DEAR COLONEL MACKENZIE,

I AM ENCLOSING A CARBON COPY OF THE LETTER WHICH I HAVE TODAY FORWARDED TO GENERAL RENAUD. I WILL BE IN MONTREAL ON MY RETURN FROM TADOUSAC ON MONDAY, AUGUST 14TH, BUT WILL ONLY BE HERE FOR A FEW HOURS EARLY IN THE MORNING. THE PLANS WHICH WILL BE FORWARDED TO YOU, AND WHICH WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE CITY OF MONTREAL FOR THEIR APPROVAL FROM THE POINT OF VIEW OF FIRE HAZARD, MAY BE CONSIDERED COMPLETE, AS FAR AS GENERAL OUTLINE IS CONCERNED, BUT AFTER, AND IN CASE, THEY RECEIVE APPROVAL I SHOULD LIKE THE PRIVILEGE OF STUDYING THE DETAILS FURTHER WITH A VIEW TO PERFECTING THEM FROM A CLINICAL POINT OF VIEW.
