Dear Dr. Martin,

You will find enclosed in this letter a cheque from Mrs. Madeleine L. Ottman which she has just sent to me as a contribution towards my research on epilepsy. Mrs. Ottman is at present a patient in the Neurological Institute, New York City, and will remain there for a week or two longer probably.

I would suggest that the money be made to constitute a fund to be called "The Madeleine L. Ottman Fund for Research in Epilepsy". I should like to be able to draw directly upon that fund by means of a special requisition. It will not be used for the routine expenses of the laboratory, but for those things that will especially further research. Possibly a note could be sent to her acknowledging the formation of that fund, and informing her that it will be expended by me in experimental work on epilepsy.

I saw Mrs. Ottman when in New York the other day and she was rather anxious that it should be used for this investigation. I told her that it would be turned over to the University and expended through the University. We hope in the Laboratory that much good may come from her generosity.
