My dear Penfield:

Your letter alarms me.

I don't think this unit at the City Hospital will be able to touch ours in the matter of opportunity for research. I assume that only a small part of this budget of \$30,000 will go for neurological surgery, and I should imagine you would have very little teaching in your line, with Harvey Cushing in the same city, and occupying the position of senior professor. I am expecting that you will compete with Harvey Cushing in another city than Boston, where you might be more independent, and I feel perfectly certain that we can offer as big a source of material as can the B.C.H., considering that Cushing and Mixter are already so well established in that city. However, before the month is up I expect to have a definite statement ready for you, and I trust you will still be willing to come up here and see our people whenever I send you word.
