Dear Dr. Pearce,

You will remember, perhaps, my coming to New York to see you with regard to a grant for an institute for neurological investigation, or failing that a grant of \$10,000. to help carry on our investigation of epilepsy.

I have just received an unsolicited cheque for \$10,000. from the mother of one of my epileptic patients for research in epilepsy. Also the hospital, in a small way, is gradually giving us many of the advantages which the proposed institute would have brought. I am writing you this partly because you seem to be interested in our work, and partly in order to write you a letter without begging for money, which may be something of a novelty to you.
