I have had a talk with Dr. Anderson. I think if it could be financed she would be willing to stay on here and give up her present appointment out west. I am anxious to get her to undertake a serious, thorough going effort to apply the recent work on the pituitary and particularly the aspect in which she has herself been interested to human beings. Dr. Anderson would need the help of Dr. Haymaker for a year or two, I suppose. Please let me know what move you would like to have me make in regard to this thing, if any.

We are also anxious to get help in the biopsy undertaking. This problem will probably be self limited unless it leads to some different aspect of the work but it should be pushed energetically in my opinion and the oligodendroglia changes made definite in different types of mental disturbances before too many people get to doing unnecessary biopsies.
