Directors' Report

To the Shareholders,
Kerr-Addison Gold Mines Limited.

Your Directors submit herewith the Twelfth Annual Report of your Company with Balance Sheet as at December 31st, 1947, (Auditors' Report and Certificate attached), Statement of Operations for the year ended December 31st, 1947, together with Statement of Earned Surplus and Capital Surplus as at December 31st, 1947, and report of the Mine Manager.

Net earnings in 1947 were 41.23 cents per share compared with 29.27 cents per share in 1946. The increase resulted from the treatment of 2,137 tons per day compared with 1,457 tons per day in 1946, although the average recovery was only \$6.73 per ton compared with \$6.94 in 1946 (gold at \$35.00 per oz.).

The Manager's Report shows ore reserves at the year end, above the 1,450 foot level, at some 8,168,000 tons averaging \$7.00 per ton, so that after milling 780,000 tons there was a decrease of 300,000 tons from the previous year.

Partially developed ore between the 1,450 foot level and the 1,600 foot level is shown at 2,250,000 tons, an increase of 30,000 tons over the estimate at December 31st, 1946.

You will note from the Balance Sheet that Current Assets, less Liabilities, at the year end stood at approximately \$1,760,000 compared with \$2,600,000 at the end of 1946, but that the item of Buildings, Plant and Equipment stood at \$5,920,000 compared with \$3,500,000 at the end of the previous year. Your Directors feel that liquid assets and current earnings, after dividends, will adequately provide for the expenditure necessary to complete the plant expansion.

The plant expansion programme has made excellent progress and a determined effort is being made to increase the daily tonnage capacity of the plant to 3,000 tons by October next, and to reach the objective of 4,000 tons per day by the end of 1948.

A cost-of-living bonus to employees was granted in the form of a wage increase effective January 1st, 1948. The manpower situation, which curtailed operations heretofore, is now rapidly improving and your Management expects that the mine will be able to supply the additional tonnage required under the expansion programme.

Due to the scarcity of water, there has been a general curtailment of hydro-electric power in the mining districts commencing in February of this year, but your management was able to obtain and install a diesel-engine generator in time to practically make up for the necessary hydro power curtailment, with the result that production has not been reduced.

Your Directors wish to express their appreciation of the services rendered during the past year by the Manager and Staff.

Manager's Report

The President and Directors,
Kerr-Addison Gold Mines Limited,
Toronto, Ontario.

Dear Sirs:

The operation of the mine for the year ended December 31st, 1947 is covered by the following report:

During 1947 the general conditions affecting the operation were the best since 1942. While labour turnover remained high the working force increased from 505 to 649. The amount of underground work accomplished exceeded that of the previous year by approximately 40 per cent, but in spite of the increase in force, mining, development and construction programmes fell behind their schedules.

Broken ore reserves were increased by 161,509 tons. In mining operations 869,276 tons of ore were broken and of this all but 71,799 tons broken on the 1,300 foot level, were above the 1,000 foot level. Supplementary development and actual mining operations during the year disclosed additional ore above the 1,450 foot level amounting to 482,025 tons.

In order to prepare the mine for the production of 28,000 tons of ore per week late in 1948, all miners available were used on development, stope development and mining in the larger orebodies only. The exploration and development of the smaller ore occurrences, outside of the main bodies, will be resumed when adequate numbers of miners can be either hired or trained.

Ore Reserves:

Ore reserves, all above the 1,450 foot level, total 8,168,360 tons having a grade of 0.2012 oz. per ton after allowing for dilution. Broken ore reserves amounting to 874,826 tons are included in the above figure.

Lower Development:

Work to date has indicated 2,250,080 tons of partially developed ore having an indicated grade of 0.2257 oz. per ton between the 1,450 and 1,600 foot levels. Considerable development work has been done on the 1,600 foot level in preparing for stope development and actual stope silling operations.

This work resulted in outlining the ore at, and above, the 1,600 foot level in greater detail and in minor revisions to both tonnage and grade figures.

On the 1,750 foot level the first part of the ore picture has been obtained. So far No. 6 orebody has an indicated length of 450 feet, width of 43 feet and grade of 0.3605 oz. per ton. At this horizon work to date shows No. 10 orebody having an indicated length of 350 feet, width of 22 feet, and grade of 0.3481 oz. per ton. Each of these orebodies is still open on one end. The above figures include no provision for dilution.

On the 1,900 foot level, more detailed diamond drilling now shows the flow type orebodies to have an indicated total length of 2,488 feet, average width of 38.4 feet and average grade of 0.3355 oz. per ton, before allowing for dilution. So far the indicated carbonate orebodies at this horizon have a combined length of 1,795 feet, average width of 20.3 feet and an average grade of 0.2234 oz. per ton, before allowing for dilution.

Production:

The milling rate was increased from 1,650 tons to 2,200 tons daily during the first quarter and the increased rate was maintained through the year. The tonnage treated established a record for the mine but no record was made in ounces of gold produced as the ore grade was lower than in 1942, (the only year in which gold production was greater), because of large tonnages pulled from the lower grade horizon between the 700 and 1,150 foot levels.

The wage increase of December, 1946, increased prices of many operating supplies, and the heavy increase in broken ore reserves were factors which tended to keep costs per ton up, in spite of the large tonnage treated. Lack of miners to carry out additional development work kept that item of cost down.

Plant Expansion:

Fair progress was made in most of the construction work but lack of both skilled and unskilled workers, and failures of contractors to fulfill their contracts on time, has thrown the entire programme approximately 3½ months behind schedule. Seven fireproof building units scheduled for 1947 were erected but roofs were not complete. Mill foundations were incomplete at the year's end, and the

erection of the mill frame which was to be started in October was deferred to start in late January, 1948, only because the contractor found it impossible to deliver steel at an earlier date. The headframe will be erected after the mill frame is complete.

Accommodation for approximately 200 permanent employees and 200 construction workers was provided by dormitories, construction camps and a cafeteria planned in 1946 and placed in service May 1st, 1947.

General:

The forty new houses contracted for in 1946 were all completed and occupied early in 1947.

An agreement was reached with the municipality under which it is taking over the public utilities in Virginiatown. We were relieved of their maintenance on July 1st. With the assistance of an expert, plans have been drawn for a new town sub-division to be laid out on Kerr-Addison claims north of the highway. It is hoped to open the first part of this in 1948.

As regards production, it now appears that the mill will be ready to handle 3,000 - 3,200 tons daily by October 1st, 1948, and 4,000 tons daily by January 1st, 1949. The mine will definitely be prepared to supply the increased tonnages whenever required. Plans have been made to assure an adequate underground force.

I again take pleasure in thanking the Departmental Heads and their staffs for their work and loyal co-operation during a year in which much of the work was unusually difficult through shortages of both men and supplies. I also acknowledge with appreciation and thanks the generous support and assistance of the Officers and Directors.
