the following record of dollar sales in the fiscal years ended March 31, 1946 and 1947, and the broken period ended March 31, 1945.

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### Multiple Tenancies

During the course of the year, another multiple tenancy project was put into operation in the former Defence Industries plant at 9500 St. Lawrence Boulevard, Montreal. This is known as the Crown Industrial Building and comprises a major portion of the main building at this location, the balance of the area in this building

being still occupied by the Vocational Training Branch of the Department of Veterans' Affairs and by War Assets Corporation for warehousing purposes. The other two multiple tenancy operations are the Verdun Industrial Building (formerly Defence Industries plant, Verdun) and the Liberty Buildings (formerly the Number 23 group of buildings at the John Inglis plant, Toronto).

At these three properties net floor area of 977,332 square feet is now under lease to 77 tenants and at the present time it is estimated that nearly 7,000 people are employed in the various industries operating there.

### Progress of Disposal Operations

In general, the same methods of disposal which resulted from the adoption of the policies and procedures earlier referred to prevailed throughout the year. One departure, however, was necessary in that all declarations of surplus are now first referred to the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation, so that decision can be reached as to whether camps or buildings are suitable for demolition so as to make materials available to priority groups engaged in housing construction. If rejected as unsuited for such demolition operations, the declarations of surplus are then referred to the Lands and Buildings Department, and disposal is proceeded with in the usual way.

### Industrial Buildings

Industrial buildings may be divided into two categories:

- (a) Those subject to options or restrictive clauses which in turn do not permit of free sale, or those which are part of, or adjacent to, a manufacturer's plant.
- (b) Those not subject to the restrictions in (a) above.

In the case of the first group the main volume of such plants has now been dealt with and for obvious reasons the logical purchaser in such cases was the custodian.

Failure to agree on sale to the custodian would have meant removal of Crown buildings and restoration of existing buildings, services and lands. The cost of this would have, in most cases, far exceeded the salvage value and, in addition to the loss of the considerable amounts obtained from such custodian sales, loss in employment and in sales of machinery and equipment would have resulted if continuous use of these plant extensions had not been possible.

In the case of the second group which included available unsold plants, very considerable progress has been made in disposing of these properties.

For certain properties, due to location, type of structures, or previous hazardous operation,



no continuing use could be found and, in these cases, the purchaser of the properties acquired them with the object of demolishing the buildings for the materials they contained. This particularly applied to some chemical, explosive and shipbuilding plants and to buildings of a temporary nature which did not conform to building by-laws or insurance codes, and so could not be utilized for peace-time operations.

The majority of the wartime plants remaining unsold consist of multiple tenancy projects or plants rented in their entirety to one user, those occupied by the vocational training branch of the Department of Veterans Affairs or those still in occupation by the Corporation for warehousing purposes.

Where disposal of industrial properties was initiated by newspaper or trade journal advertising, it was discovered that to offer such properties for sale by sealed tender did not produce satisfactory results. As a consequence, such advertising now is of an exploratory nature, inviting offers to purchase from interested parties under certain specified conditions and if the offers first received are not satisfactory then negotiations in most cases result in the obtainment of the fair market value.

## Camps and Aerodromes

The volume of surplus camps and aerodromes has continued at a high level throughout the fiscal year, the number of declarations received being about the same as in the previous year. The severity of the winter has slowed up disposals in certain areas, but it is felt that the peak of declarations has at least been reached, if not passed.

Provincial governments and municipalities continued to absorb a large percentage of the buildings of this nature for housing, educational and institutional purposes. To expedite such transfers a specified and moderate percentage of original cost was set as a selling price and, by so doing, the time consumed in the customary individual appraisal of these buildings was eliminated. A number of camps were sold to Housing Enterprises Limited, one of the housing groups operating in conjunction with the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation.

Although limited in number as to availability, hangars and drill halls have been in urgent demand for industrial use and some provinces and municipalities have been active in establishing industries in such structures where the location was suitable.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs has continued to purchase aerodrome land for resale to veteran farmers, and some large blocks of urban land have been sold for housing projects.

