Plans for

Associate Committee of the Montreal Neurological Institute.

This committee is to be considered a part of the McGill Associates organization. The purpose of this committee is twofold, a) to help Number 1 Neurological Hospital, R. C. A. M. C., in its extra-military activity.

Under this heading it is desired to help maintain a level of clinical performance equal to that of the Montreal Neurological Institute, recognizing that this level is somewhat above that of the usual casualty clearing unit. It is clearly understood, however, that this special hospital is already being supported from military sources in every possible way within army regulations.

b) The second object in the formation of this committee is to gather together a small group of men who are sympathetic to the problems and needs of the Montreal Neurological Institute and who might at some future time be willing to assist the Institute with their influence and advice and to help raise money for it should that become necessary.

Members may be initially appointed by the Director of the Montreal Neurological Institute in consultation with the Principal of McGill University. After the committee has come into existence, new members may be elected by the committee itself, it being understood, however, that no new member shall be nominated without the approval of the Principal, who shall be ex-officio a member of this committee as he is of other committees of McGill Associates.

Funds which are contributed or received by this committee shall be paid into the Bursar of McGill University to be held in a special account from which they may be withdrawn on order of the chairman of the Associate Committee of the Montreal Neurological Institute and made available to a representative of the staff of Number 2 Neurological Hospital. It is understood that should funds be remaining over in this account at the time that Number 1 Neurological Hospital ceases to be an active service unit, these funds will be devoted to some aspect of the work of the M.N.I. as decided by the committee.

It is understood that no canvassing for funds primarily intended for the Neurological Institute shall be carried out until there has been previous consultation with a duly authorized representative of the Executive Committee of the McGill Associates in order not to injure the chances of other departments of McGill University which may be seeking financial assistance.
