I was delighted to get your letter and to know there is every chance of your coming to Montreal. I have just returned from a short vacation and have not as yet been able to pick up all the strings.


In regard to the rooms, I have gone into this matter and can definitely promise you occupation, - for an indefinite period or until you can be satisfactorily accommodated elsewhere, - of the rooms outlined on the enclosed sketch. I thought you could use room #9 for yourself, room #8 for your technician, and room #7 for other assistants. As it is at present I have two men working in room #7 with rather large apparatus, which they manage to do quite comfortably. I have myself worked in it with two others. It can be easily fitted with additional tables and other accessories. I am afraid that the small room across the corridor I shall have to retain. I hope that this arrangement will be satisfactory to you.

With reference to your expenses I have given instructions for a cheque to be sent to you to cover them. If you do not receive it in a short period of time will you please let me know.

I sincerely hope that Doctor Cone will come with you and I think it will be a good plan if you and he could come to Montreal and spend a little longer time with us so that we might make more specific arrangements for the coming year.
