I wish we didn't have to plug along constantly to satisfy more or less selfish ambitions and needs. Last night the children wanted to see some of the old movies, and we put on the movies from Clear Water Lake and from our New York party at your house. It made us really homesick. I suppose your children have grown as fast as ours. How we would like to see you all.

I have a business engagement in Boston and hope to see the Halls within the next two weeks. Mae is planning to go with me. I wish I had some legitimate excuse to go to Montreal.