In all cases, however, where disposal is not effected to priority groups, camp and aerodrome

buildings (with or without land), or land alone, are sold through the medium of advertising, either by calling for sealed tenders or by inviting offers to purchase. In cases where the expected recovery is small, the usual procedure is to post notices on the property or in local post offices.

## U. S. Properties in Canada

With one or two possible exceptions, all United States properties in Canada have now been acquired by the Dominion, either under the terms of the 33rd Recommendation or by the overall purchase of remaining surplus authorized under P.C. 1189, dated March 29, 1946. Generally speaking, the majority of the larger installations at Prince Rupert, Edmonton and Dawson Creek have either been sold or are under negotiation for sale, or are in use by one of the federal departments.

Other federal departments have declared surplus a number of buildings on or adjacent to the Alaska Highway which were obtained under the overall agreement above referred to and sales action on these will be instituted as soon as weather conditions permit. The disposals at Prince Rupert, Port Edward and Watson Island include the large dock at the latter point which was sold to a prominent industrial concern as part of a projected major development for this area. Negotiations are also proceeding for the large U.S. Warehouse and other main buildings at Prince Rupert.

## Newfoundland Disposal

In last year's report reference was made to the difficulty of disposal of surplus buildings in Newfoundland. In most instances, these camps were erected on leasehold lands and lessors required the buildings to be removed in accordance with the terms of the lease. Considerable advertising was done in an effort to find purchasers prepared to do the demolition and restoration work required. Except for certain installations in or around St. John's, interest in Newfoundland was negligible, but eventually a purchaser was found who was willing to make an overall purchase. This purchaser took his own organization comprising about seventy people from Canada to Newfoundland and moved from property to property, demolishing and restoring as they proceeded, until his contract was completed. It is considered fortunate that disposal of these installations was effected, with local demand negligible, large surplus of U.S. and U.K. installations also available, and expenses for guarding and maintenance heavy. A few buildings recently declared surplus are still unsold but it is expected that disposal of these will soon be completed and the Dominion's interests in such assets in Newfoundland fully liquidated.



## PART VI - COSTS OF OPERATION

The costs of operating the Corporation are divided into two principal categories (a) direct operating costs and (b) administrative expenses.

(a) **Direct operating costs** are divided into two sections:—

1. Those concerned in the expenses of taking over surplus from the declaring departments of government, in warehousing, classifying, guarding and finally shipping or transferring surplus to purchasers, in addition to the costs of demolitions and lease cancellations and the restoration of lands.
2. The cost not directly controlled by the management of the Corporation, comprising the finances provided to complete Mutual Aid contracts, and the costs of completion of certain ship construction carried out under the direct supervision of Wartime Shipbuilding Limited.

(b) **Administrative Expenses** include administrative and office salaries, the cost of providing for head offices in Montreal and Ottawa and all regional and branch offices across Canada and for office services and supplies. Details of these costs and other financial data are listed in the Comptroller's section herein.

To meet administrative expenses, the Corporation is permitted to retain such percentage of the net proceeds of sales as may be fixed by the Governor in Council from time to time. The percentage so to be retained was established by Order-in-Council P.C. 1192 of March 29, 1946 at 5% of the Net Proceeds of Sales.

By further Order-in-Council, P.C. 1115 dated March 31 1947, this percentage was increased to 7½% for the fiscal period commencing April 1, 1946, and to 10% commencing April 1, 1947.

## NOTES ON COST ITEMS

### Direct Operating Costs — Group A :

**Receiving, Classifying and Warehousing Surplus:** This item consists of the cost of operating the Corporation's warehouses; charges from custodians for the storage and handling of assets; and the operation and maintenance of surplus properties. Over 70% of the costs under this caption cover wages and salaries. The other principal items are rent, light, heat and power, incoming freight and express charges, building expenses and storage and handling charges billed to us by custodians.

