**ILLOCALITY.**

It has been prophesied by an eminent authority that we shall come to glory in "illocality"—that instead of looking for our sanctions to the past, we shall increasingly look around the globe and take or encourage the best wherever it rises to view. That the Rockefeller Foundation should have crossed the border which divides Canada from the United States to give munificent support to a neurological institute in connection with McGill University is an apt illustration of this tendency.

Three factors united to recommend a choice that ignored the latitude and longitude of the giver. The first was the man whose work in brain surgery attracted the special attention of those making search for the best place. Dr. WILDER G. PENFIELD, the head of the institute, was born in the State of Washington and had his education and special training largely in the United States, but he has been for several years at McGill University. the Province of Quebec and especially the citizens of Montreal showed interest and enterprise in welcoming such a foundation. Though this institute for research, clinical treatment and teaching in neurology, neuro-surgery and the whole realm of the nervous system stands on the further side of the St. Lawrence, its benefits will have no geographical boundaries. The world will find its way to the laboratories and clinics and lecture rooms of McGill, if the best that anywhere comes to be in this field of science is offered there. Fortunately for Canada, there was no tariff against such talents as Dr. PENFIELD carried over the border, and fortunately no duties can be laid against the results of the researches of the institute. They will become illocal under a law which happily prevails in the higher ranges of man's relationships.
