Dear Doctor Penfield:

It has seemed best to await something rather definite before filling out our letter of credit or alternatively on some bank or express travelers' cheques.

I believe the latter is better as they are universally convertible-whereas the letter of credit is honoured only at an individual bank or its particular branches. Either ere of equal safety I believe.

The only restrictions existing is for permission to take money out of the country, and this I find can be arranged at and by the Bank on soliciting the Travelers' Cheques.

Will it be too much to ask you to arrange this transaction for us?