**Reconditioning Clothing and Other Surplus Goods :** This account includes the cost of reconditioning and packing clothing and other articles at Valleyfield Reclamation Depot which had actually been sold within the period under review, or which were still on hand at the end of the fiscal period. There is also included the cost of reconditioning motor vehicles overseas.

**Demolition and Disposal of Non-salvageable Surplus :** This includes the cost of demolition projects such as service camps which are demolished for the purpose of salvaging building materials required for housing purposes. It also includes the cost of demolition of live ammunition where it is considered uneconomical to attempt to salvage materials for scrap sales.

**Recovering Salvageable Material from Ammunition and Explosives :** This covers the cost of recovering salvageable materials from ammunition and explosives. These are handled for the Corporation by D.N.D. (Army) at their ammunition depots (magazines) and their operating costs are included under this caption.

**Freight and Handling :** Consists of outward transportation charges, handling and other shipping charges including expenses incurred by D.N.D. (Air) who on some locations perform work of this nature on behalf of the Corporation and charge back the cost.

**Lease Termination and Property Restoration Expense :** This account reflects the costs of the termination of leases reported surplus before expiration and for the restoration of properties covered by such leases.

**Miscellaneous (including agents commissions, technical services and consulting fees) :** Covers a group of costs of various nature

for which no specific caption has been provided in our accounts and includes the following:—

Agents Commissions

Technical Services and Consulting Fees

Dealers Discounts

Cutting up transport ferry hulls

Expenses incurred by Park Steamship Co. Ltd. in connection with the sale of ships.

### Direct Operating Costs - Group B:

This item reflects the cost of the completion of contracts placed by Wartime Shipbuilding Ltd. and Mutual Aid Board for products which became surplus to requirements but which were completed for the purpose of bringing the products concerned to a marketable state.

### Administrative Expenses

The various expenses listed under this heading are largely self-explanatory. Approximately 80% of the total is represented by salaries and wages. Under the caption "Miscellaneous Expenses — N.O.S." are included numerous small accounts for which no specific caption has been provided and include the following:

Unemployment insurance;

Government employees' compensation;

Pension contributions;

Legal and audit costs;

Staff moving and living expenses;

Photographic supplies and expenses;

Advertising and publicity;

Subscriptions to publications;

Office furniture and fixtures;

Local (Passenger) transportation;

Freight, express and cartage;

Directors' travelling expenses;

Automobile and truck expenses.



## PART VII - ORGANIZATION & PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

The Corporation has continued to place considerable emphasis on sound staff management. A salaries committee consisting of five of the Corporation's senior officers was created in the middle of the year to be responsible for the Corporation's personnel policies.

A major development during the year was the extension of the merit increase plan to all monthly-rated classifications which now include slightly over 5,000 employees. This project required the closer co-ordination of the salaries of the monthly-rated classifications which was effected through the establishment of six job levels, applying to all but the most senior employees.

The Reclamation Depot at Valleyfield contracted during the first part of the year and then expanded to approximately 1,200 employees with two shifts.

### Staff Figures

The number of staff continued to increase at a steady rate during the fiscal year, and reached the peak in January. The following are comparative year end figures:

Most of these increases occurred in the field where the percentage of total staff increased from 81 to 87. The percentage distribution amongst the eight departments showed practically no change; the Supply Department accounts for 74% of the total staff (7,314 employees), the Merchandising Department 16% (1,544 employees) and the other departments 10% (1,061 employees).

Approximately two-thirds of the staff are in the monthly-rated occupational classifications and one-third are hourly-rated tradesmen, semi-skilled and unskilled labour. Early in the year weekly rates of pay were eliminated.

The office workers are about evenly divided as between male and female, whereas the warehouse staffs are predominantly male, so that 71% of the Corporation's total staff is male. Of the males, excluding guards, 65% are veterans from one or both of the Great Wars and if the guards are included (all of whom are ex-service men) the percentage is raised to 71%.

