Dear Wide:

We are so much interested in your stay in Germany. The children especially wish they could explore the vast dark forests with your children and if Mae and I had the chance, I am sure we would make a strenuous effort to keep up with the two Penfield bicycles.

We are glad to tell you that Dickie is out playing in the sunshine and getting back his old pep fast. All the rest of us are well, excepting that Mae needs a rest very badly after the strenuous nursing of the past 4 months. We have taken a cottage at Martha's Vineyard for the summer and Mae and the children will go up there as soon as the school term ends, which will be about the middle of June.

We had a wonderful visit with Priscilla, Francis and Vickery. Francis attended medical meetings the first $2\frac{1}{2}$ days. The remainder of the week we played golf, loafed at Mt. Vernon, rusticated in Rock Creek Park and played around with the children, went to see Walter Hampden in "An Enemy of the People," settled the affairs of the nations, and otherwise had a grand time. We did, however, miss the Penfields.

Bill Chester came into the city the Sunday morning prior to the Halls' coming but had to leave at 7:20 evening, and the Halls arrived at 7:30. He is the same Bill. We took him for a hike through Rock Creek Park to see the dogwood. We enjoyed his visit very much.

The regulations for the payment of the German claims have now been issued. I will get the blanks and prepare the application for settlement for your signature and mail them to you shortly. I forgot to tell you that the German fliers came to Washington when Francis and Priscilla and Vickery were here, and we all had a good look at them. Priscilla and Francis and Mae shook hands with them. Priscilla and Vickery visited President Coolidge for a "down-eastern" greeting. We got a real thrill out of their enjoyment of Washington. Vickery was wild about ~~him~~. A letter from Priscilla this morning tells us that Vickery is having a hard time to come down to earth. We do so much enjoy your letters and cards. You must be having a wonderful experience. Mae and the children all join me in love and best wishes for the remainder of your trip.
