per cent are very improved. I.M. has given me
antiseptics, which will help with
patients as bad burns do not heal easily.

Dear Doctor Penfield:

Many thanks for reading over that review
about peripheral nerves. Unfortunately the censors
held the paper a rather long time and returned
it only a short while before Christmas. It was
unfortunate to inflict the paper on you when you
were already over crowded but I appreciate the
criticism.

I will hold it as a standard trying to
put each phase of the work to the test of experience.
So far I have had about 25 peripheral nerves to look
after and they have been very interesting. As you
probably know we have moved and are much
busier than previously with much more 'acute' work.

There are many more head injuries with
various complications. We have arranged very close
contact with No. 1 Neurological and Major Bottarel
plans to come over at least once monthly and whenever
else I call him to see how things are going.



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I received a parcel with Palmer Howards parcel from the

Colonel Russel has been very ill again but is making
progress. Col. Montgomery is looking after him from the