### Organization & Job Classification Division

All but a handful of employees are now placed in standard occupational classifications which have been developed for the particular tasks found in the Corporation. To ensure full use of

these standard classes and to keep the internal organizational structure in tune with the changing requirements of the Corporation's over-all task, numerous unit surveys were made throughout all departments.

In addition to developing the co-ordinated salary structure through the establishment of six job levels and in addition to the extension of the merit increase plan, this division's routine work consisted of reviewing 16,760 requisitions for staff and 6,325 recommendations for pay revision through reclassification or promotion.

The hours of work for the hourly-rated employees, most of whom are engaged at the warehouses, were reduced from 48 to 44, with maintenance of the same take-home pay.

### Recruiting & Assignments Division

This division is responsible for the functions which its name implies and also reviews internal staff transfers, merit increases and separations. During the year there were 10,293 appointments and 6,731 separations.

Preliminary plans for an "out-placement service" are being developed so that at the appropriate time assistance may be given to employees who on termination of service with the Corporation desire assistance in seeking employment elsewhere.

### Training & Welfare Division

This division is concerned with a limited list of functions which are appropriate in a short-lived organization. The chief activities are counselling in relation to personal problems, the provision of full-time qualified nursing service at several points, the administration of workmen's compensation and group insurance plans and assistance to employees' social clubs.

### Administrative Services Division

Although there was little change in the list of functions performed by this division during the year, there was decentralization to regional offices, illustrated by the increase in the field staff of the Organization and Personnel Department from 25 at the beginning of the year to 160 at the end of the year. This increase in staff was almost entirely in relation to administrative services.

The most important task has been the provision of printing and stationery. The chief accomplishment has been the centralization of buying with attendant economies. The efficient use of stationery and printed forms was promoted through the control exercised by central stationery stores in Montreal and field depots at the other four regional centres. Finally, close attention was given to the co-ordination of the Corporation's numerous standard forms. By these various means, very substantial savings were effected in the Corporation's tremendous



consumption of printed forms and stationery.

The list of office services provided at head office and in the field consists of the procurement and allocation of office space with thirty locations occupied at the end of the year, the provision of furniture and business machines, the supervision of all forms of communications, the supervision of stenographic pools, and the responsibility for administering cafeterias and canteens at larger points of operation. Central registries at head office and at regional points continue to provide their usual service.

### Investigation Division

This division, in conjunction with the Royal

Canadian Mounted Police, investigates matters affecting the Corporation in which there are allegations or suspicions of theft or fraud or similar illegal acts. The number of such cases investigated during the year was 161, which resulted in 16 cases of prosecution and conviction involving 20 persons, mostly Corporation employees, and 20 other cases which were completed by the dismissal of 31 employees.

As intimated in the second annual report instances of dishonesty on the part of employees are relatively few considering the number of people who had to be assembled in a short space of time to deal with an operation which was large and complex but of limited duration.

## PART VIII - COMPTROLLER'S DEPARTMENT

The second annual report referred to plans for the development of an Internal Audit Division and the organization of accounting control by regions to bring it into line with the regionalization which had been effected in the Supply and Merchandising Departments. These plans were made effective on April 1, 1946 and, with the exception of possible minor changes, it is now considered that the department has become stabilized. Changes in procedure in the disposal of surplus assets, (e.g. warehouse clearance "lot" sales) necessitate constant revisions in accounting requirements and it is expected that changes in accounting will become more numerous as plans are developed to speed up final disposals.

### Accounting Division

Head Office at Montreal controls the account-work across Canada through direct accounting contact with the five Regional Accounting Offices, as well as St. John's, Newfoundland, Valleyfield Reclamation Depot, and Ottawa Treasury Accounting Office.

The five Regional Accounting Offices control the Branch Accounting Offices within their regional territory.

Branch Accounting now consists only of the recording of sales and the collecting of Accounts Receivable.

The Regional Accounting departments make all disbursements for administrative and operational expenses within their regions, and this centralization gives a much stronger control than was formerly the case when Branch Accounting Offices were responsible for such disbursements.

