Many thanks for your letter of the 9th.

2. I agree with you entirely as to the long range cost of these cases, and I will not let the matter rest about additional accommodation and facilities for proper examinations and diagnoses.

3. Despite the fact that we have been nearly three years in the war, many matters are still in a state of flux with final decisions not made, but I am sitting on a lot of eggs hoping to hatch them out and rear up the chicks before a bulky emergency arises.

4. The idea of these prefabricated hutments set up in existing hospital grounds, is one that appeals to me more and more as I go into it, and I hope perhaps we will be able to do something along that line for your Institute.
