Dear Wide and Helen:

We are glad to know that you are all safely back and we can imagine how busy you are getting settled.

I am inclosing a check on the Treasurer of the United States for \$18,697.46 representing \$15,000 award from the German Mixed Claims Commission and \$3,697.46 interest. Since the interest rate was 5% and the Government paid interest on principal and interest from January 1, 1928 I made no effort to get the check and invest the money for you until the time of your return. You will note that the check is dated September the 26th so that we hit it pretty close. I am also inclosing the statement from the Treasury Department showing the calculation.

I am returning your insurance policies.