Branch Accountants submit monthly statements to their Regional Offices who, in turn, consolidate such returns for furtherance to Head Office. At Head Office these returns, together with figures from Ottawa, Valleyfield, and St. John's, Newfoundland, are consolidated with the results of strictly Head Office transactions, and the whole incorporated into monthly interim statements.

Comprehensive statements are also prepared at Head Office for the Supply and Merchandising Departments which give an overall picture of the results of operations coming under their control. These statements are altered and varied as to form as the need arises, and enable the departments concerned to institute such controls as are indicated to be necessary.

With the exception of Head Office Accounts Receivable and Montreal Branch Office, machine accounting has been limited to the Payroll Sections of Head Office and Regional Accounting Offices. Only one Payroll Section remains to be mechanized and this will be completed early in the new fiscal year.

### Audit Division

As the general audit staff was not fully operative during the first quarter of the fiscal year, a certain backlog of audit work had naturally to be brought up to date and this, with the problems of new staff and the refinements necessary in the audit procedure, meant that reports for the first six months were not as current as desirable. Now that a full year's operation has been completed, this division has caught up with this backlog and, in addition to making current reports on financial and warehouse audits, can now extend its operations to various phases of the merchandising activities. Steps in this direction are already under way.

## NOTES ON FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The balance sheet of the Corporation as at March 31, 1947, with the statement of income and expenditures, (Schedule A) and the statement of Government of Canada net equity in the trust assets, (Schedule B) duly certified by the Auditor General of Canada, are reproduced on pages 29 to 32 of this report.

The following are comments and/or summaries of a number of the items contained in the balance sheet and related schedules, A and B:—

### Balance Sheet Items

- (1) Portion of 'Trust Accounts Receivable' retainable by the Corporation, as authorized under Section 15 (2b) of the Surplus Crown Assets Act — \$3,581,449.33:

This amount represents that portion of the income of the Corporation which is yet to be retained from monies to be collected from accounts receivable now outstanding. Under Section 15 of the Surplus Crown Assets Act, the Corporation retains a percentage from monies received at the rates which are applicable to income for each of the periods in which collections are made. The following summary indicates the income earned, the portion of monies retained from inception to March 31, 1947, and the balance retainable by the Corporation from future collections:—

The Corporation has now realized net proceeds amounting to \$930,964.88 from the sale of facilities purchased from the United States government. The cost of these facilities disposed of has been estimated at \$946,276.48 resulting in an estimated loss of \$15,311.60 which is reflected as a charge to the Government of Canada equity (Schedule B). Total facilities purchased from the United States Government amounted to \$1,475,130.00 which, after deducting the above estimated cost of \$946,276.48, leaves a value of \$528,853.52 representing facilities on hand at March 31, 1947.

- (3) Deferred charges: Unamortized capital expenditure on multiple-tenancy property... \$319,233.00]

It will be noted that:

- (1) The total operations were conducted at a cost equal to 20.77% of the gross proceeds of sales;
- (2) Because of the large sales volume, the Corporation's administrative expenses absorbed only 69.35% of the 7½% allowed as a deduction from net proceeds of sales to cover such expenses;
- (3) The net recovery, after allowing 7½% of net proceeds of sales to cover the Corporation's administrative expenses, represents 77.31% of the gross price at which surplus assets were sold. Reference should be made to part of the certificate of the Auditor-General, reading as follows: "The procedures and practices of the Corporation were not of such a nature as to permit establishing by examination of records maintained that all assets received for disposal had been fully accounted for."

It is quite apparent that, unless operations of the Corporation both as regards the taking over of surplus and the sale of surplus are stopped for a considerable period (estimated to be two months), it is not possible to prepare an inventory without which inventory the Auditor General would not be in a position to delete the qualification noted above.

The Corporation feels that a stoppage of operations by the Corporation would be entirely unjustified, as the safeguards that have been instituted to protect the Crown-owned property in its custody are of such a nature that only minor losses of property are likely, and the necessity for accepting surplus so that the original custodian departments may demobilize their personnel or, alternatively, contractors may clear their plants and return to civilian production are of paramount importance.



