Dear Sir Arthur,

Dr. Penfield has been bequeathed the sum of \$50,000 for his personal use in Neurological research and, at the request of the executors of the estate, the fund is to be called the "Penfield Research Fund". One of the relatives of the testator has added \$5,000 to that Fund, so that the total is now \$55,000.

I would suggest that, while this Fund is to be called the "Penfield Research Fund" at the request of the donors, the name be kept private and confidential in accordance with Dr. Penfield's wish, but should any of his friends desire to add to this Fund ~~such~~ monies would come under the same terms of agreement as did the original Fund, namely, that this is Dr. Penfield's personal property and to be used by him in whatever institution he should happen to be.

additional If, on the other hand local donors, or others, should give money to this Fund, dedicating it to Neurological research in general, such funds would not necessarily be attached in the same way to the original donation.

Requisitions would be made from the fund which would be held in the Bureau's office, by Dr. Penfield.

There is an advantage in calling it the "Penfield Fund", as there may be an opportunity of increasing it as time goes on. On the other hand, Dr. Penfield does not wish his name to be attached to it for publicity purposes.
