Sir:

The following is a brief note on the financial matters you wrote to me about on August 1, 1946. I sent the bill from the Royal Victoria Hospital for the operating room lights to the Canadian Red Cross. The amount was \$640. In the same note, I asked to have the remainder of the \$1400, that is, \$760, held aside for the purpose of purchasing further lights, which we have not been able to obtain as yet. Mr. Vaillancourt replied that the \$760 would be held for us. I phoned the Montreal branch of Eastman-Kodak regarding the Kodatron lights and there is no word that these are being manufactured as yet. The Montreal office, however, will write to Rochester and ask specifically about them. In the meantime, I have mentioned the matter to Dr. Cone, who, at the present time, is trying out a new arc lamp in photography and he states that such lights promise to be more satisfactory than the Kodatron lights. Dr. Cone suggested that we delay about one month until he has tried out his arc lamp, after which, the purchase of the Kodatron light ~~would~~^{might} no longer be necessary.

In regard to the \$2300 used in furnishing the Annex, the Annex was furnished by Morgans and all accounts were sent to the Red Cross by Morgans, so that as far as Miss Flanagan was concerned, no money was directly granted to the Hospital. She does not think it would be practical to bring the matter up again with the Red Cross.