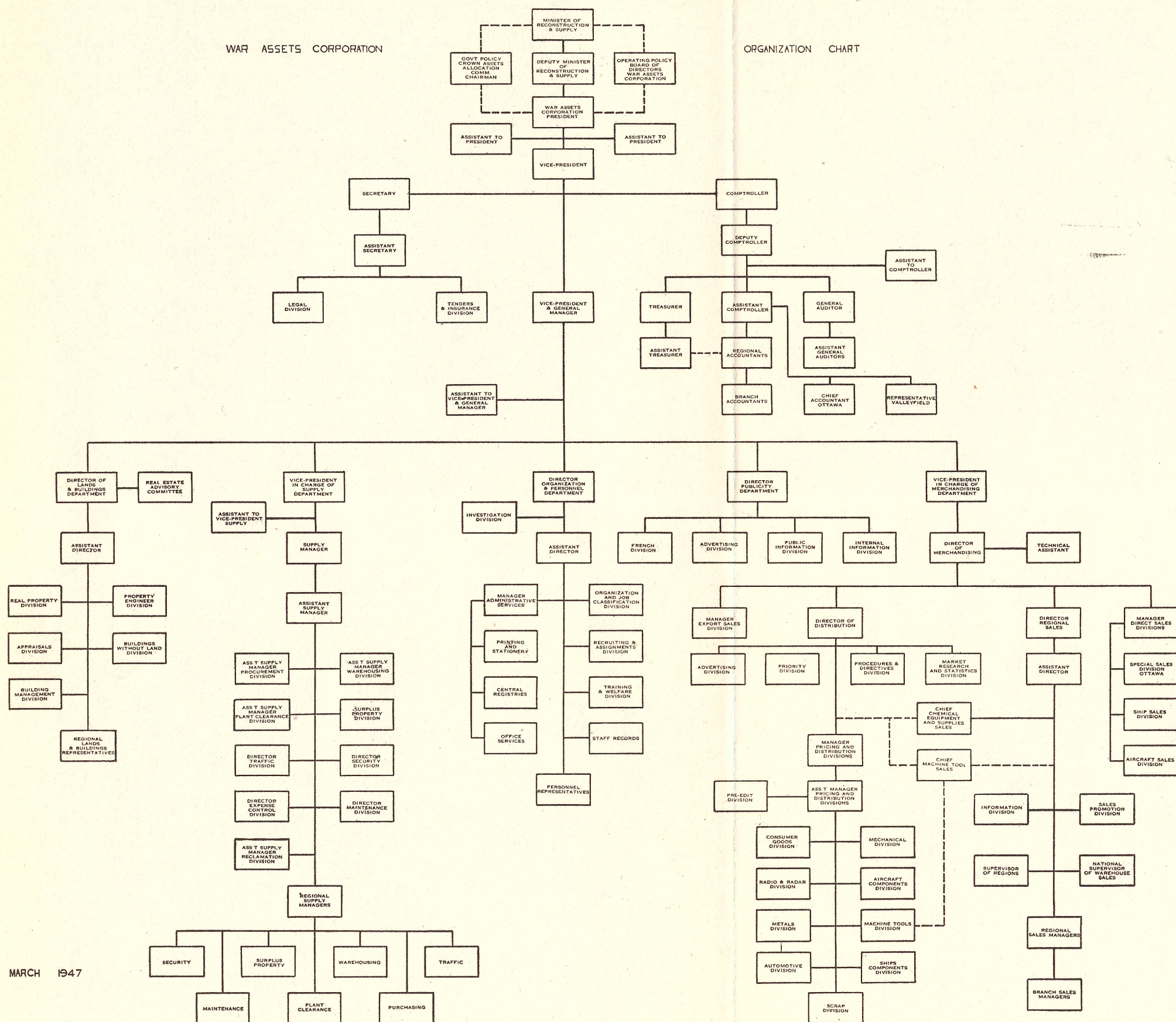
