Telephone conversation with Dr. Convery, March 19th, 1943

Information in regard to the proposed six-month internship at Ste. Anne's Hospital. He would like to have students come out there for a six-month period and then rotate into obstetrics and other activities.

At the present time there are carrying out 160 general operations per month. They have 800 patients in all; 500 are considered active. They have 190 chest cases. They have 3 surgical wards and 3 resident surgeons. Dr. Wilkie visits twice a week, and Dr. Hicks, who was his former assistant at the Royal Victoria Hospital, was resident surgeon and does most of the operating. Dr. Harding is shortly to become full-time radiologist at Ste. Anne's. Dr. McQuitty (?) is in charge of the chest work. Dr. MacIntosh, a practitioner, is in charge of medical work. Dr. Sutherland visits, and Dr. Shaver from the General Hospital makes weekly visits as well as Dr. F. H. MacKay and Dr. Merton Shaver of the M. N. I.

On enquiry, Dr. Convery said he thought the new military developments would be in operation in less than a year. This, of course, is additional.
